Afghanistan

Central and South Asia - Country Snapshot



Afghanistan, officially the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, borders China, Iran, Pakistan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan. It is one of the world's least developed countries. Agricultural production is the backbone of Afghanistan's economy. The country's capital and largest city is Kabul. The official languages are Afghan Persian, Dari, and Pashto.

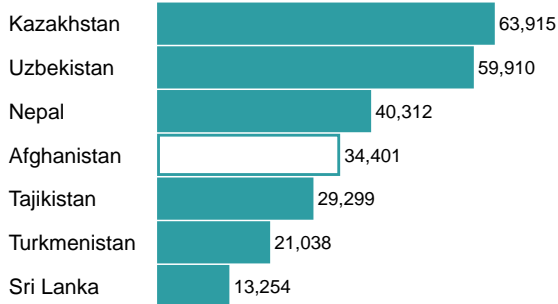

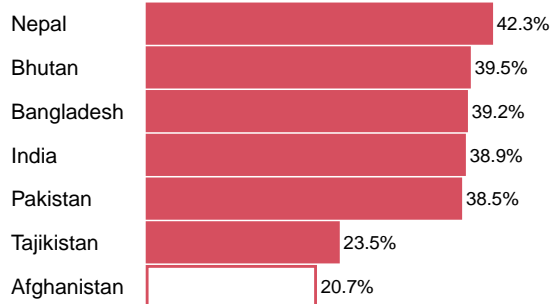

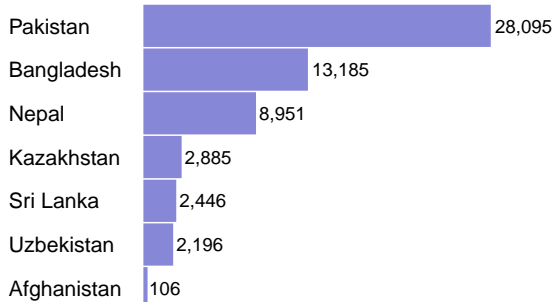
Total GME Degrees



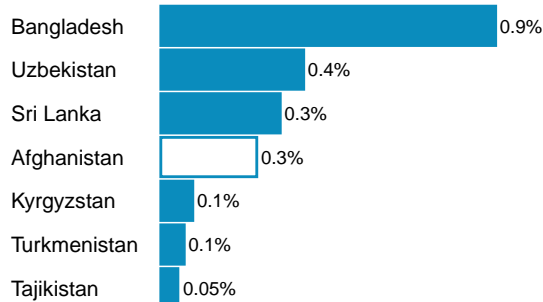
GME Degrees By Females

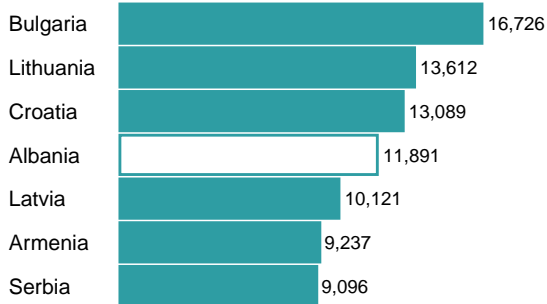

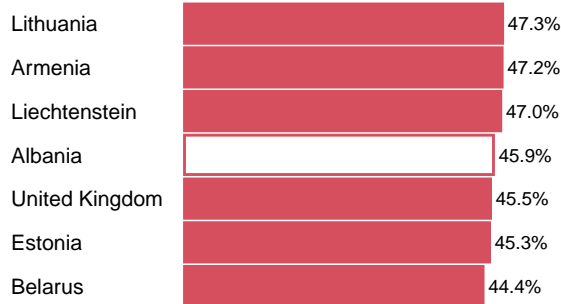

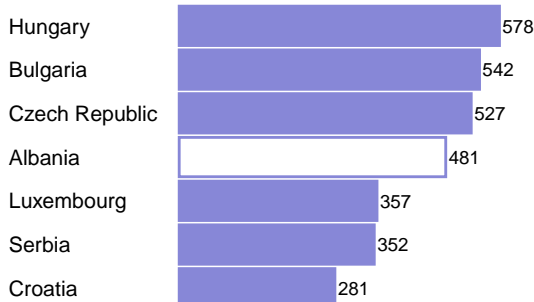
Total GME Degrees



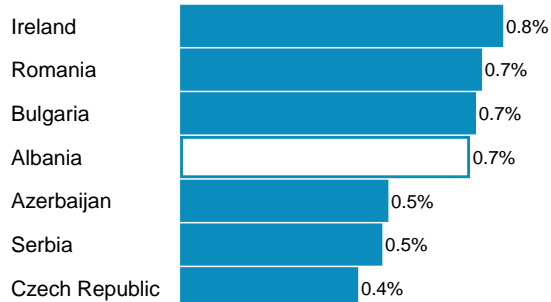
GME Degrees By Females

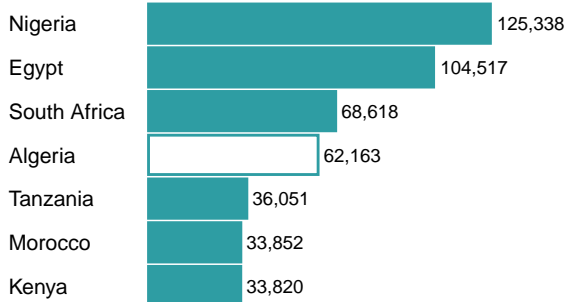

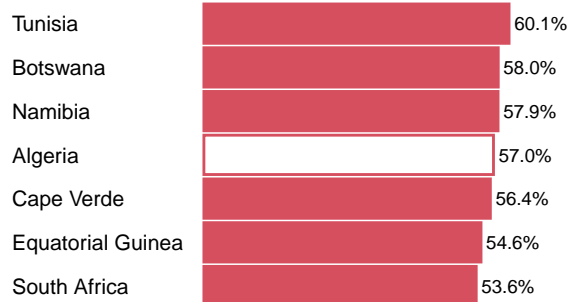

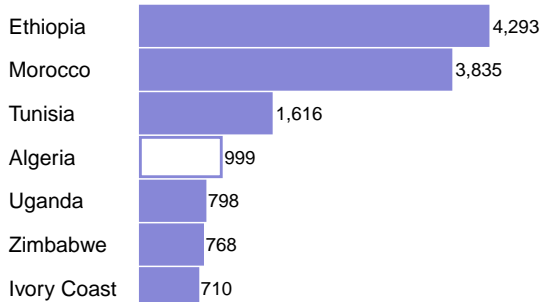
Total GME Degrees



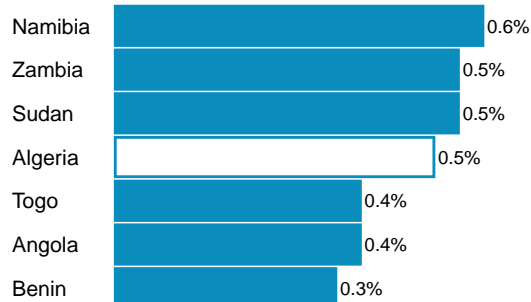
GME Degrees By Females

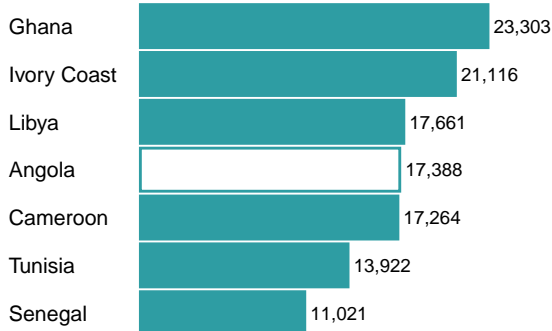

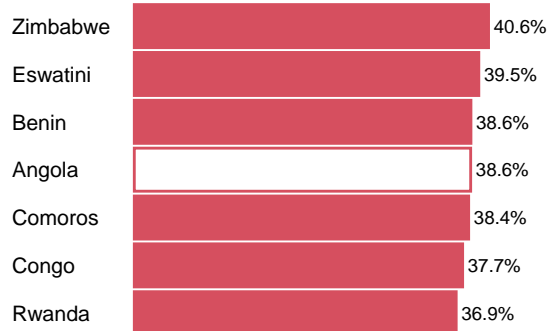

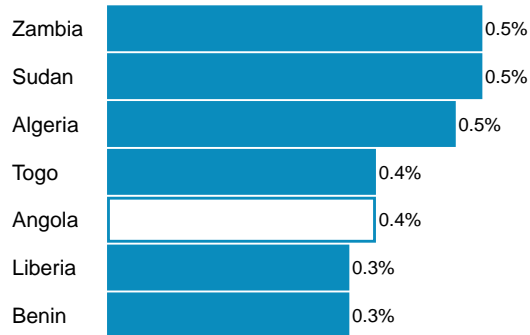
Total GME Degrees

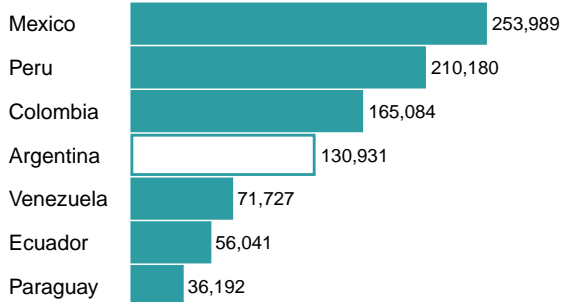

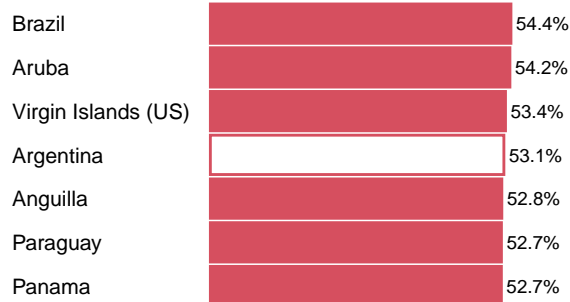

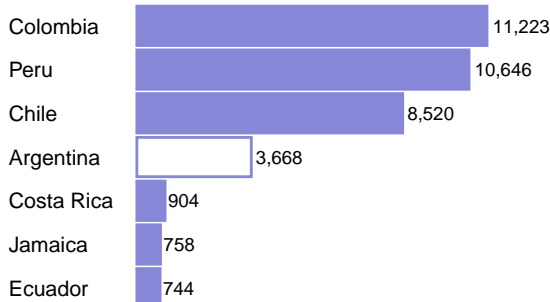
Total GME Degrees



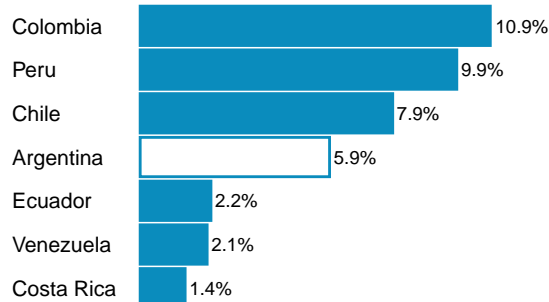
GME Degrees By Females

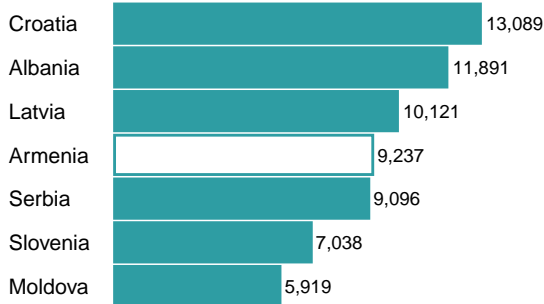

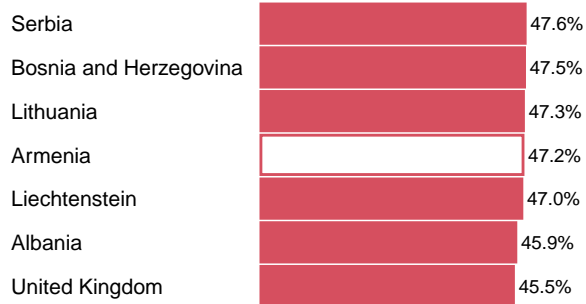

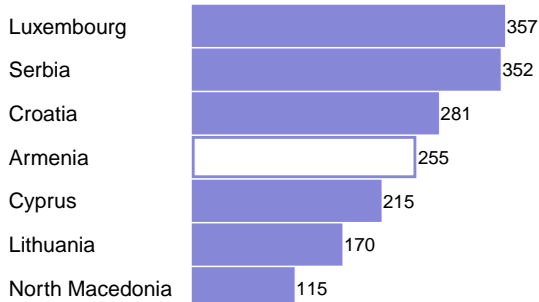

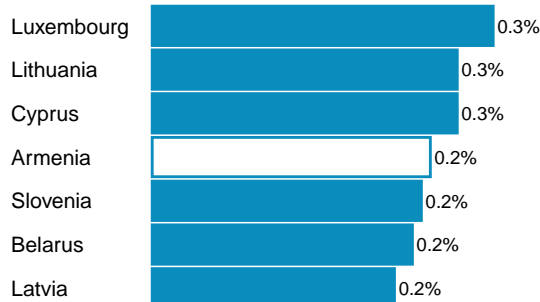
GME Degrees By Females

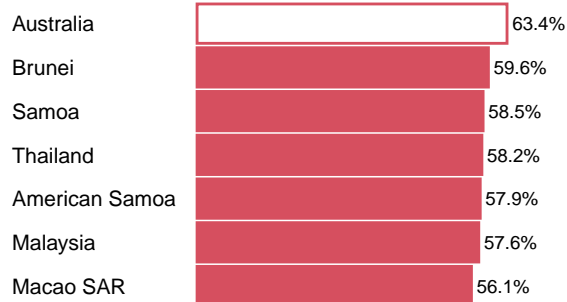

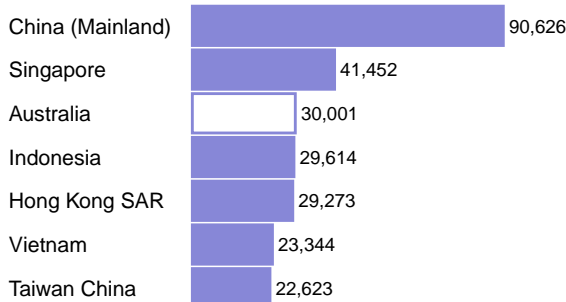

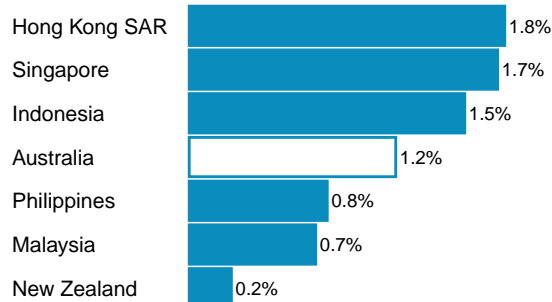
GME Degrees By Females

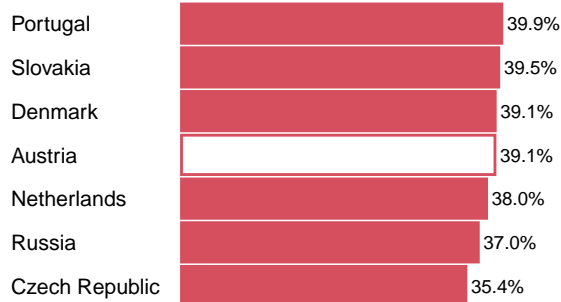

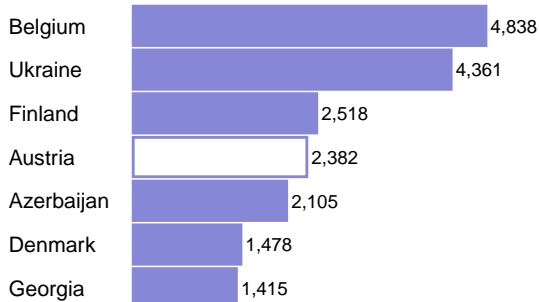

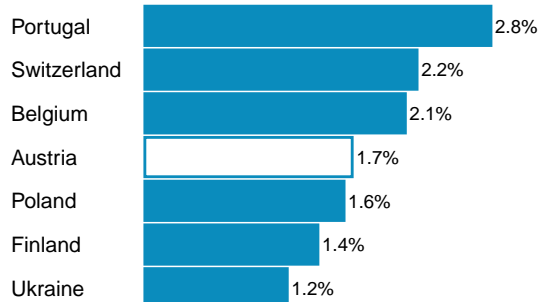

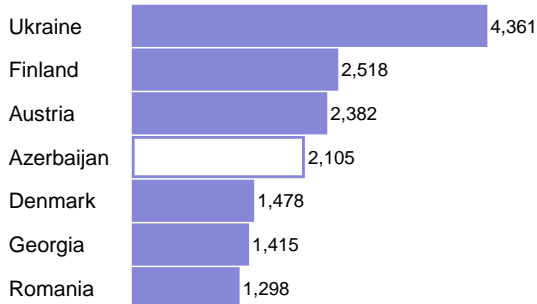

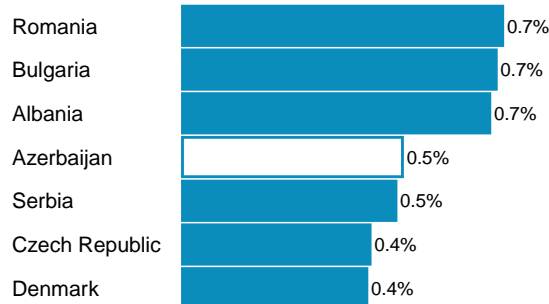

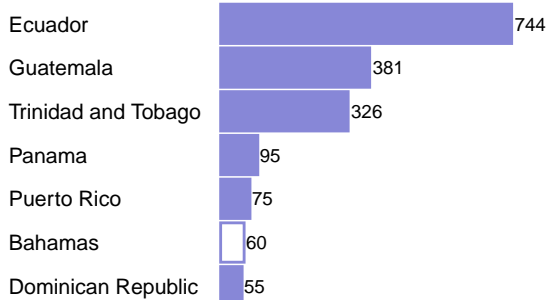

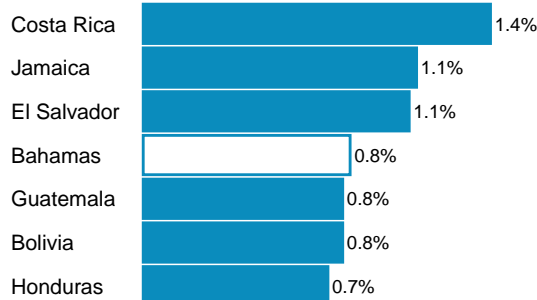

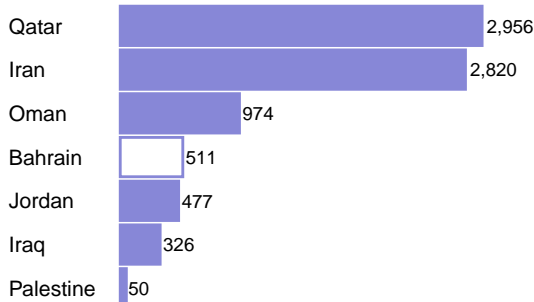

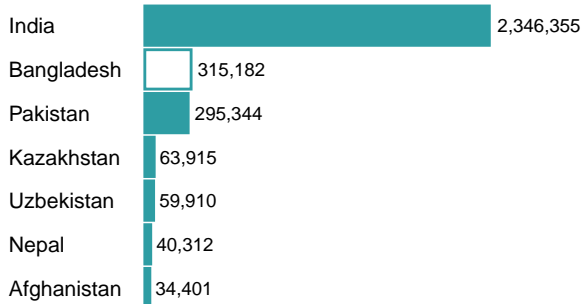

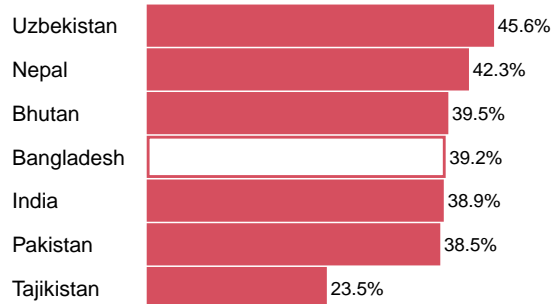

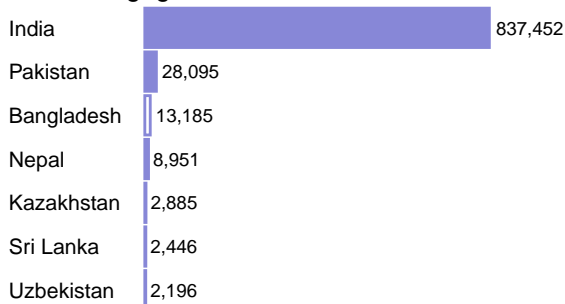

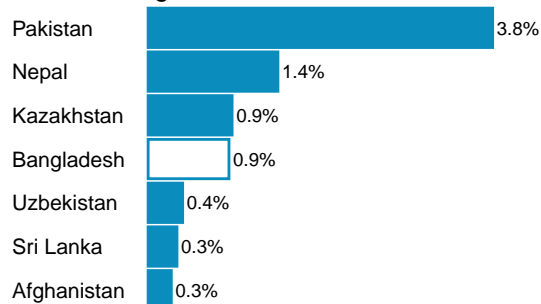
GME Degrees By Females

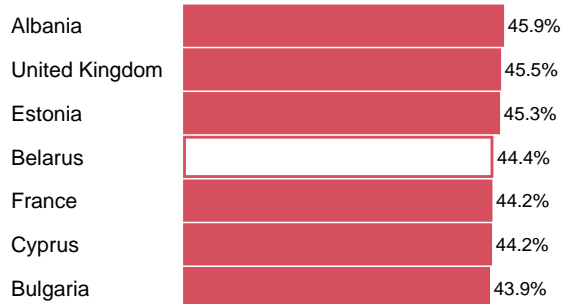

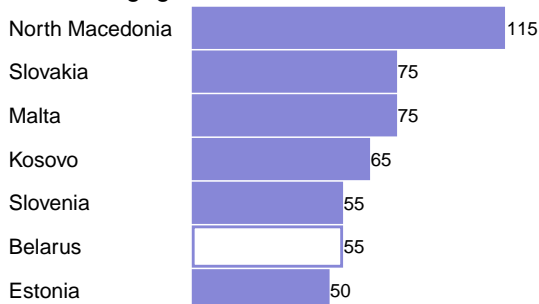

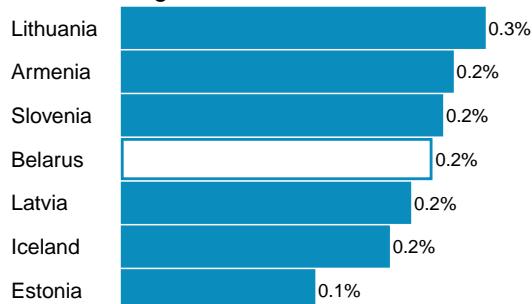
GME Degrees By Females

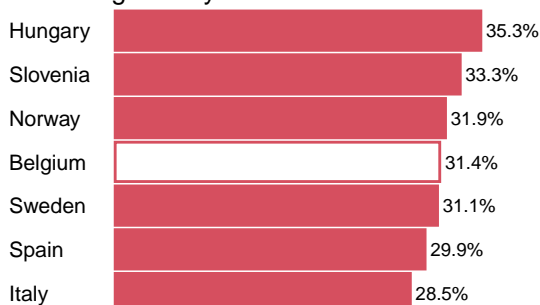

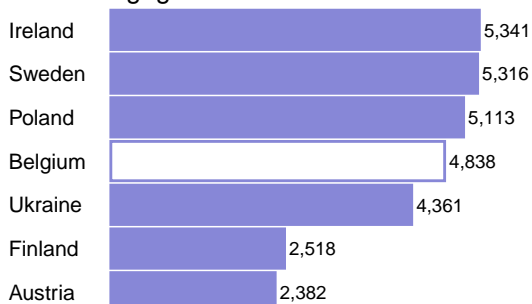

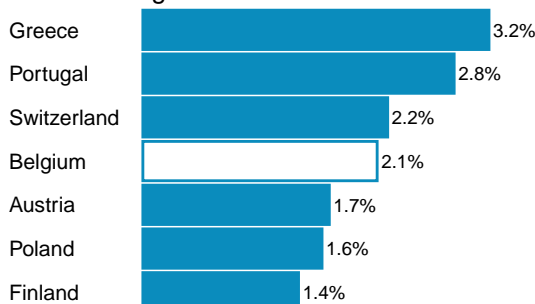
GME Degrees By Females

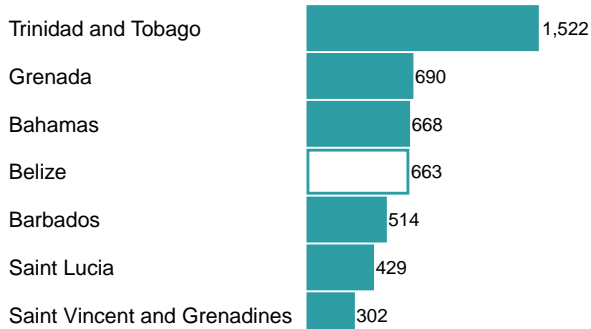

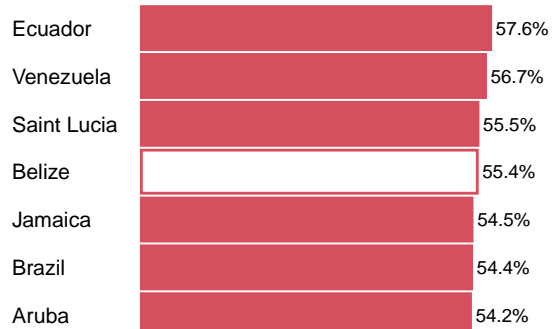

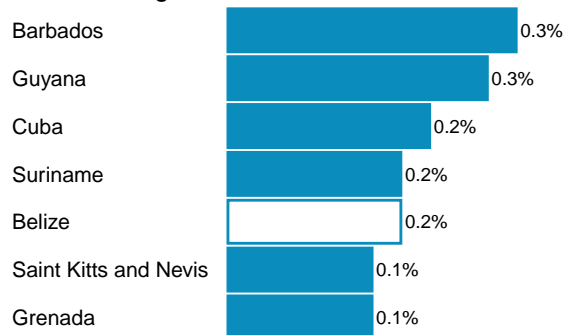

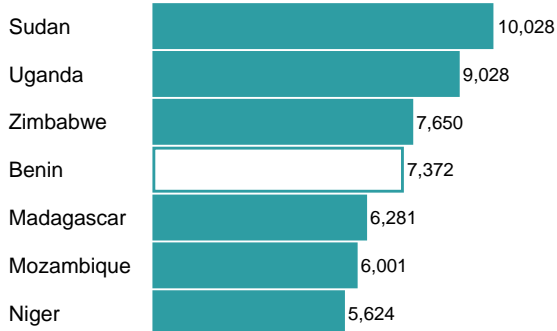

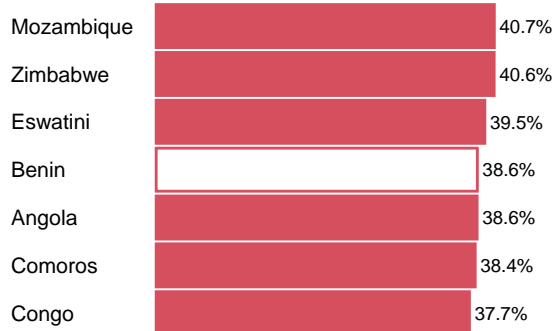

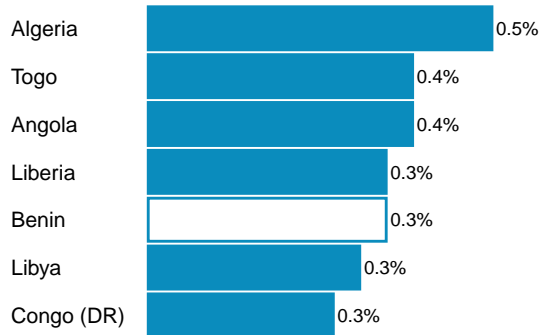

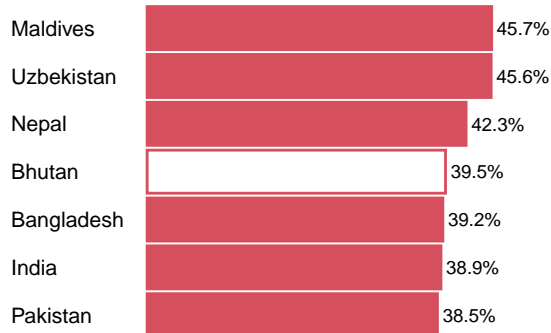

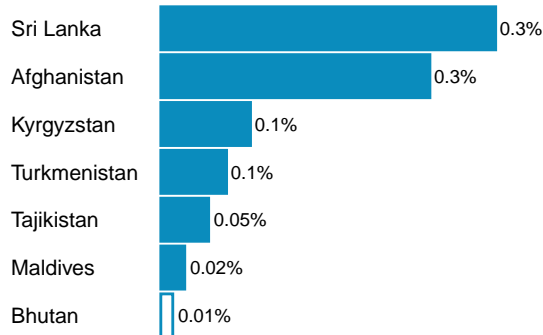

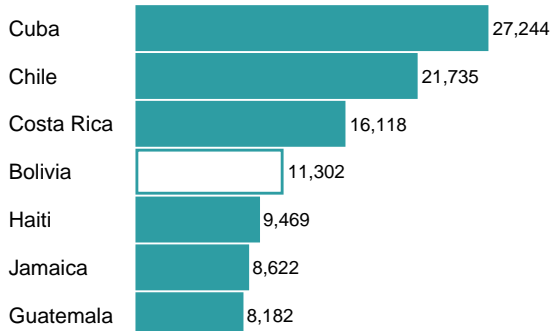

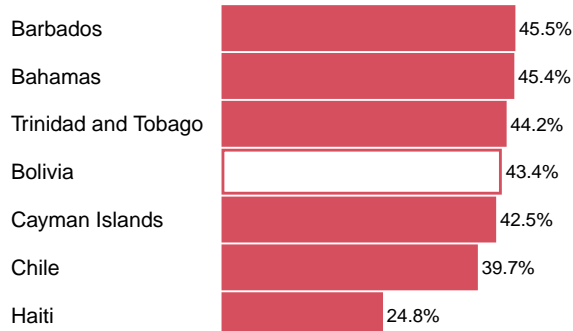

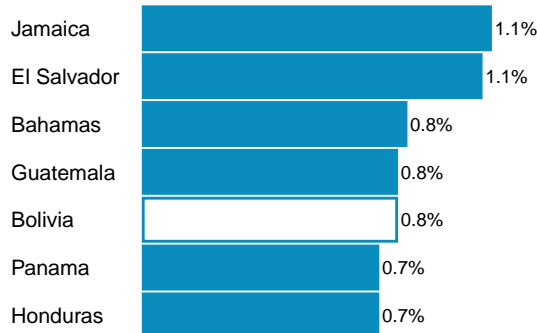

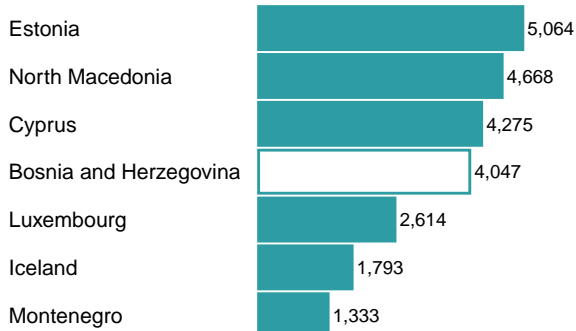

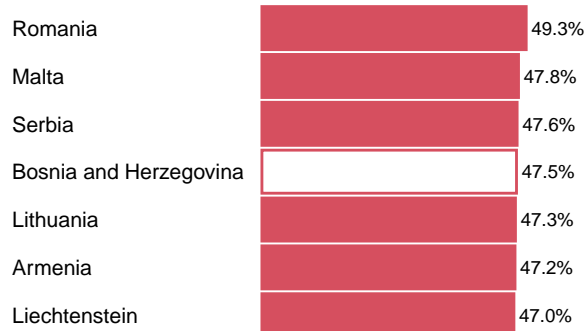

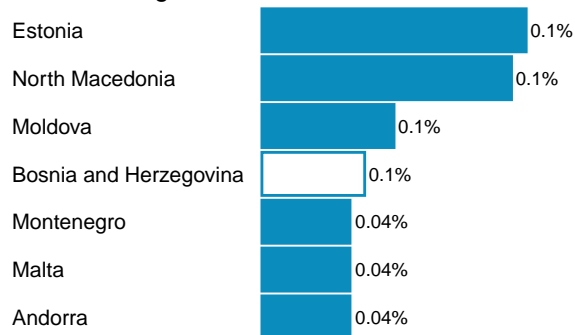

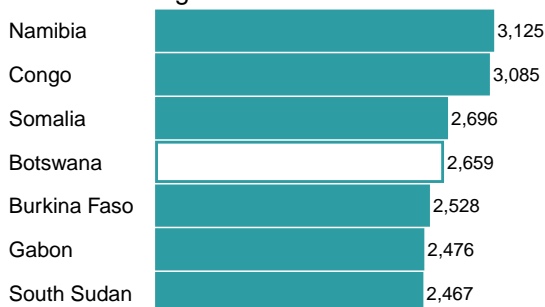

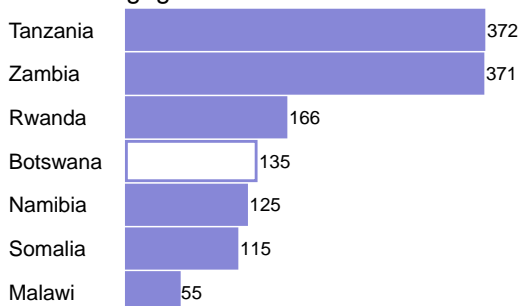

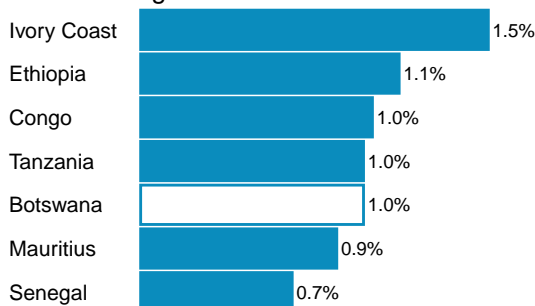
GME Degrees By Females

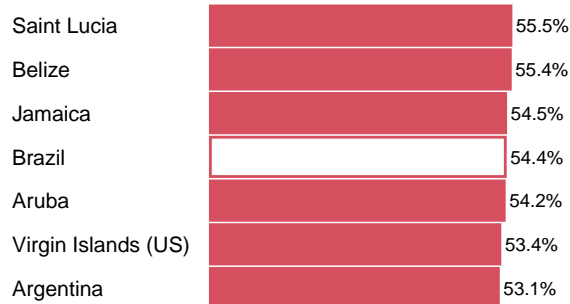

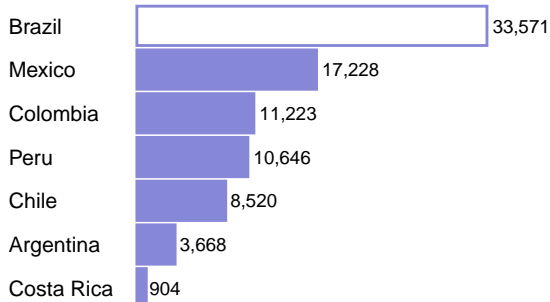

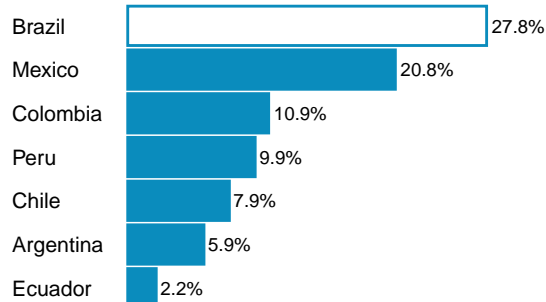

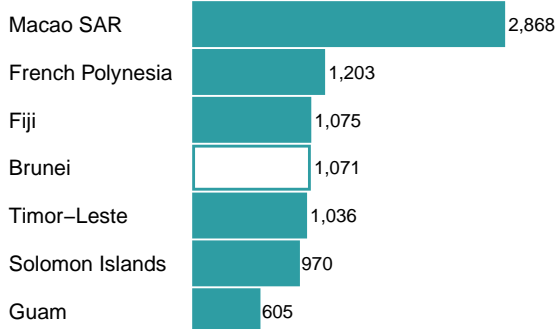

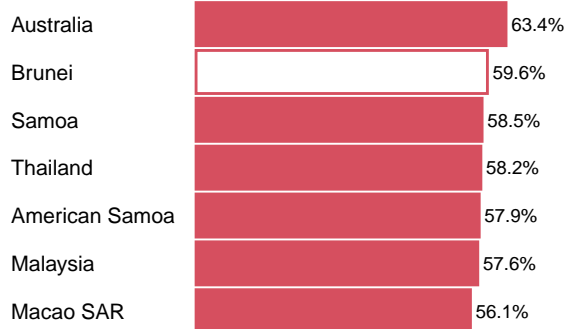

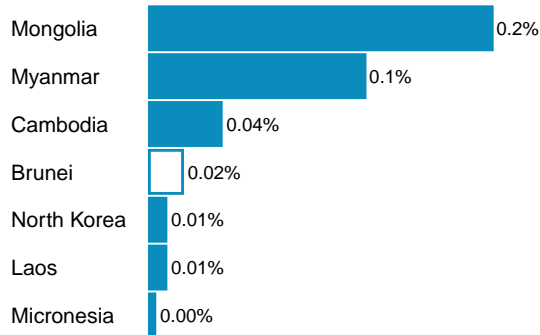

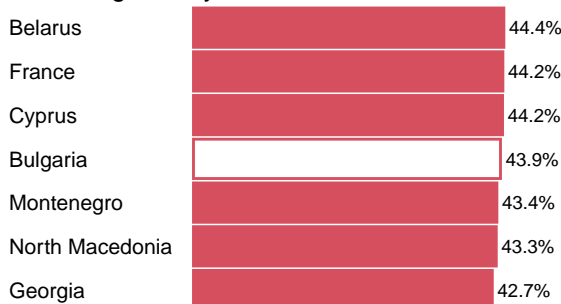

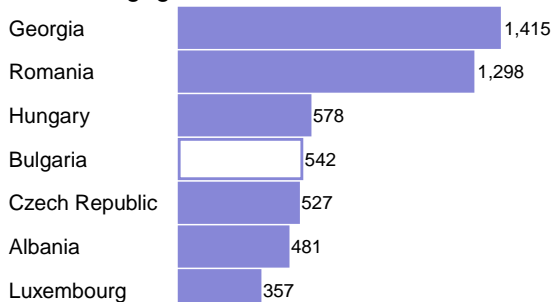

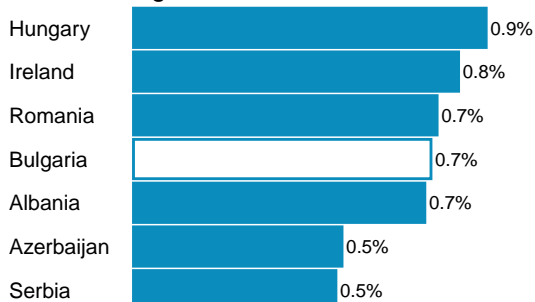

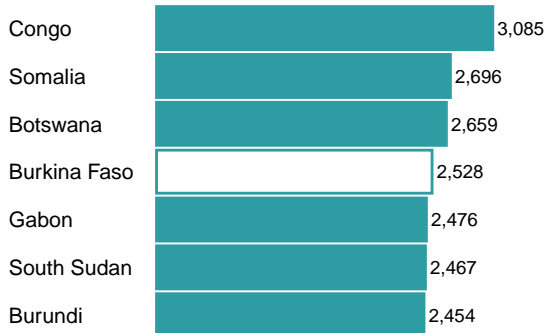

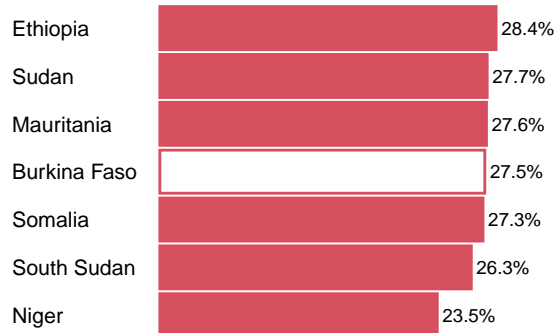

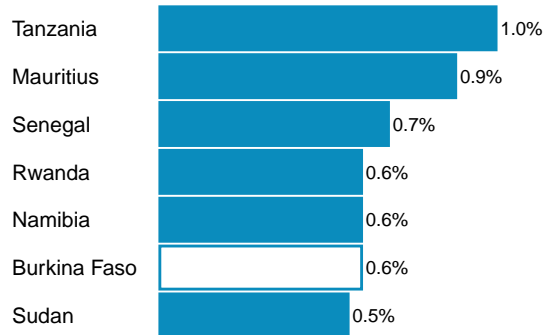

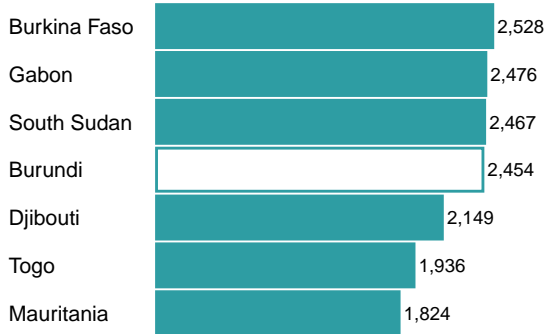

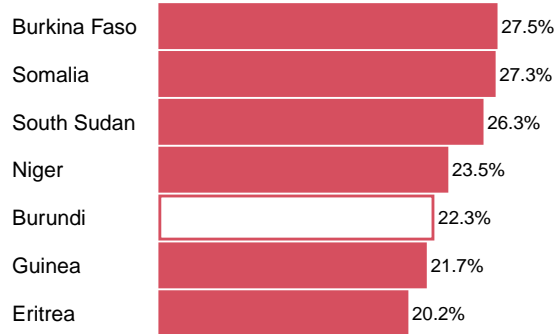

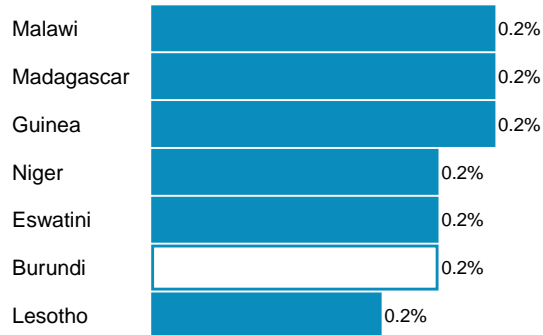

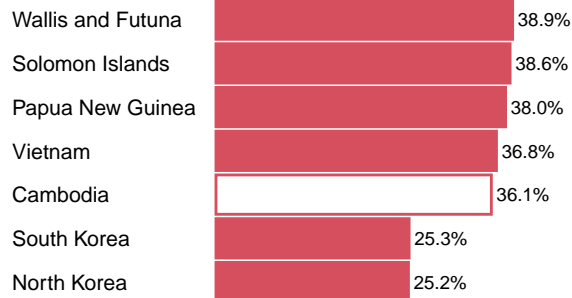

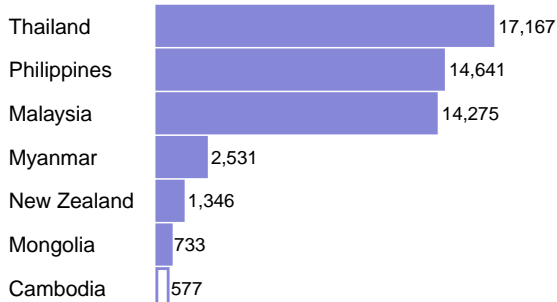

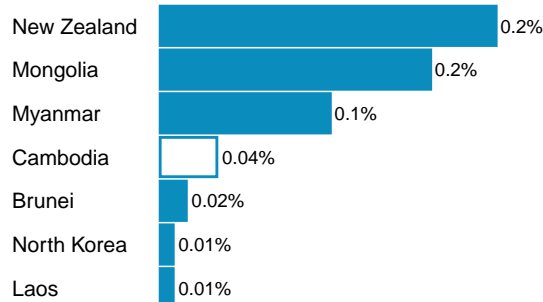

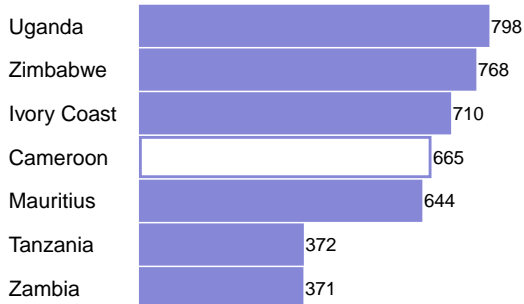

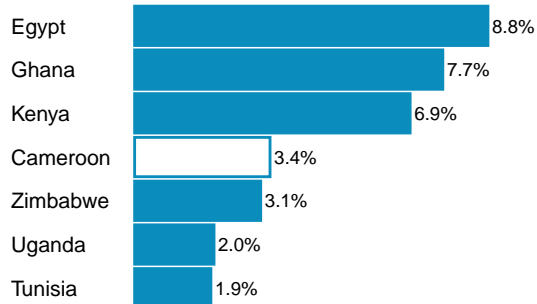

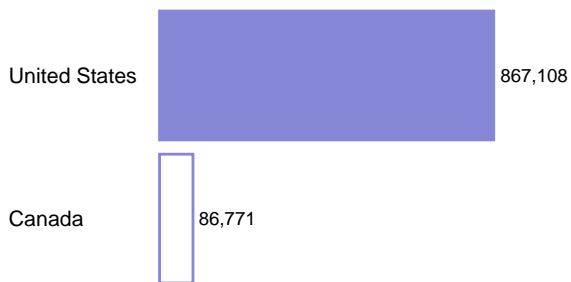

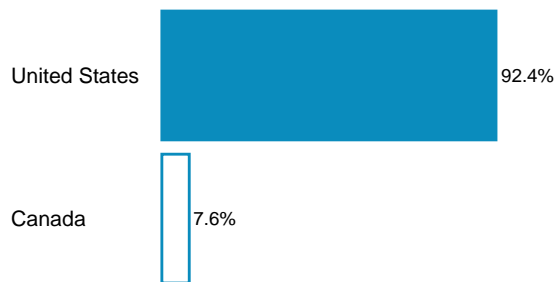

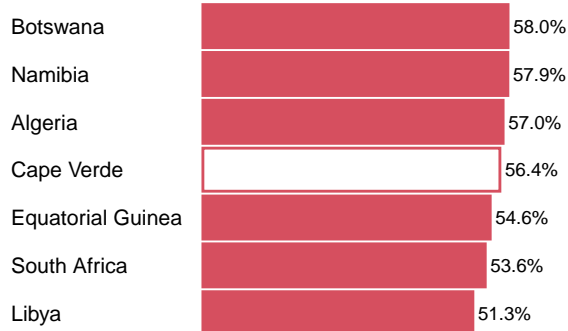

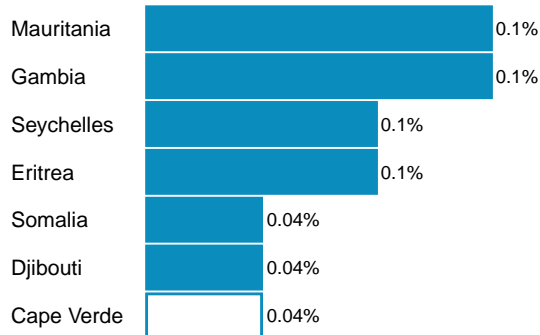

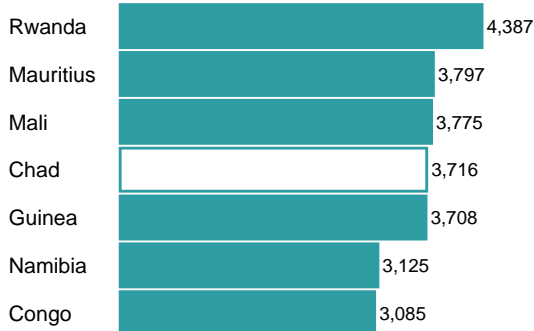

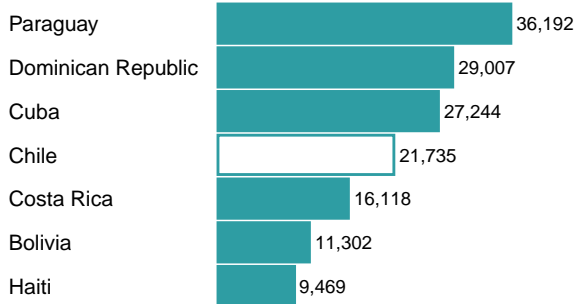

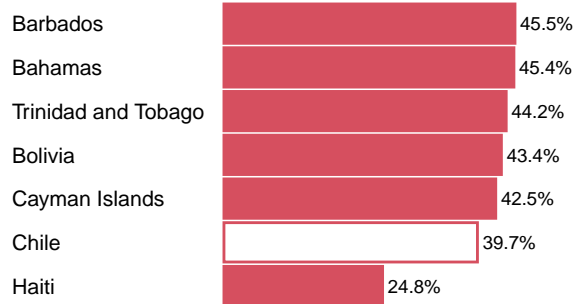

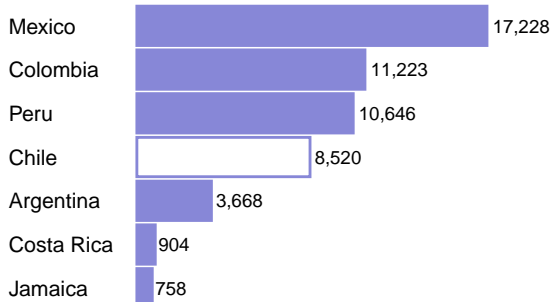

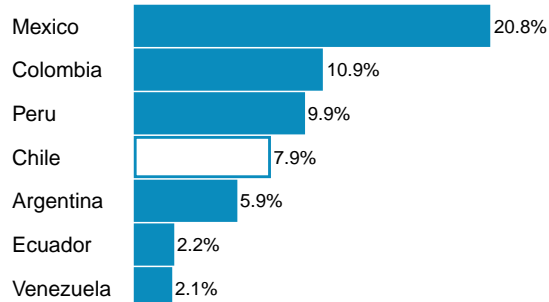
GME Degrees By Females

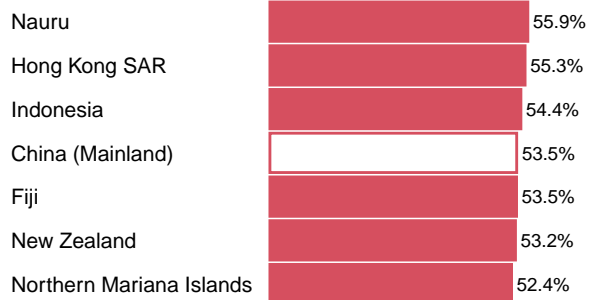

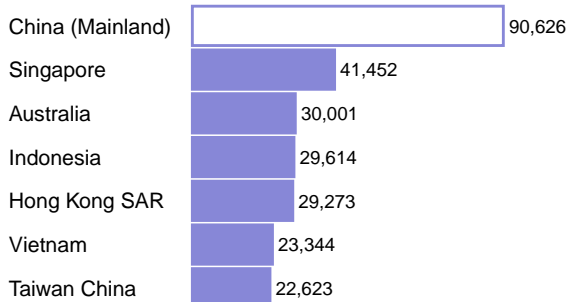

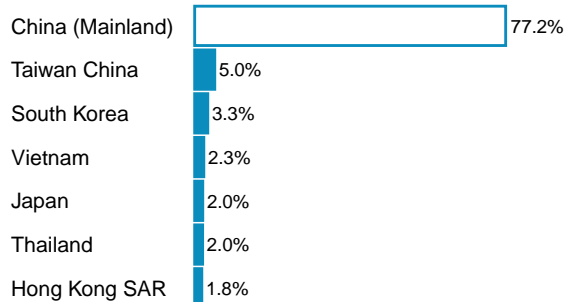

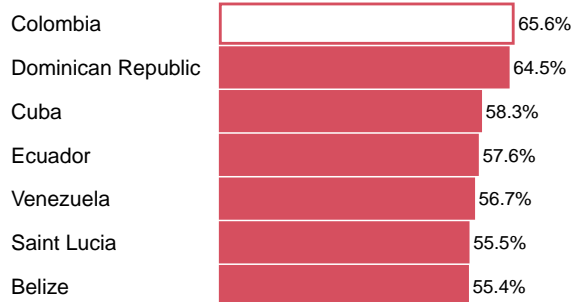

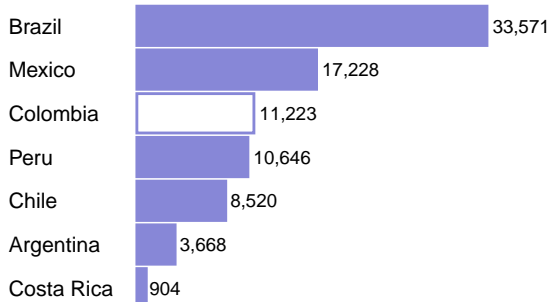

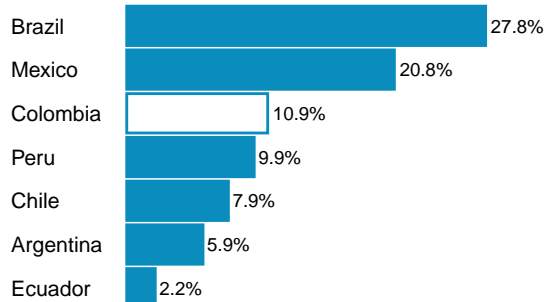

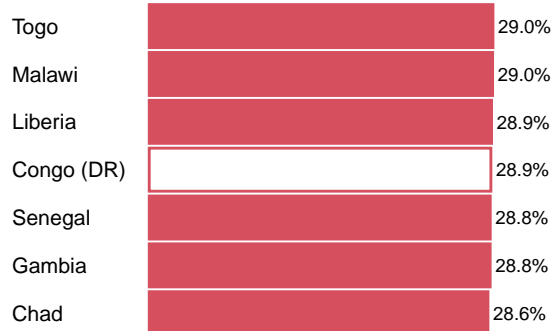

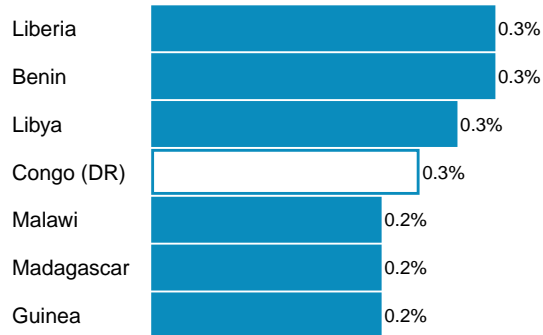

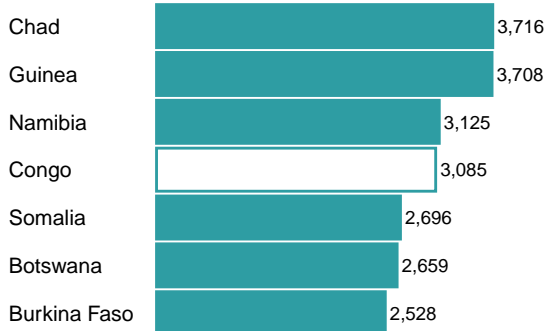

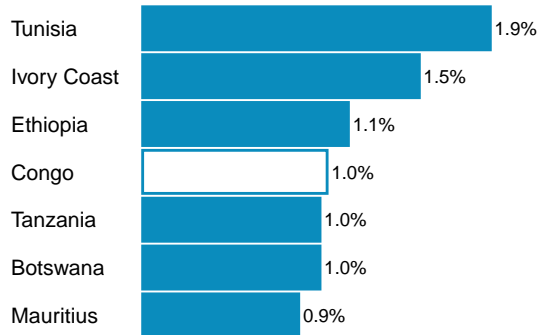

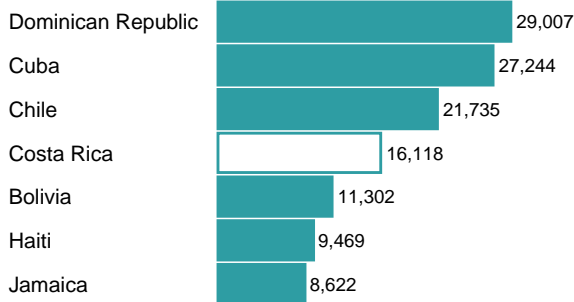

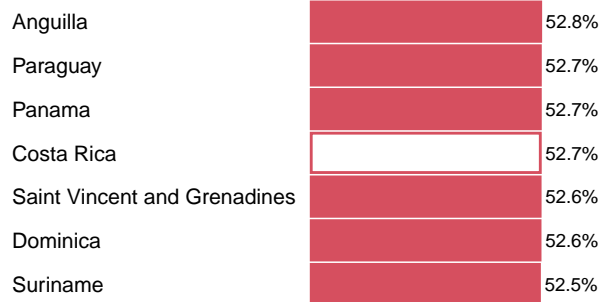

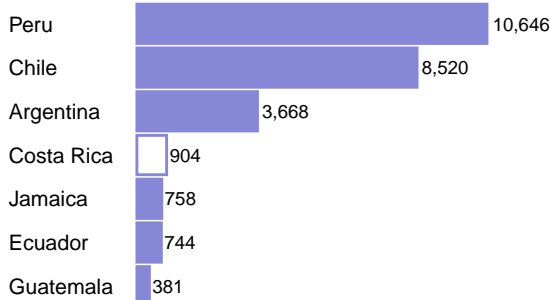

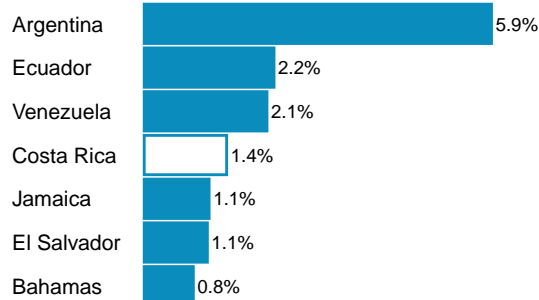
GME Degrees By Females

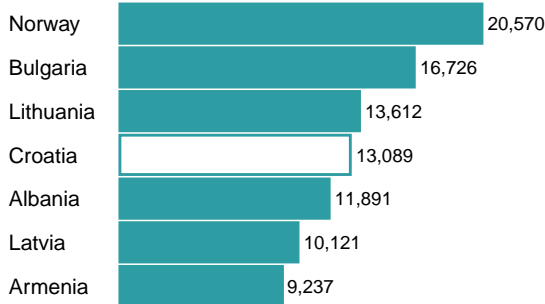

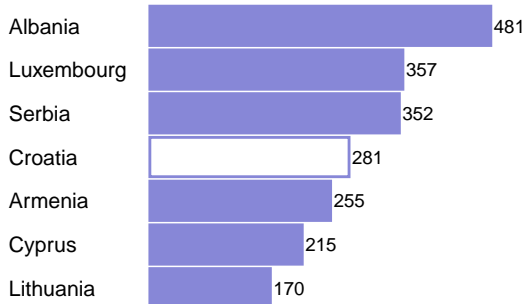

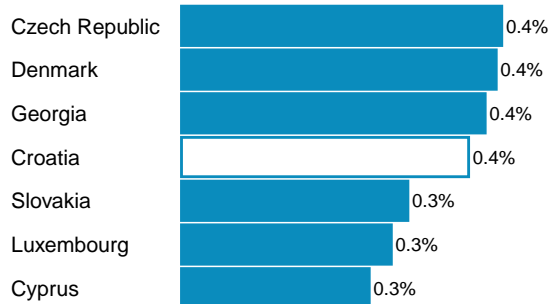

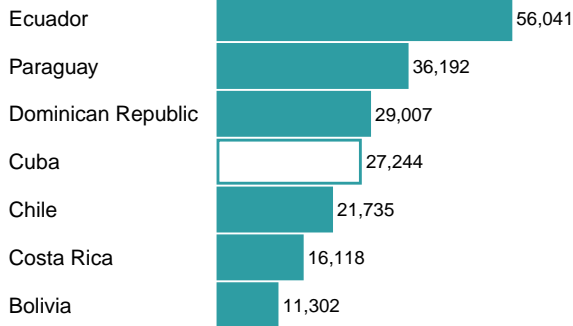

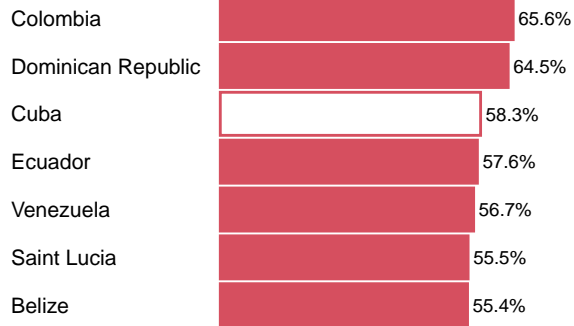

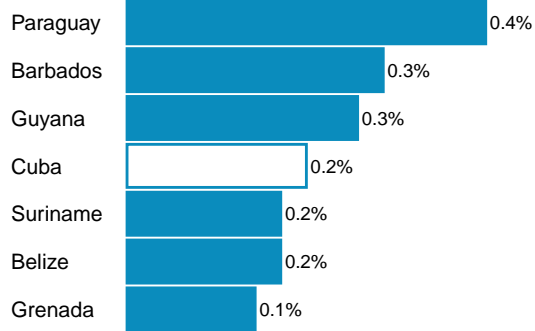

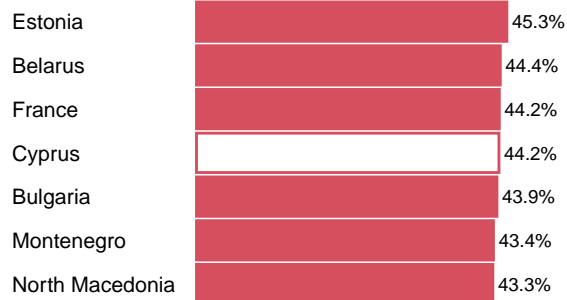

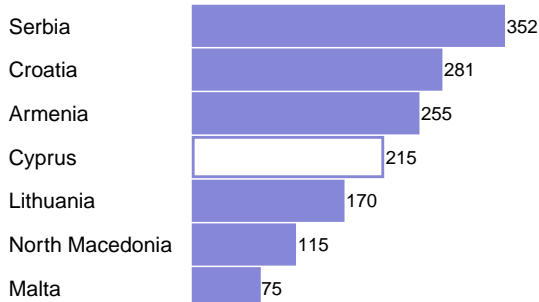

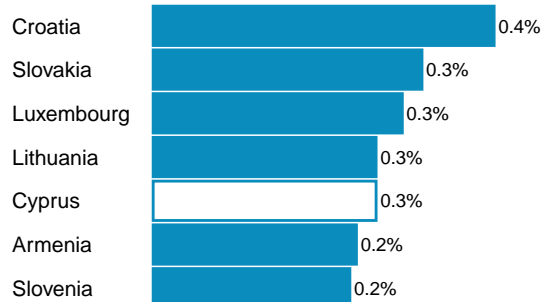

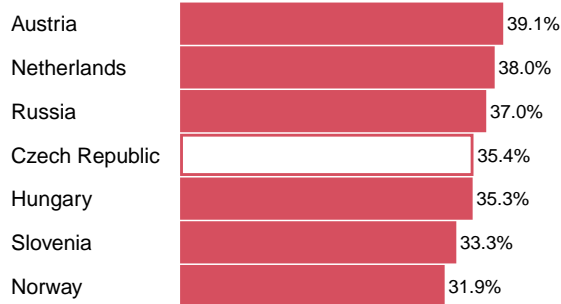

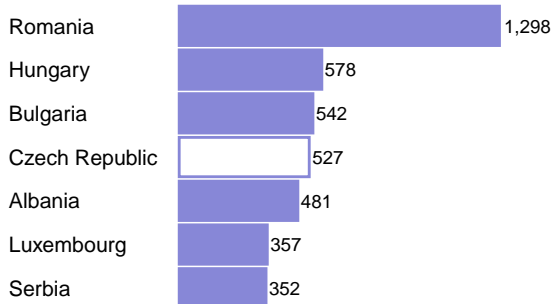

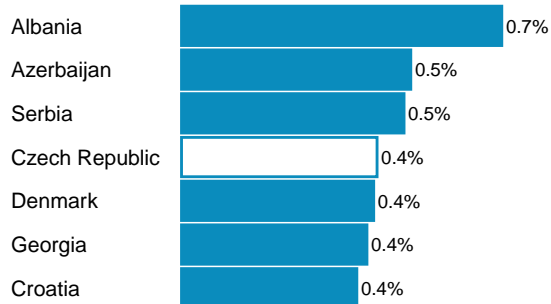

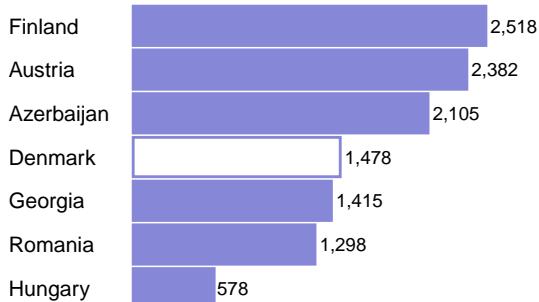

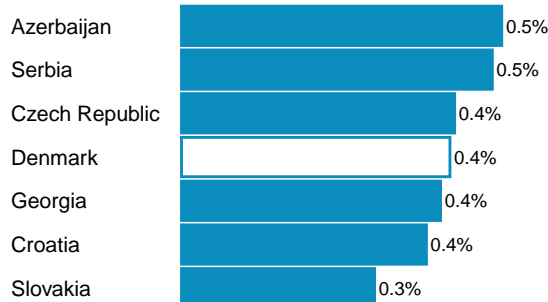

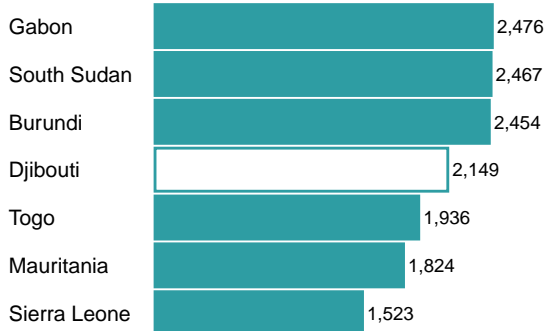

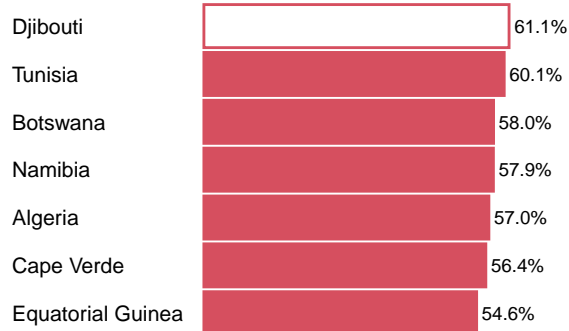

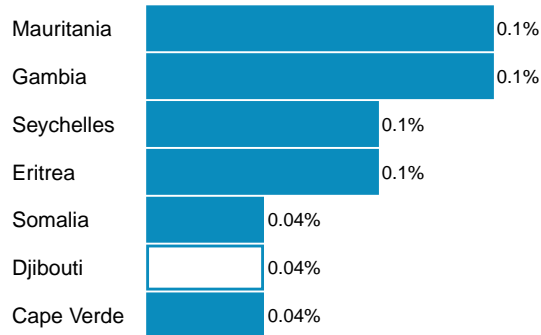

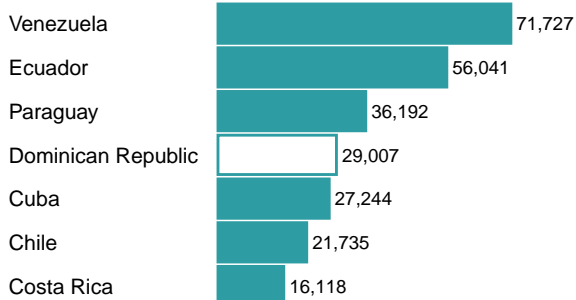

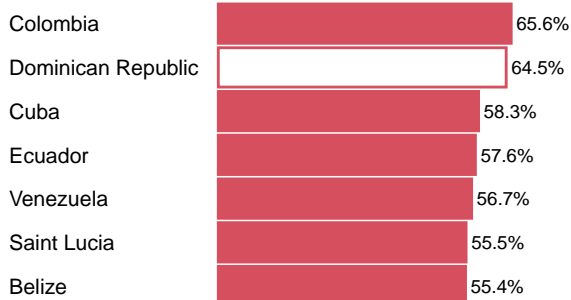

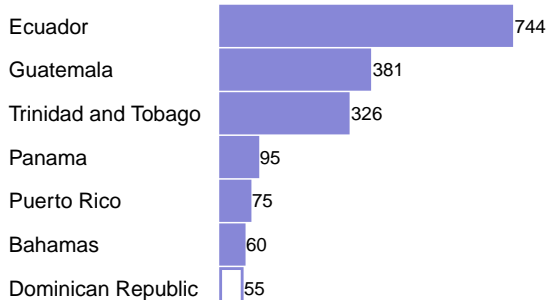

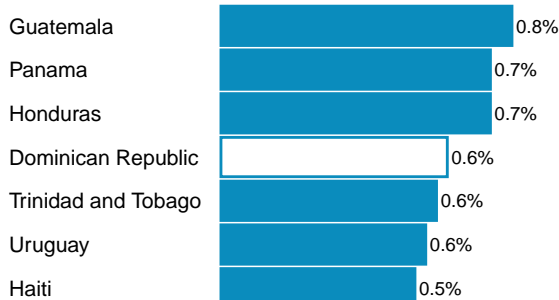
GME Degrees By Females

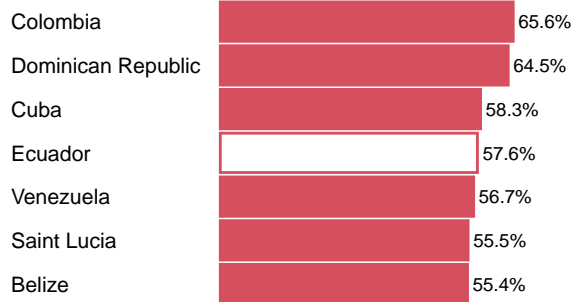

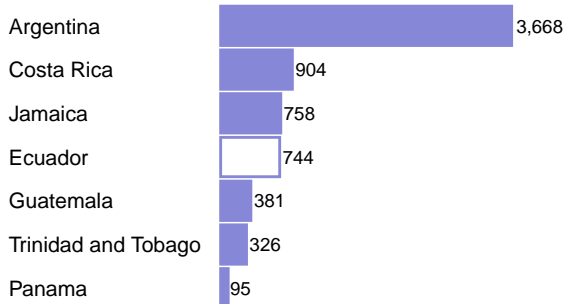

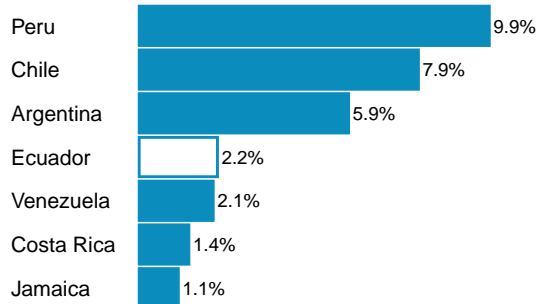
GME Degrees By Females

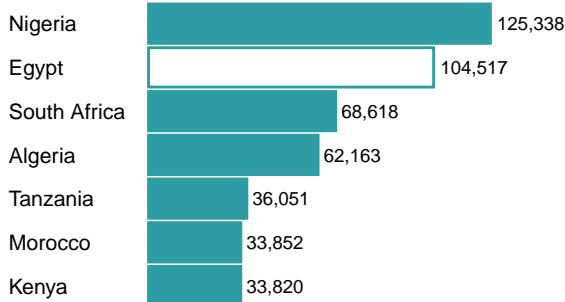

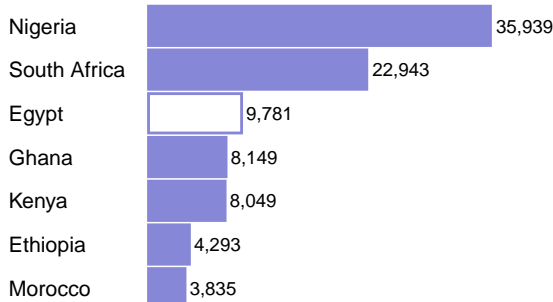

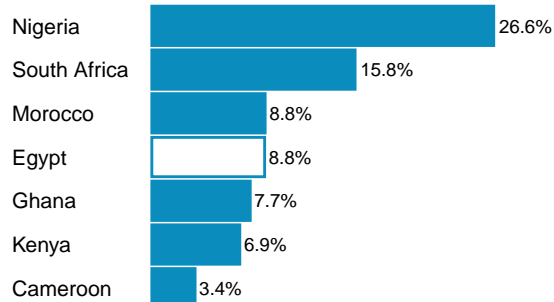

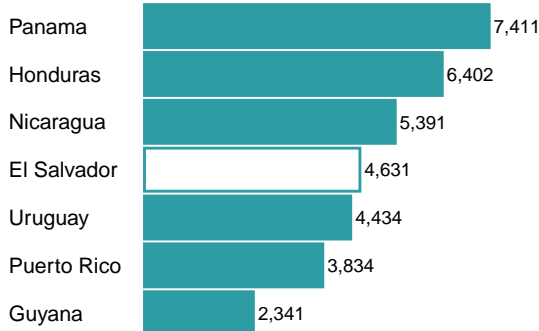

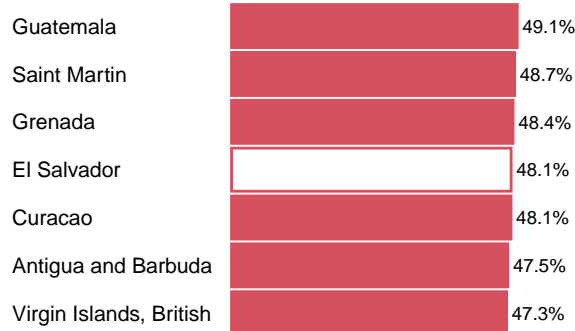

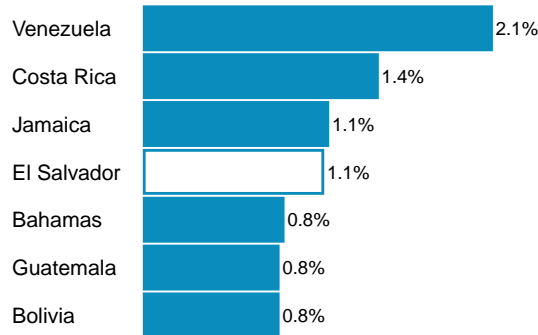

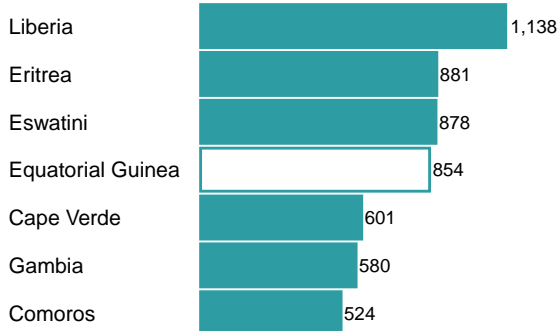

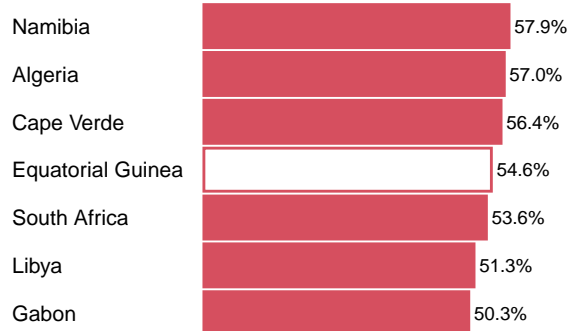

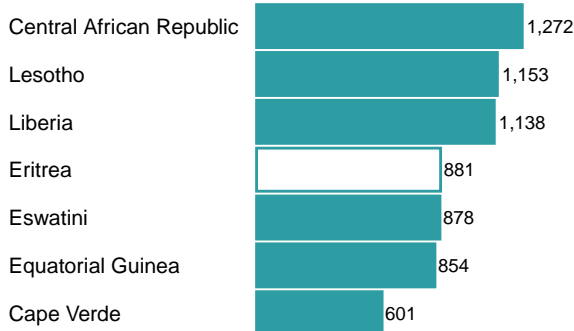

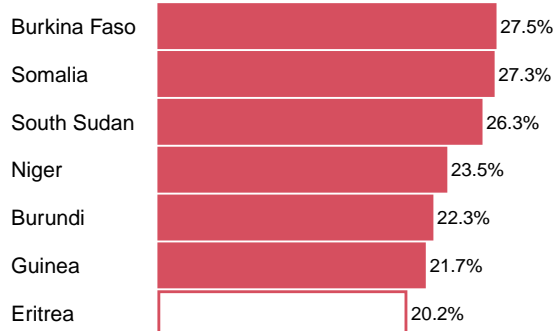

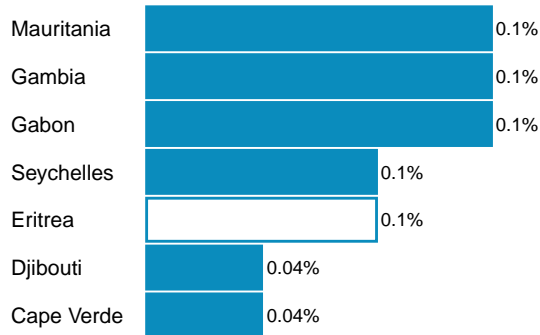

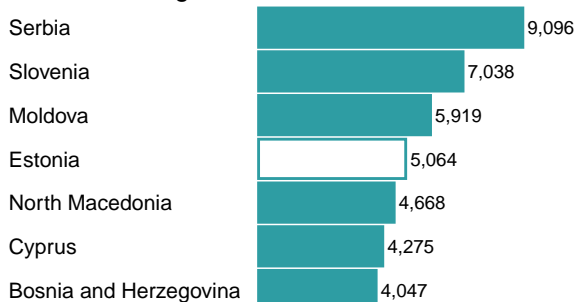

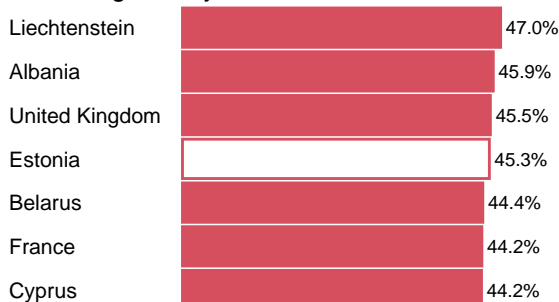

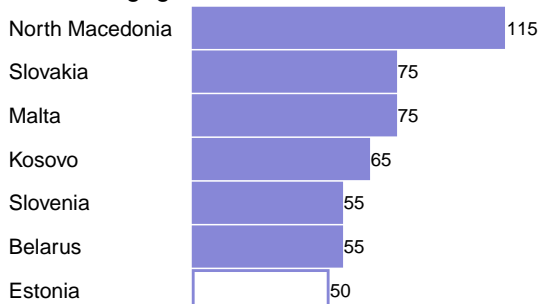

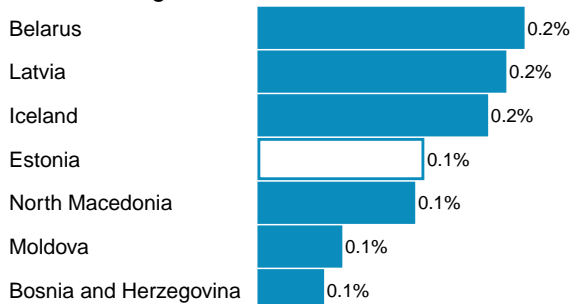
GME Degrees By Females

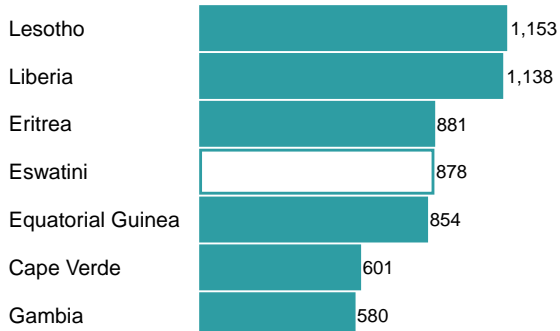

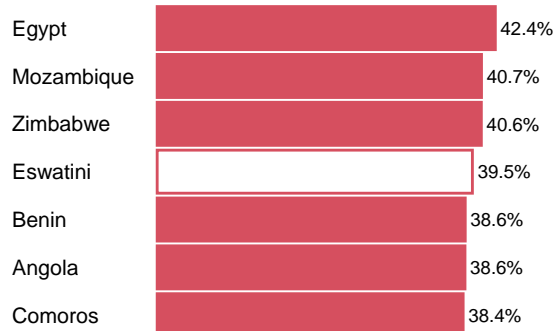

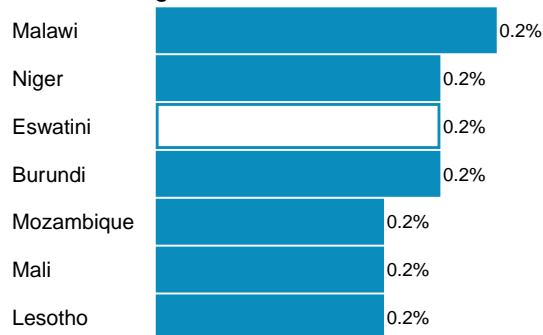

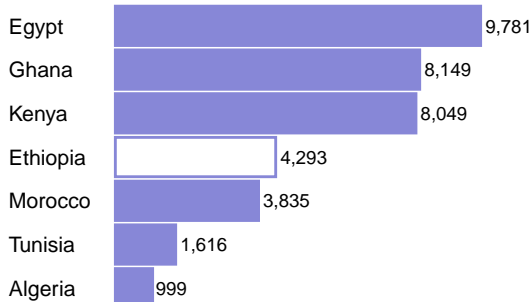

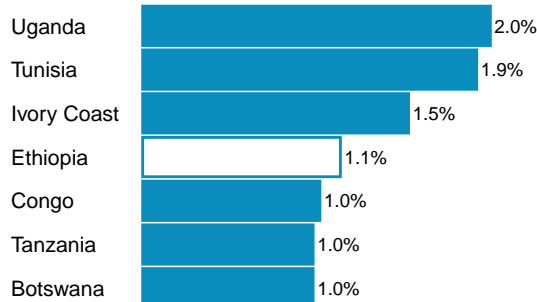

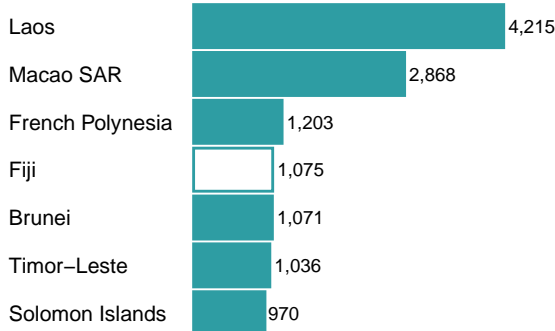

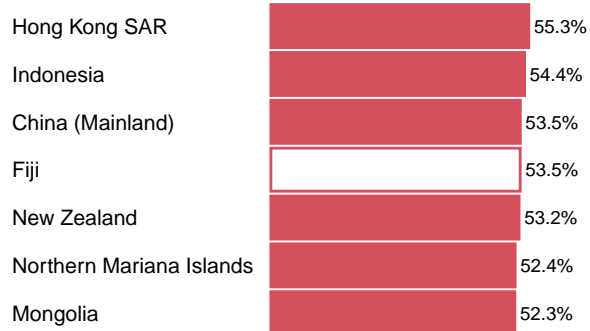

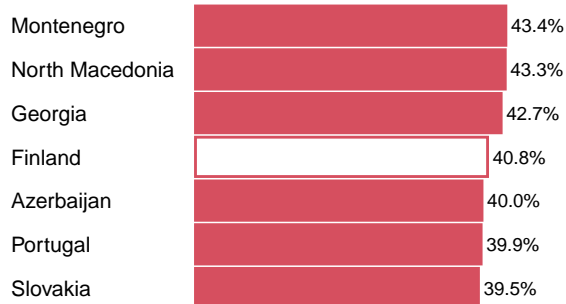

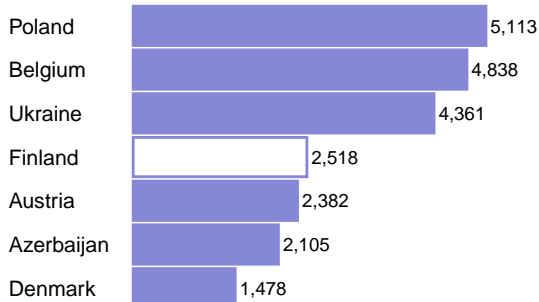

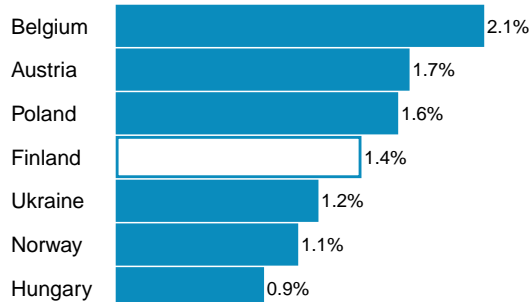

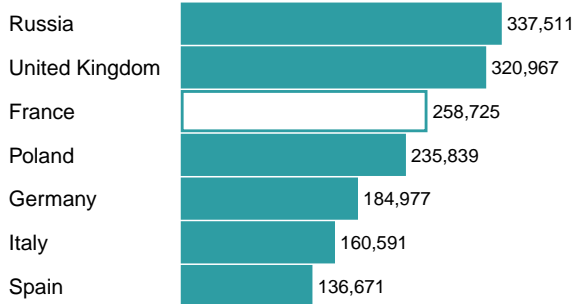

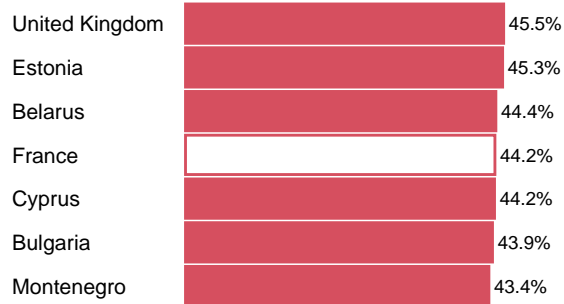

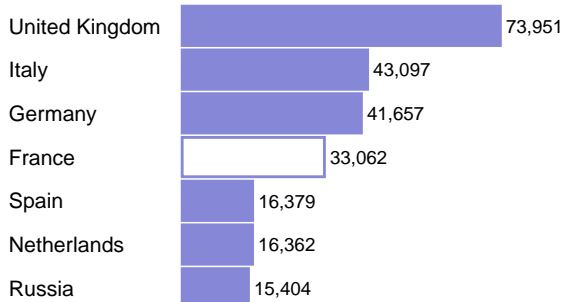

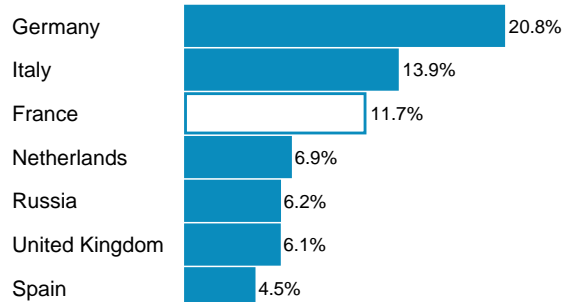
GME Degrees By Females

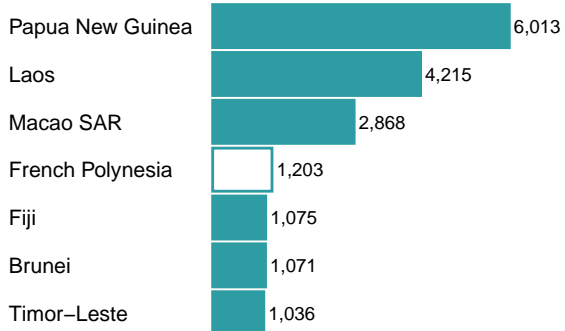

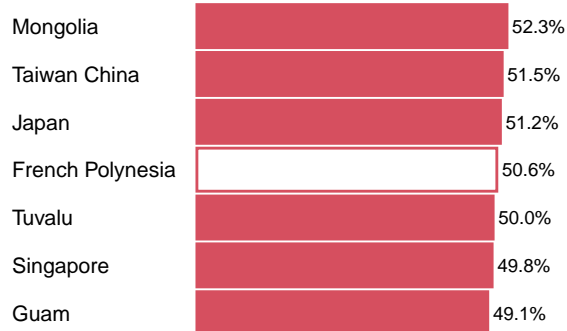

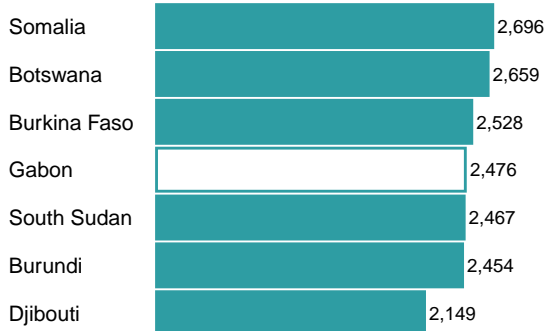

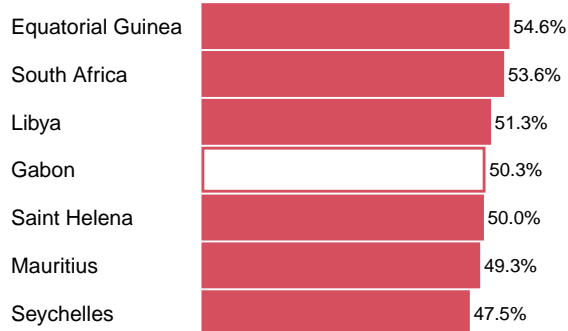

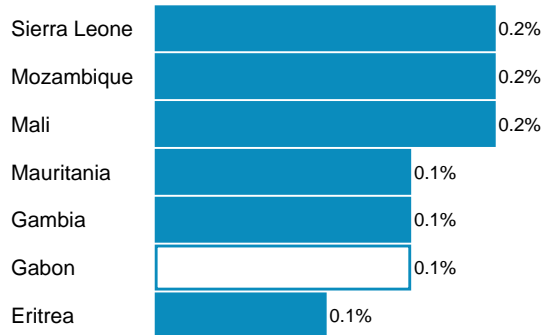

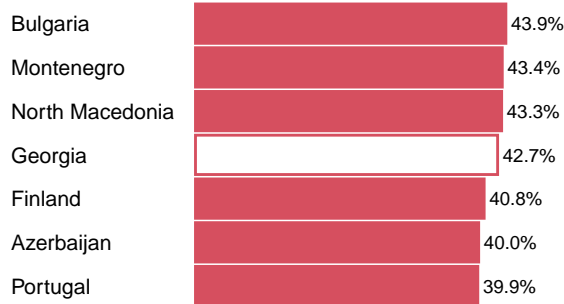

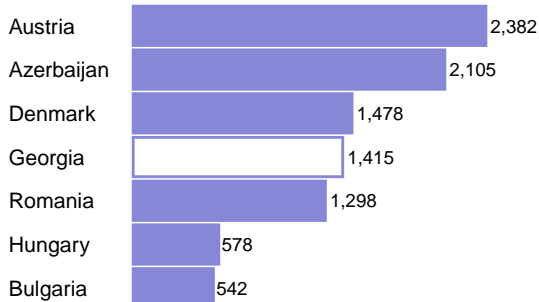

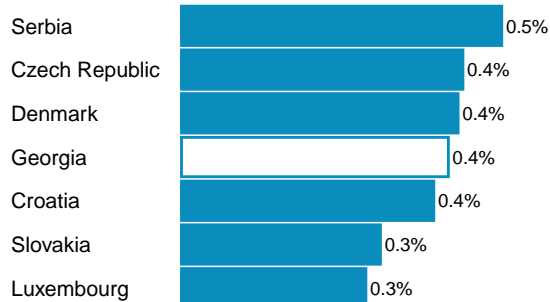

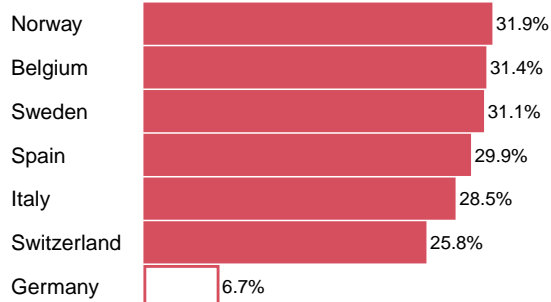

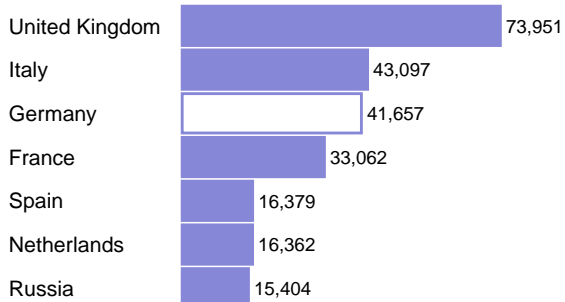

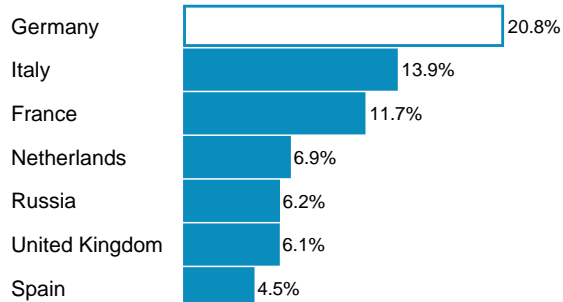

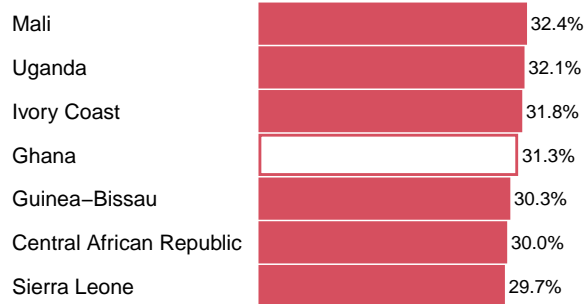

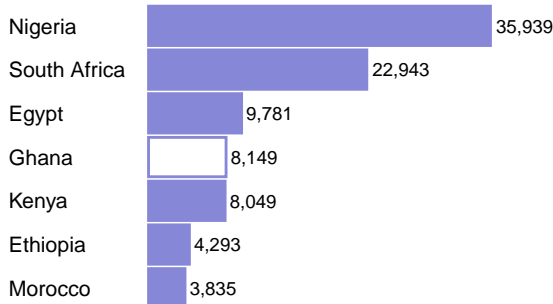

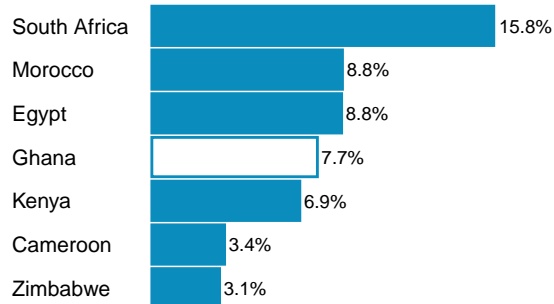

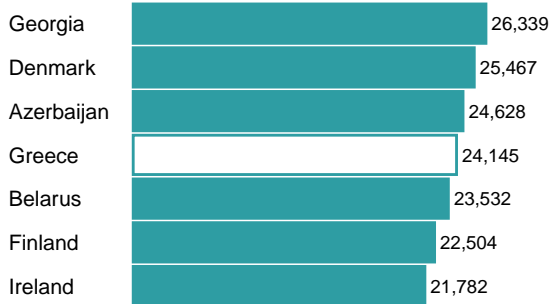

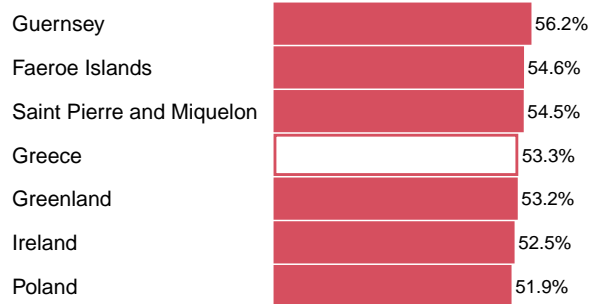

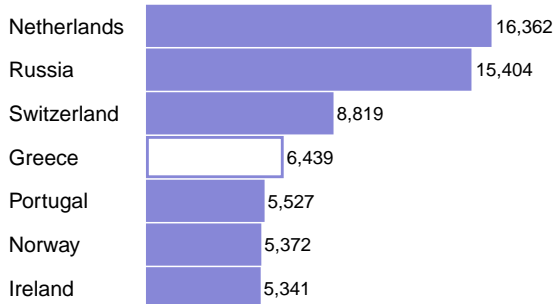
Total GME Degrees



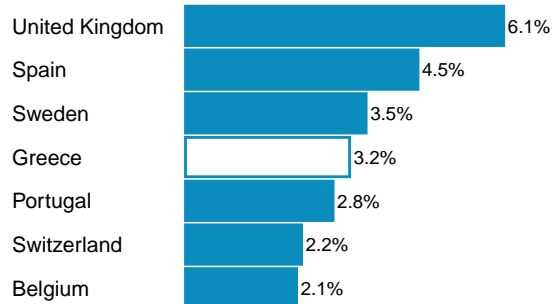
GME Degrees By Females

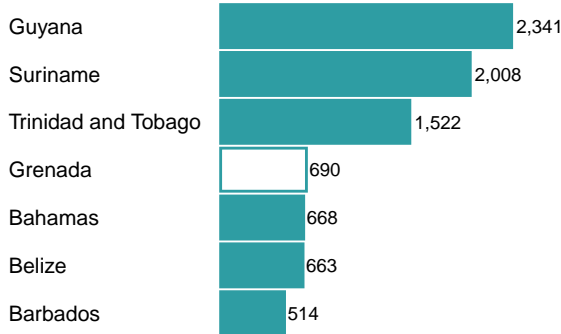

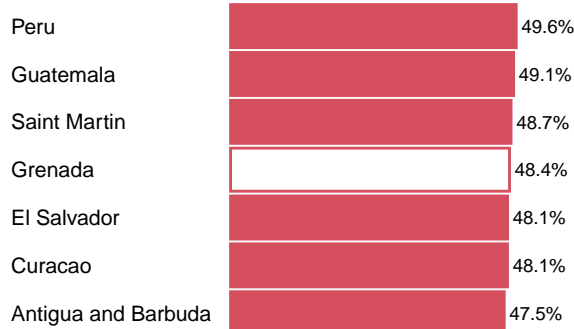

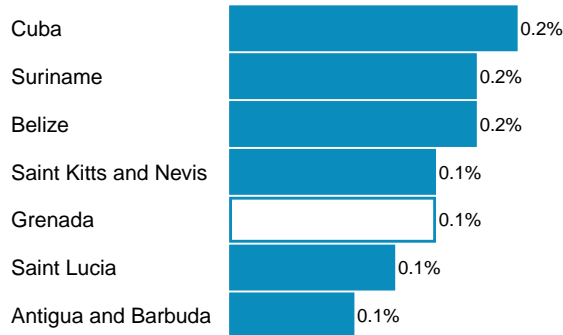

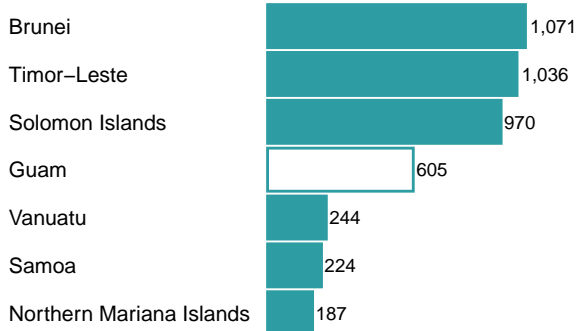

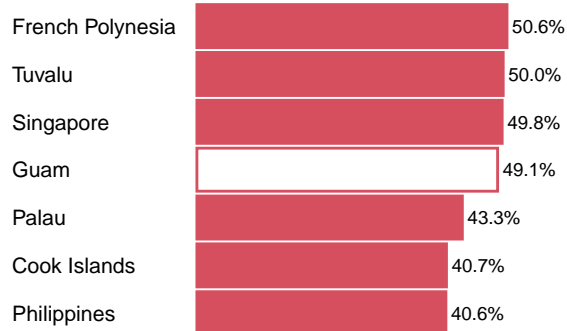

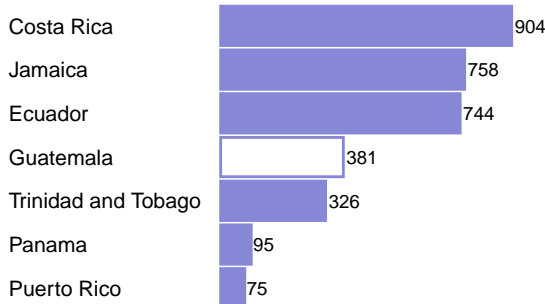

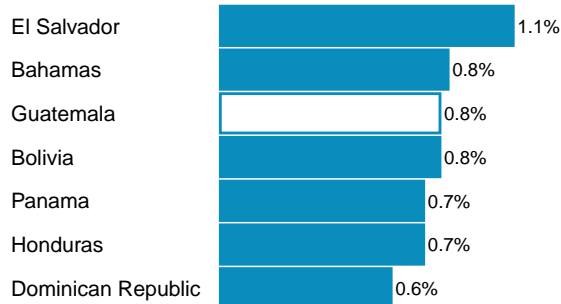

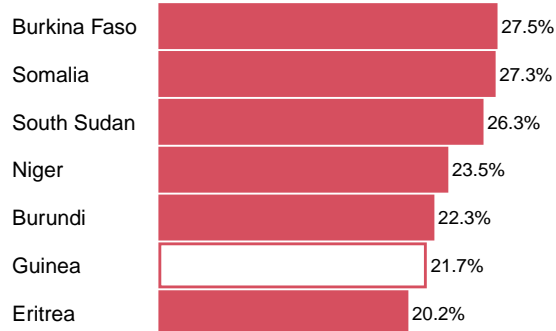

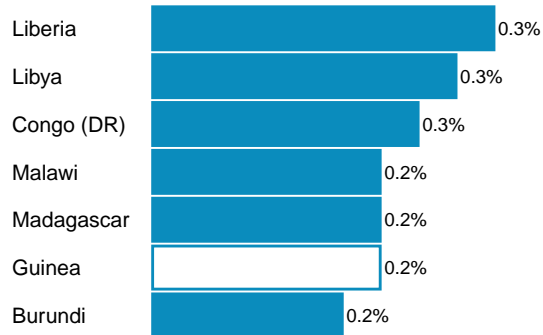

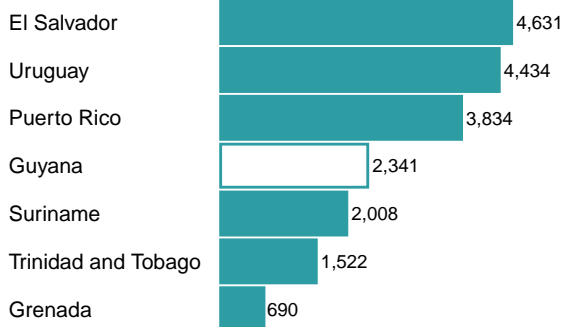

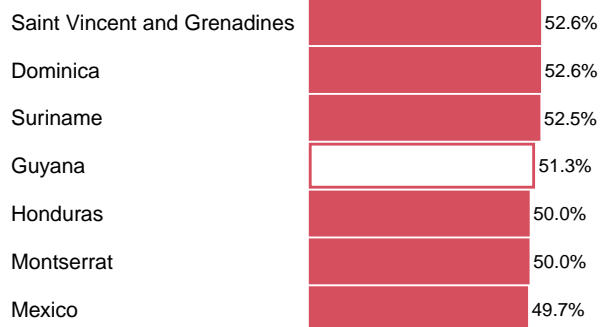

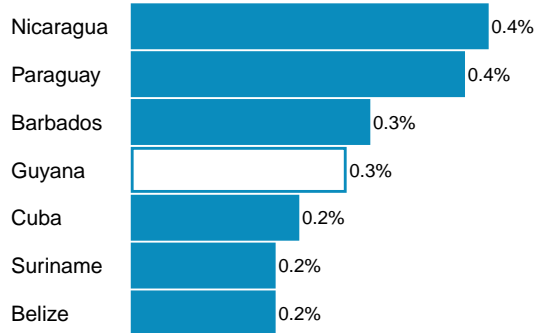

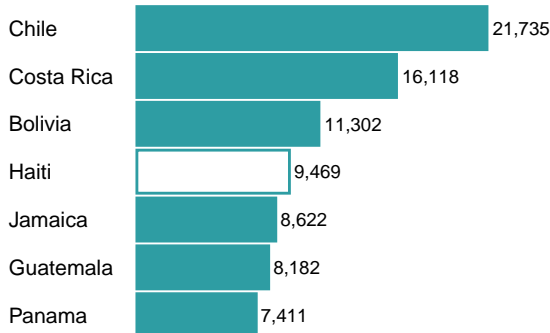

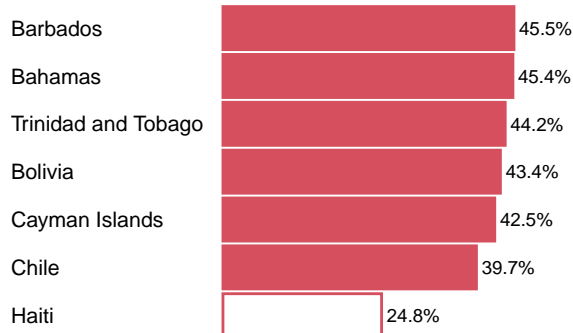

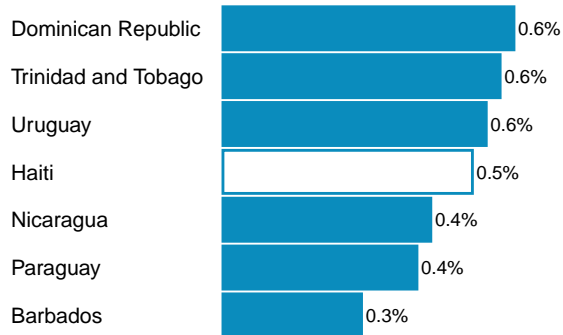

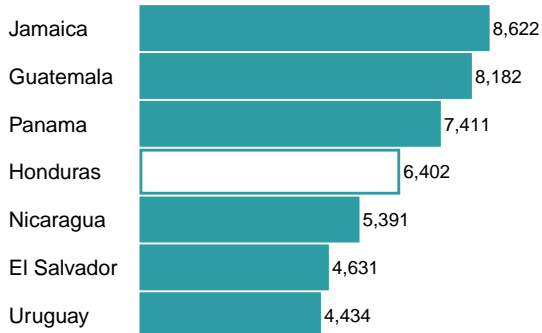

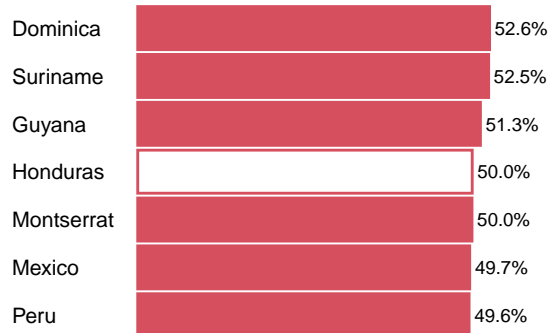

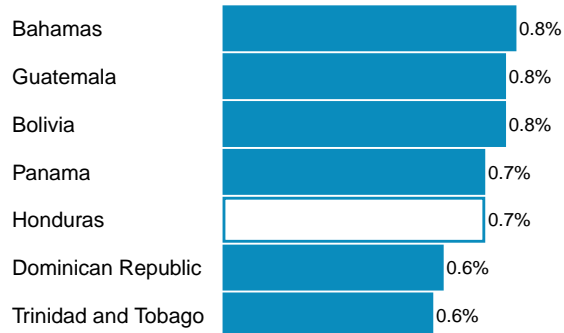

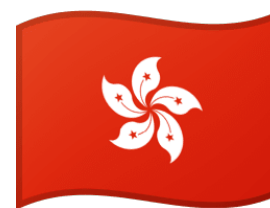

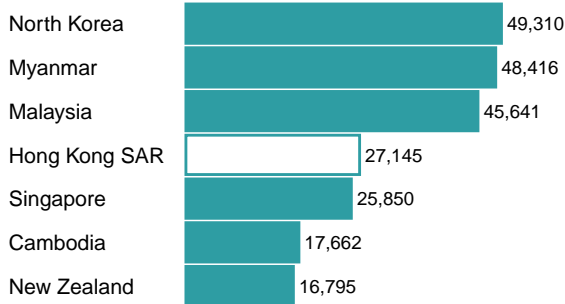

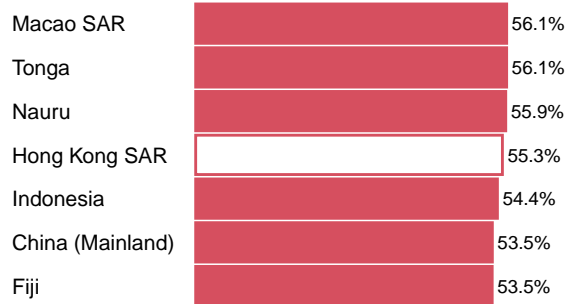

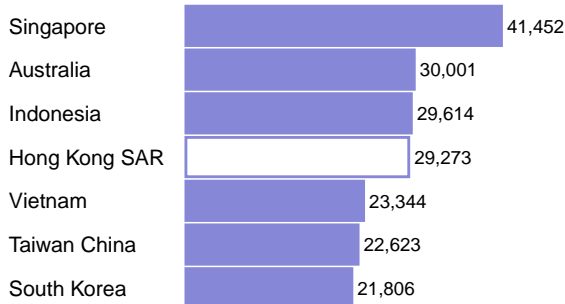

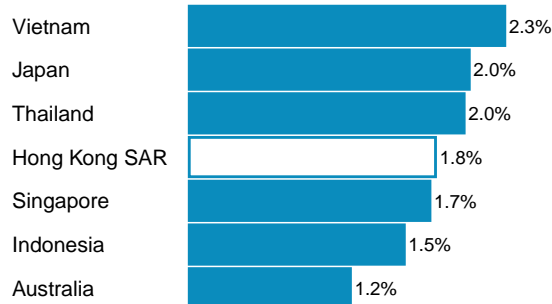
GME Degrees By Females

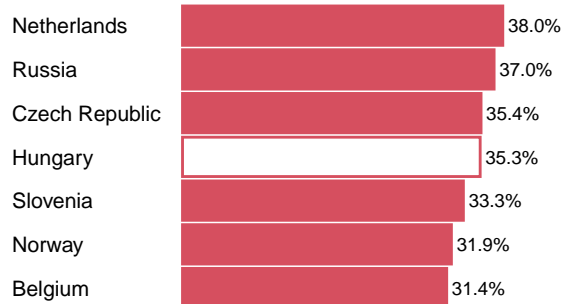

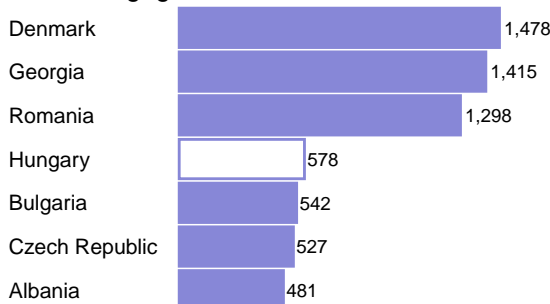

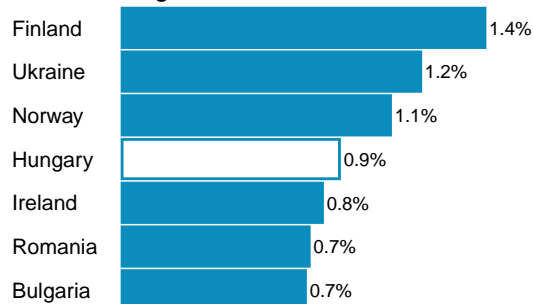

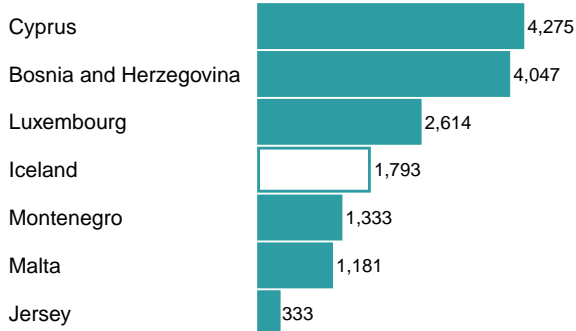

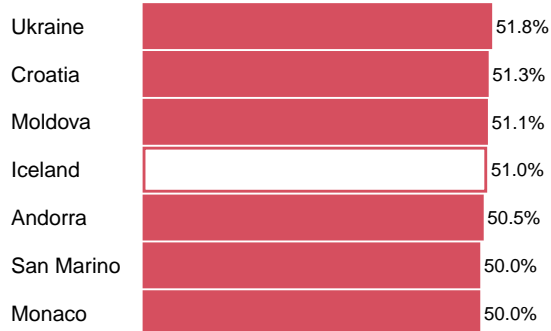

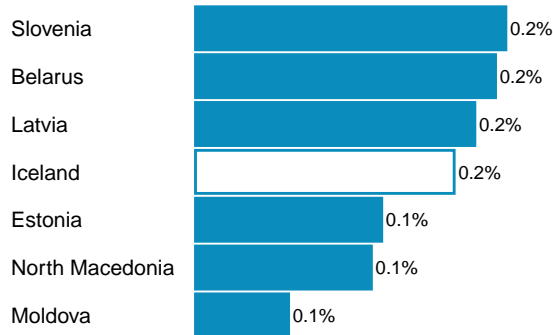

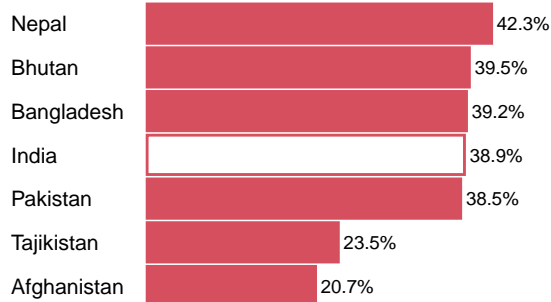

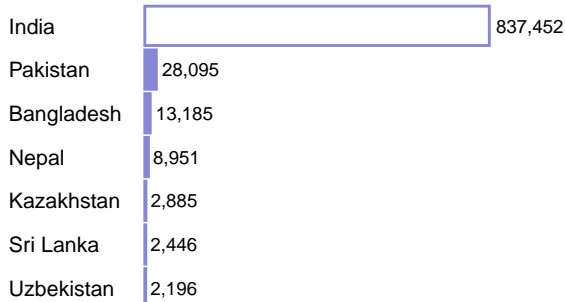

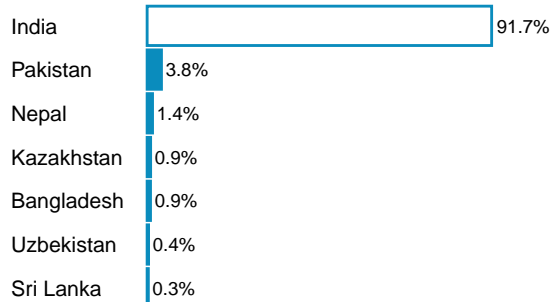

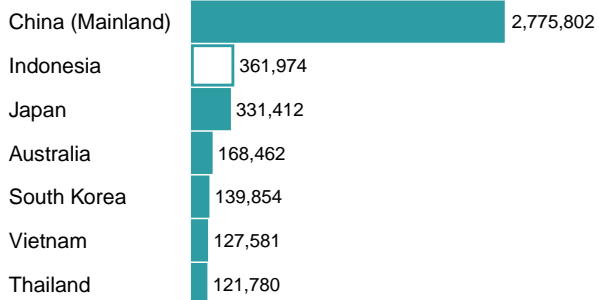

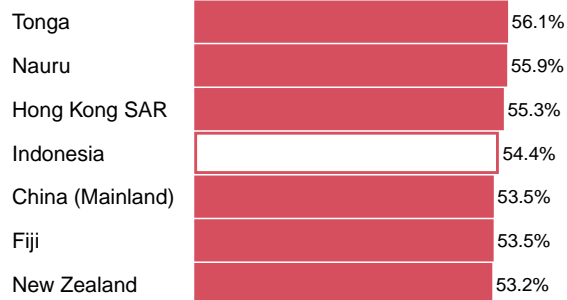

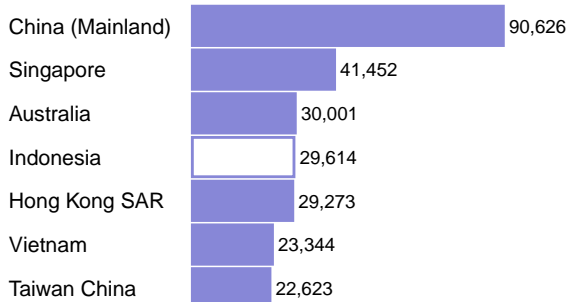

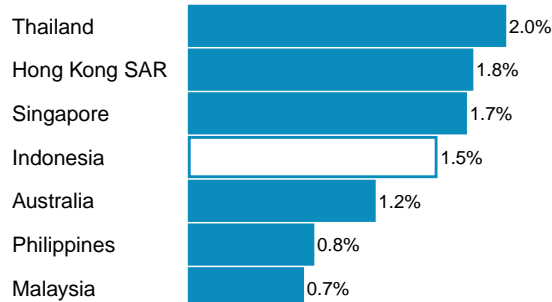
GME Degrees By Females

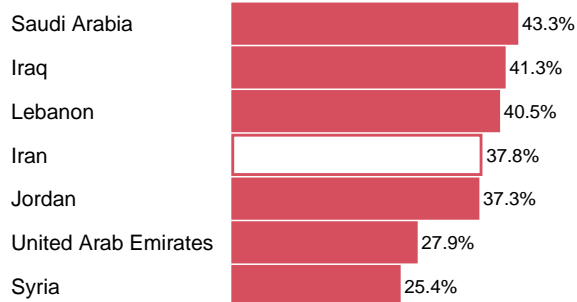

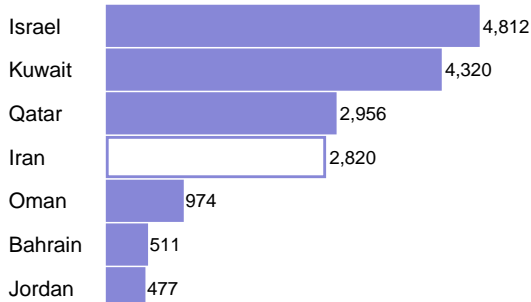

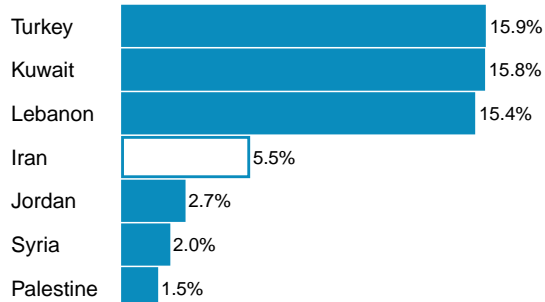
GME Degrees By Females

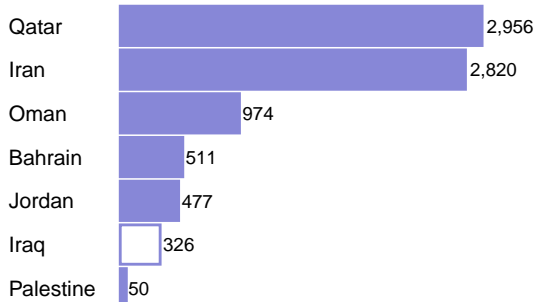

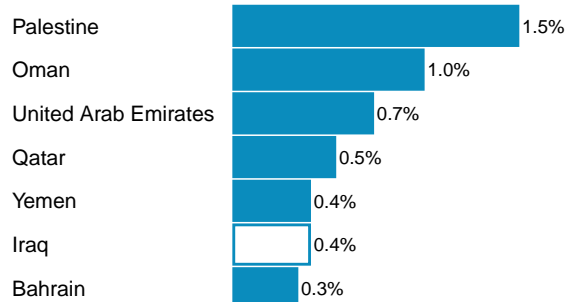

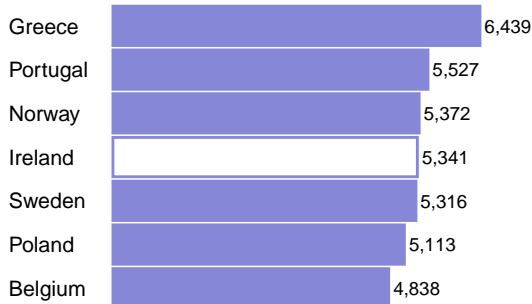

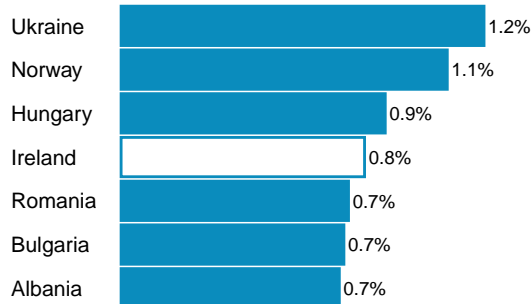

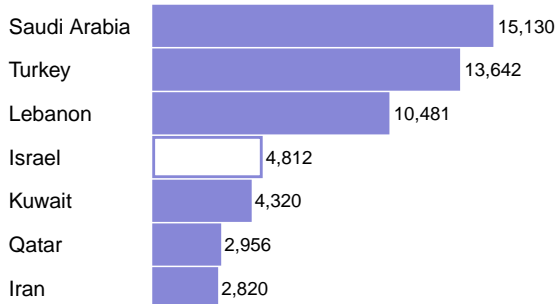

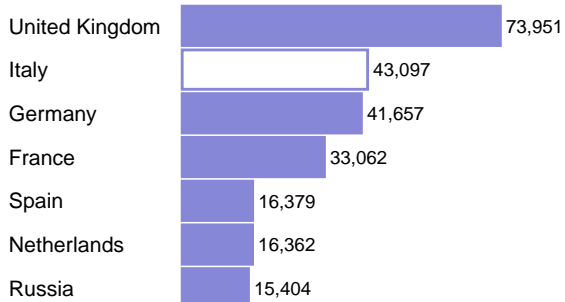

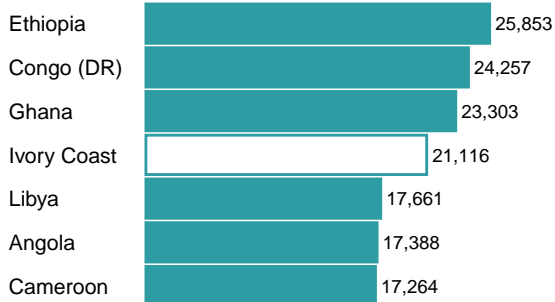

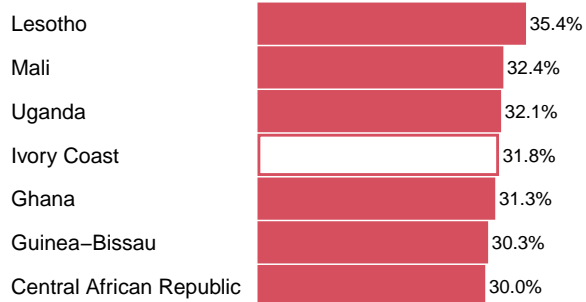

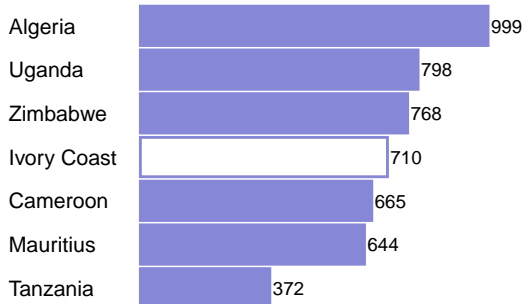

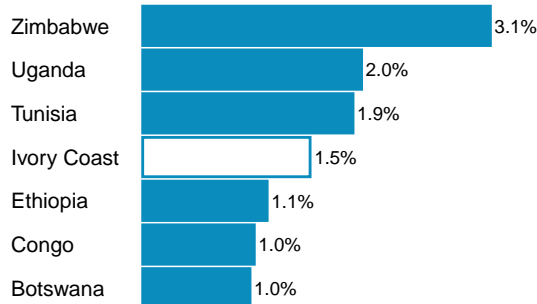
GME Degrees By Females

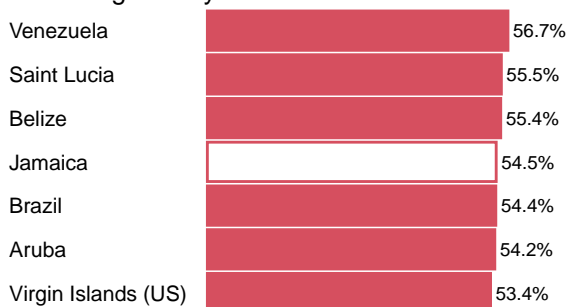

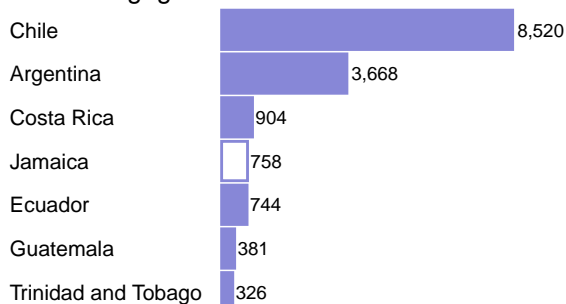

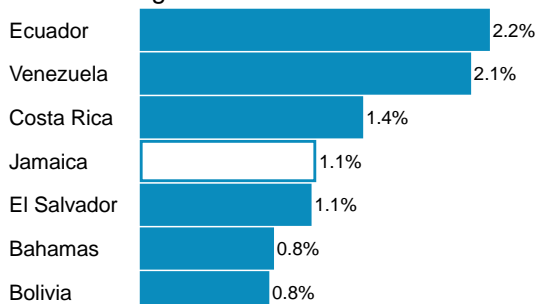
GME Degrees By Females

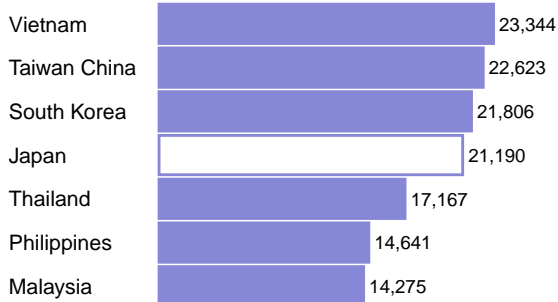

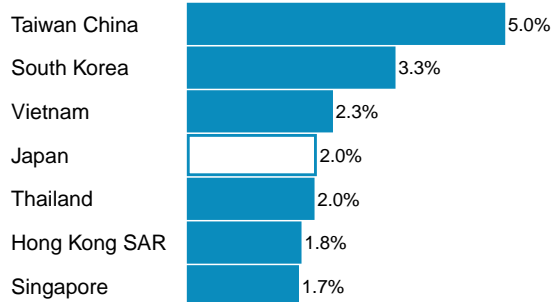

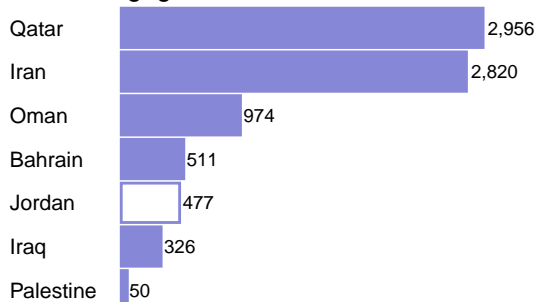

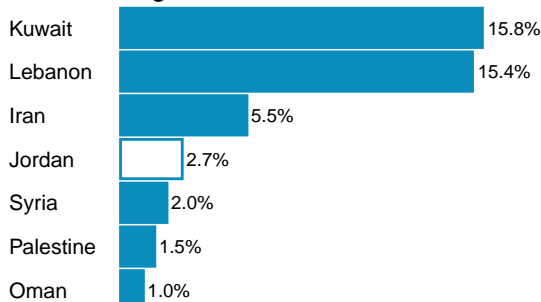

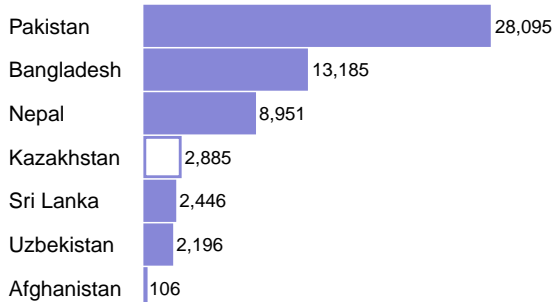

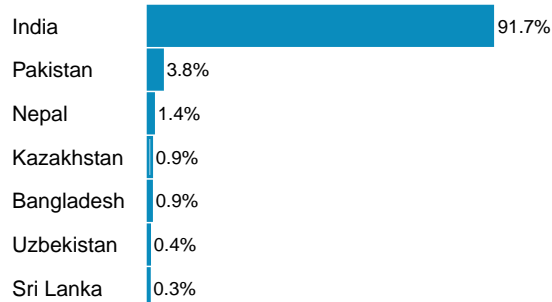

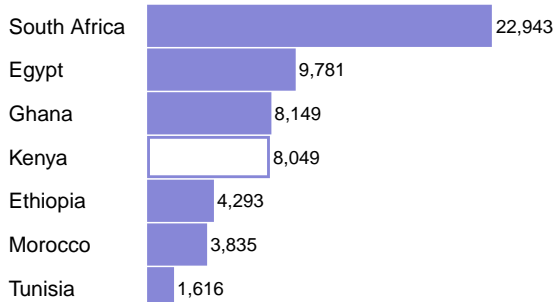

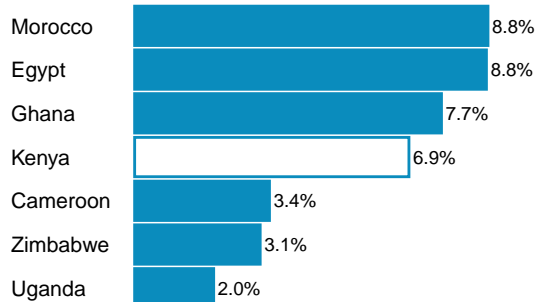

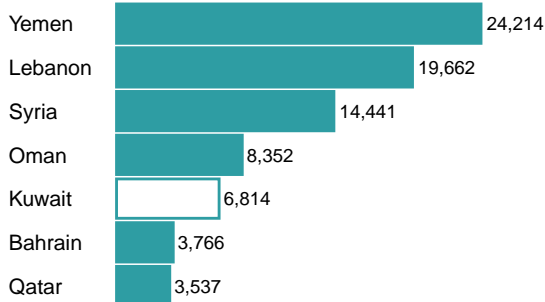

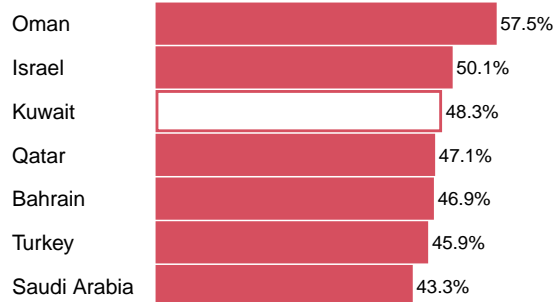

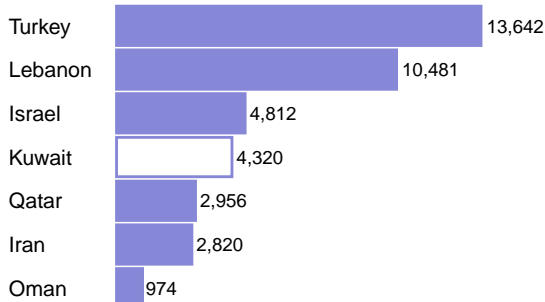

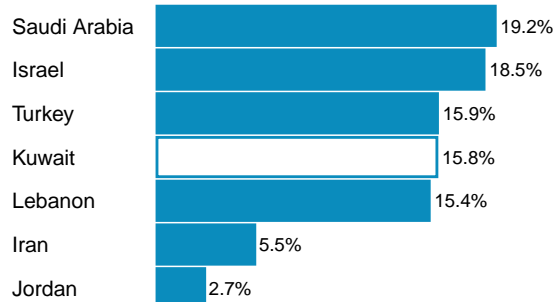
GME Degrees By Females

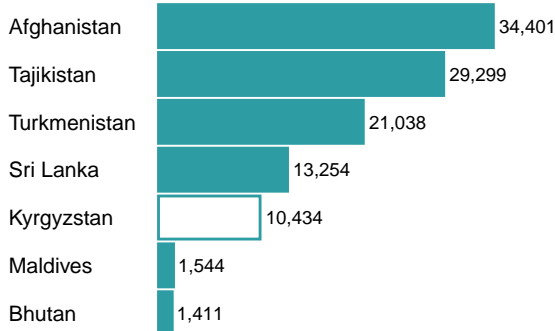

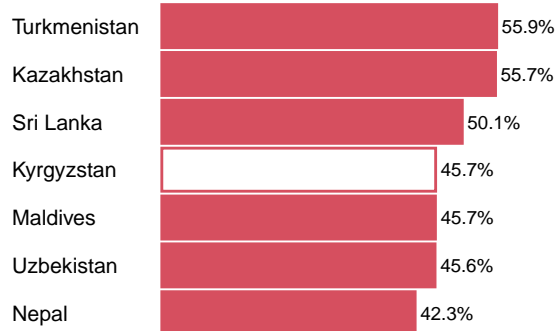

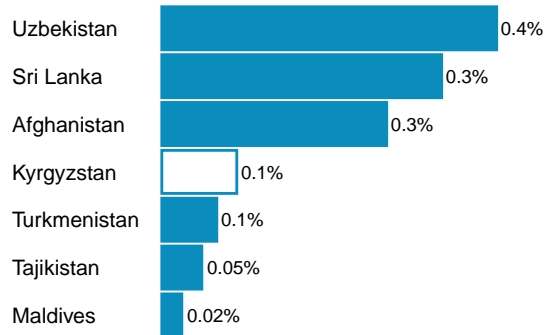
Total GME Degrees

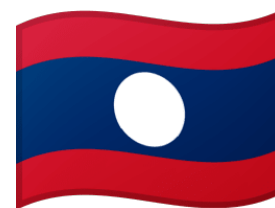

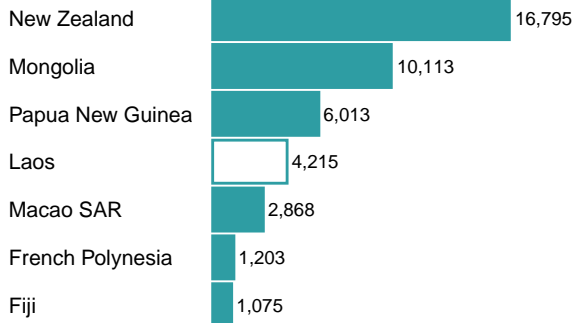

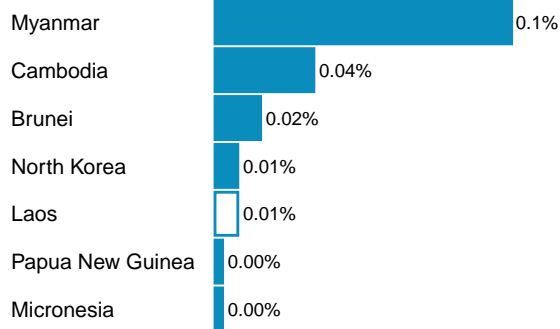

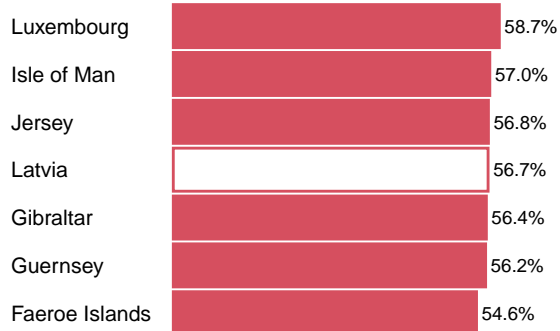

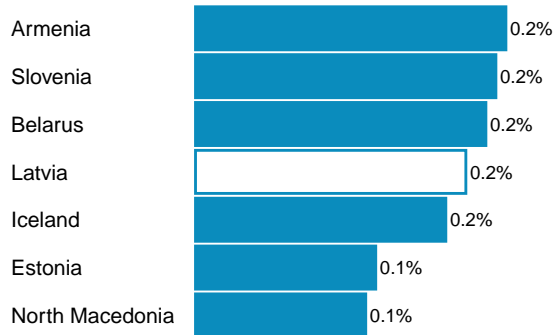

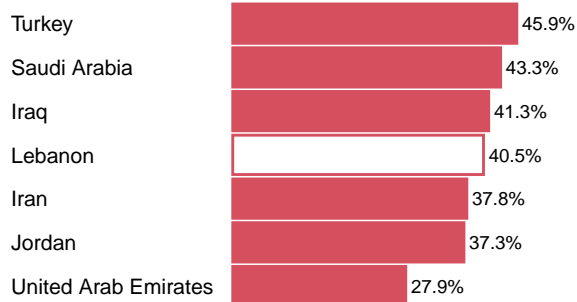

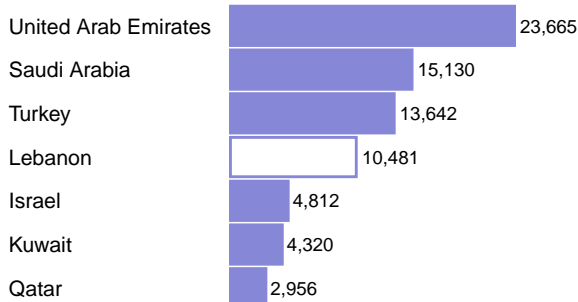

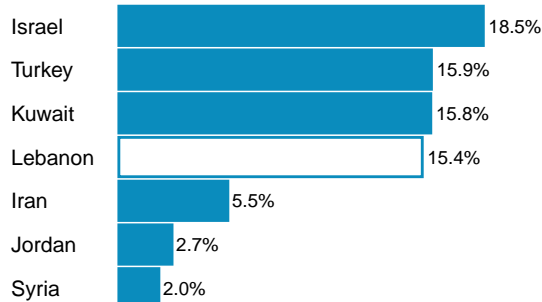

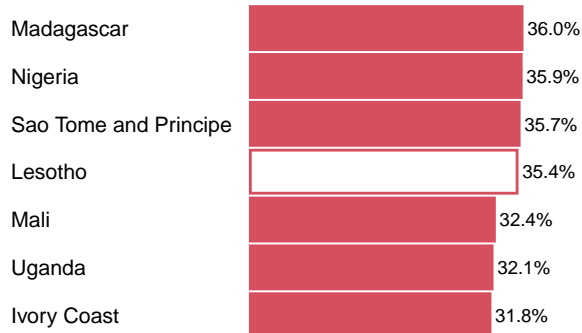

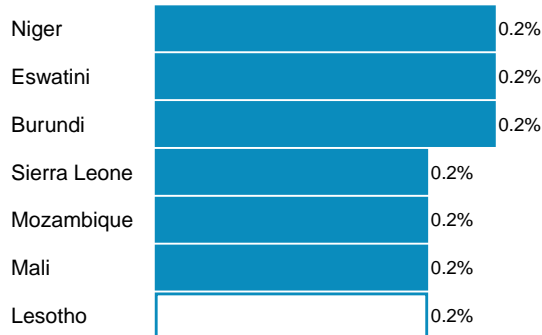

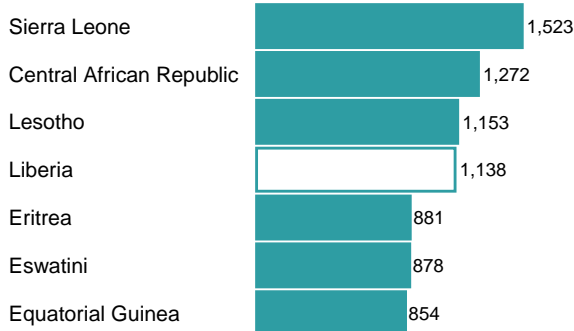

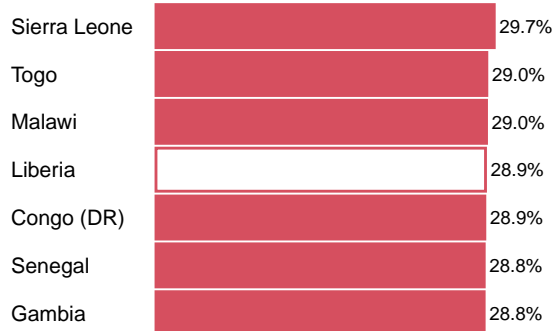

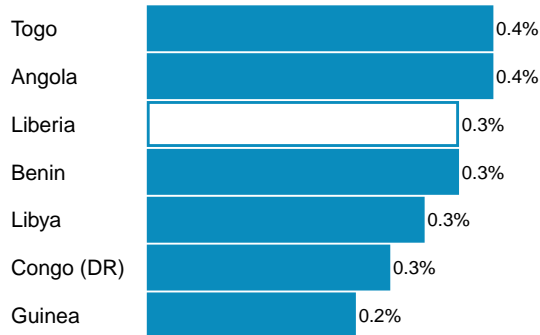
Total GME Degrees

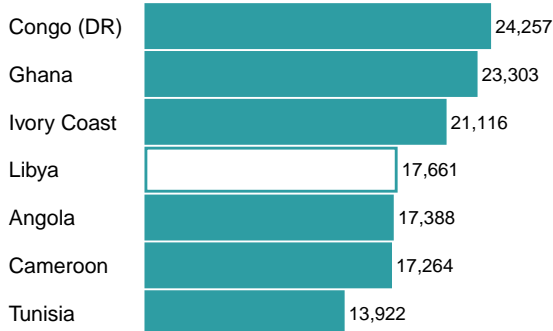

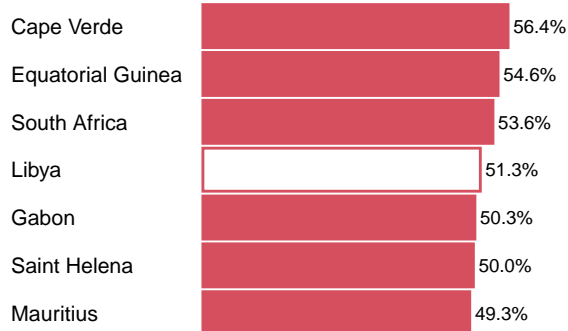

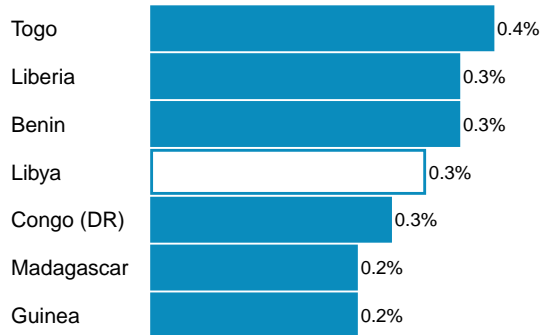
Total GME Degrees

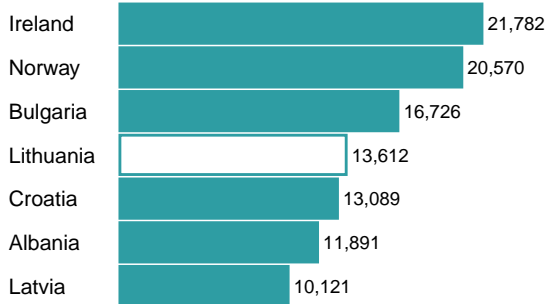

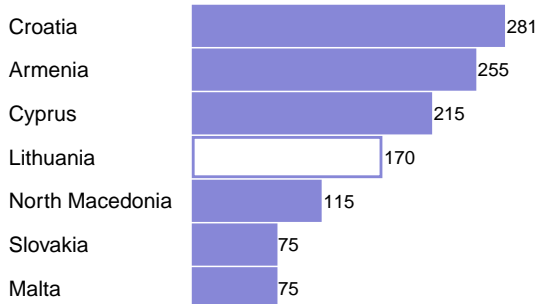

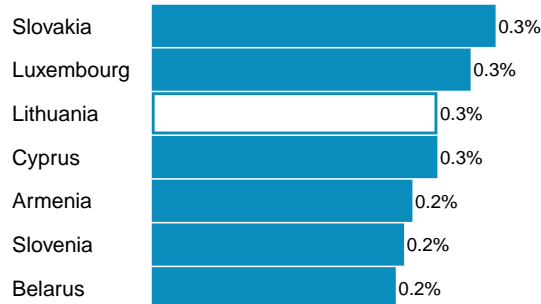
GME Degrees By Females

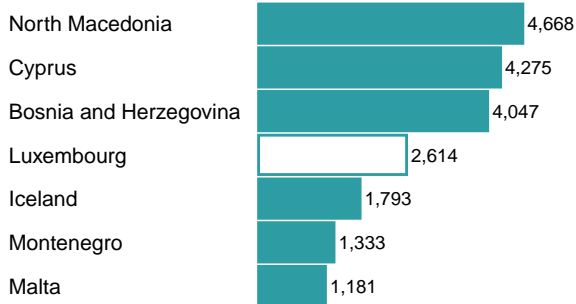

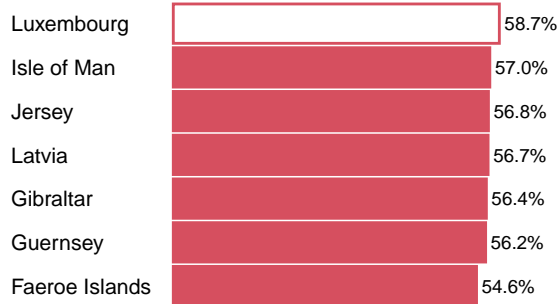

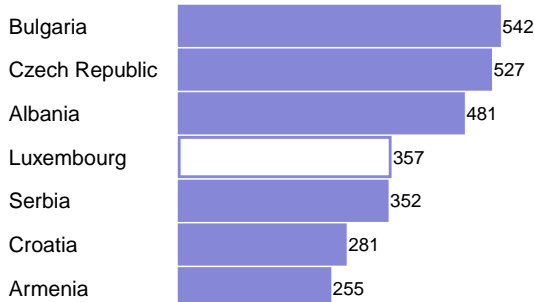

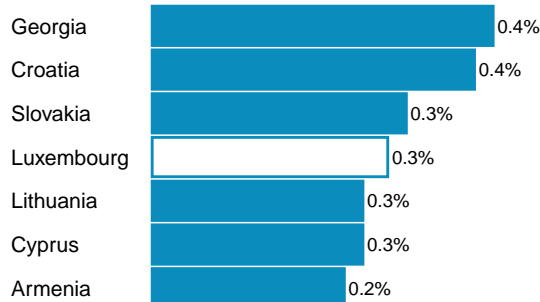
GME Degrees By Females

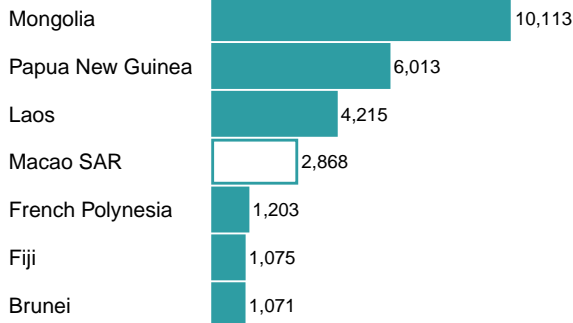

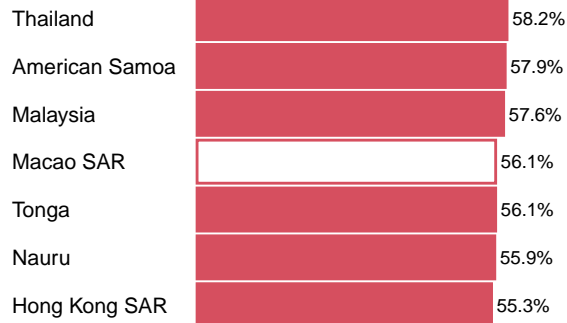

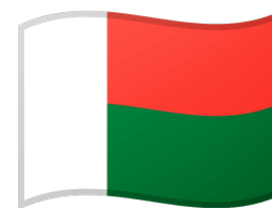

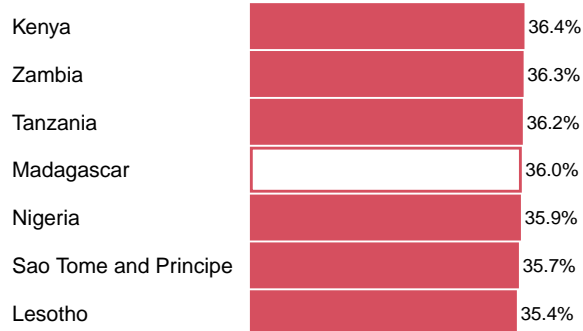

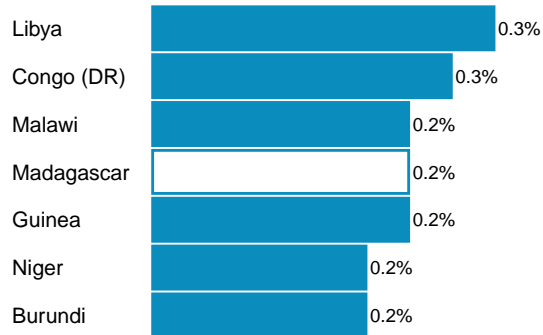

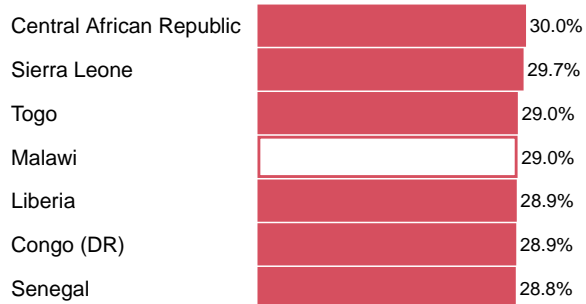

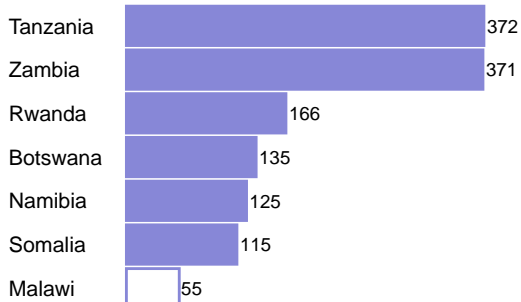

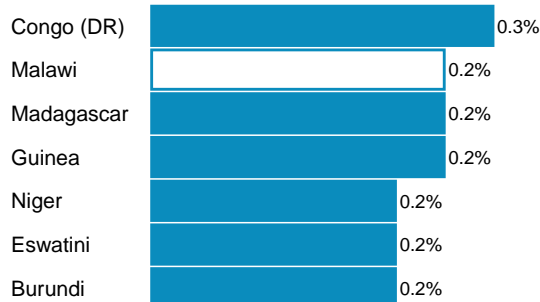
GME Degrees By Females

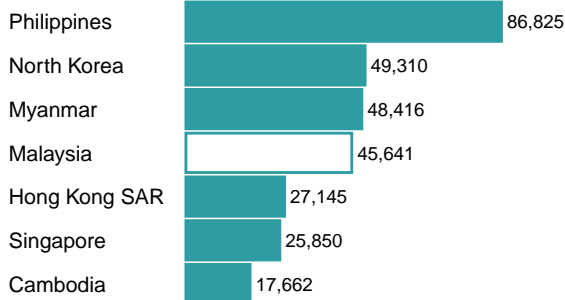

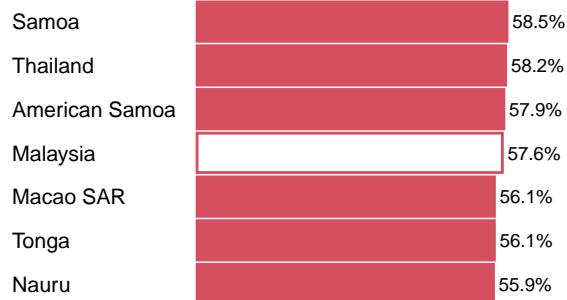

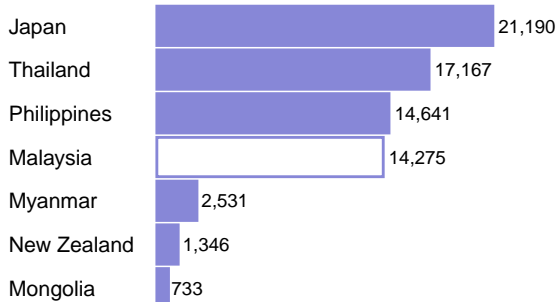

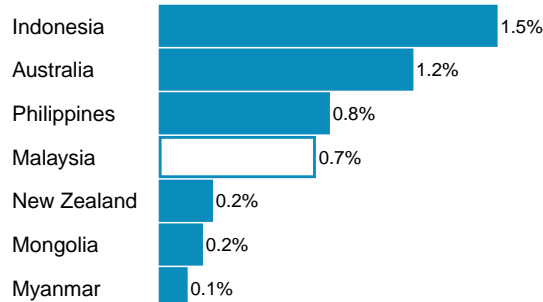
GME Degrees By Females

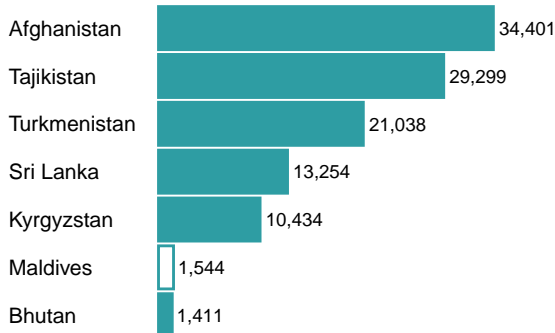

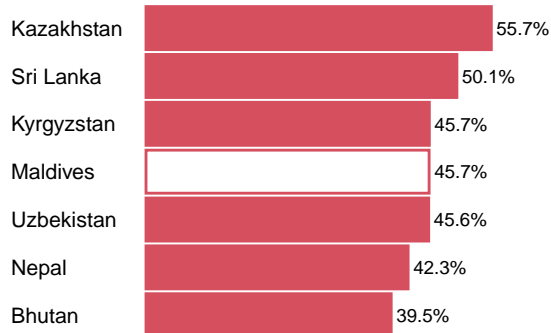

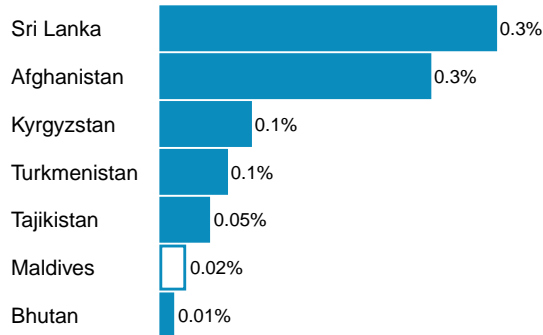

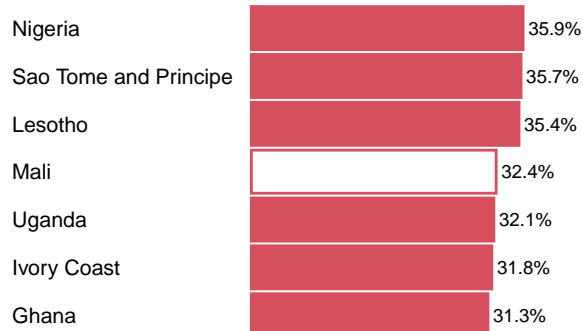

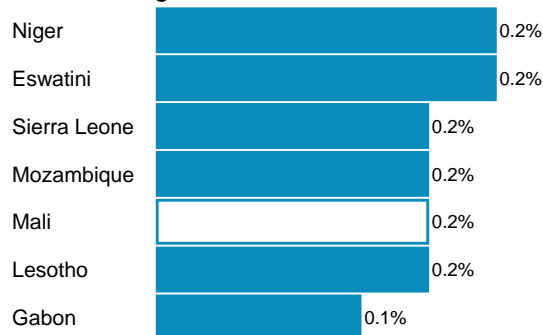

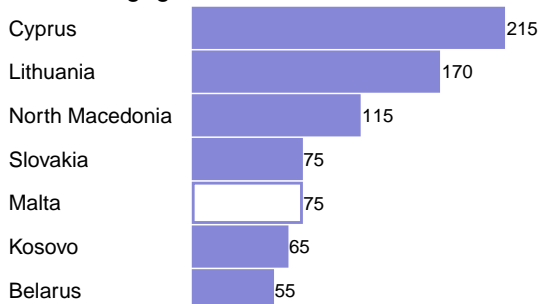

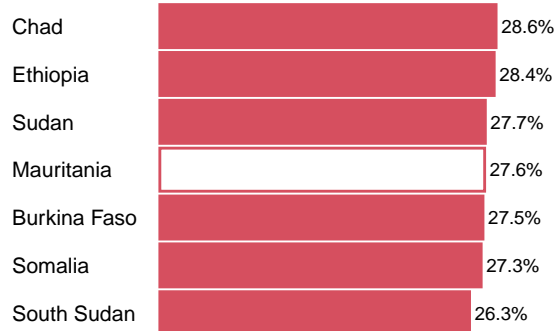

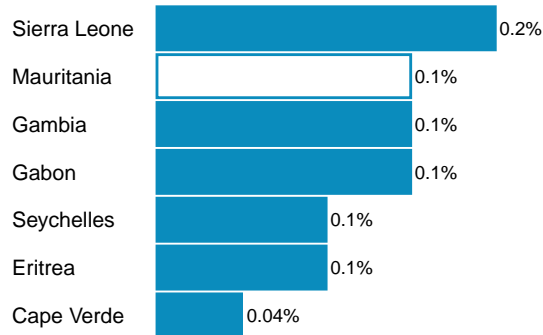

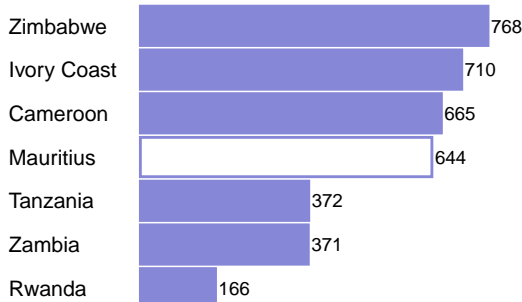

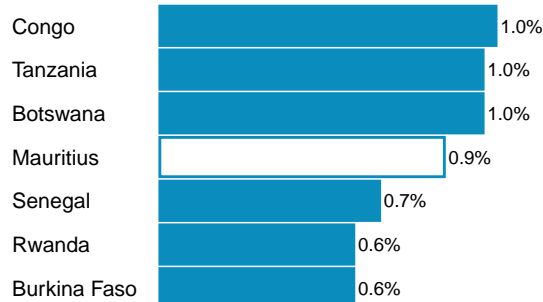

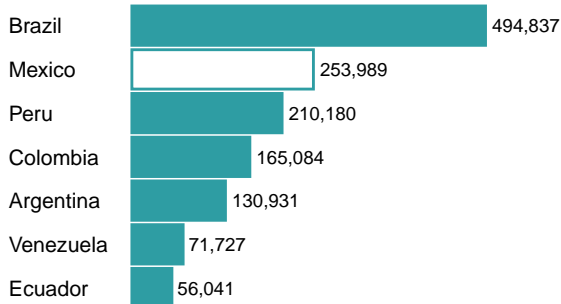

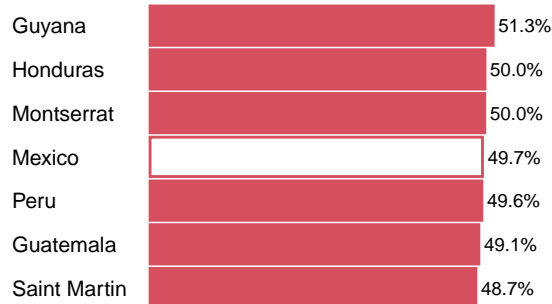

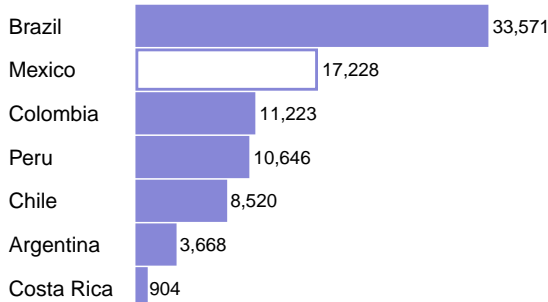

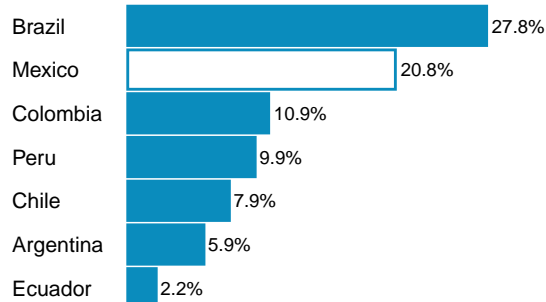
GME Degrees By Females

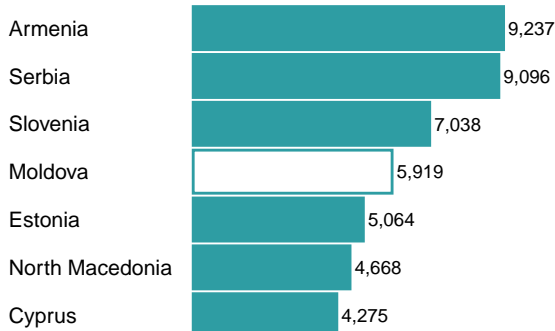

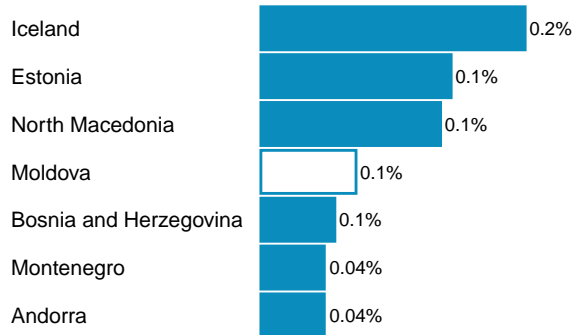

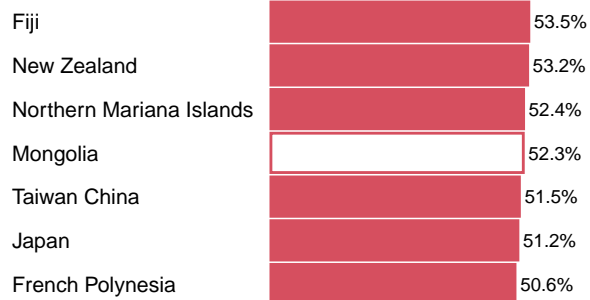

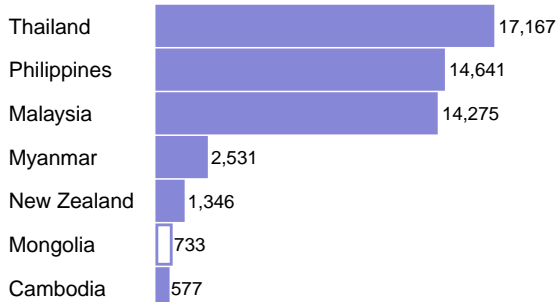

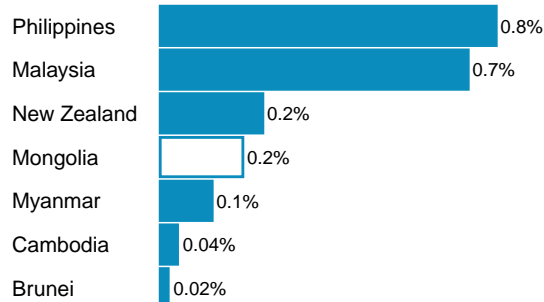

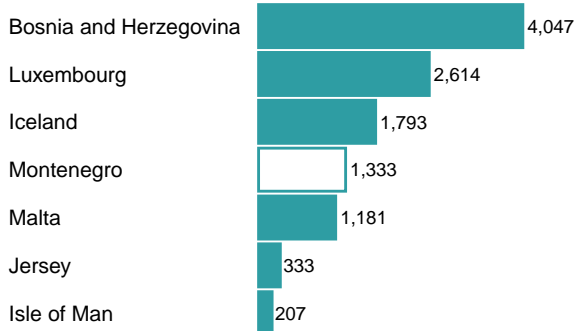

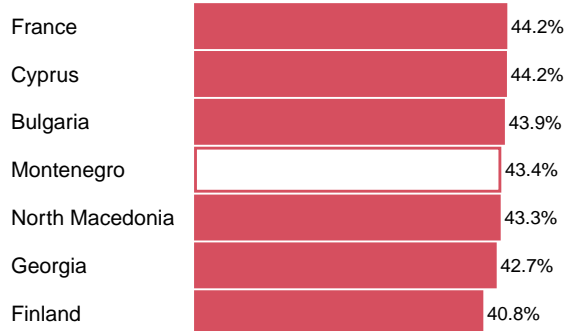

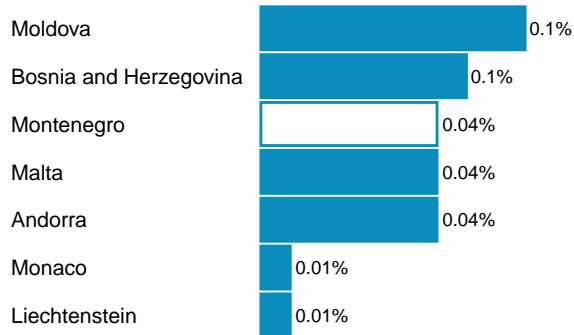

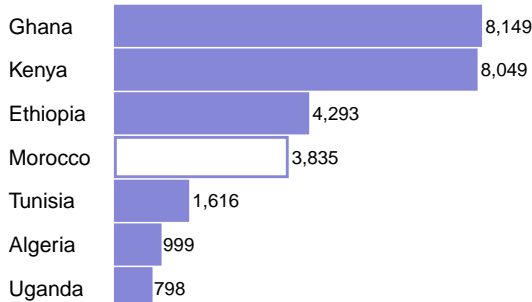

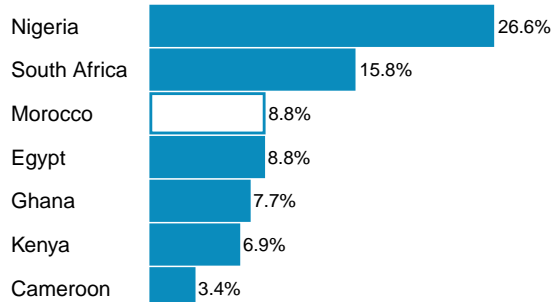

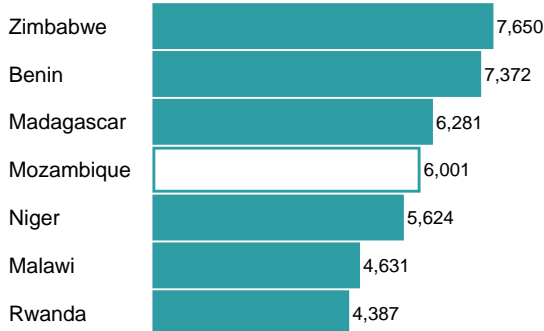

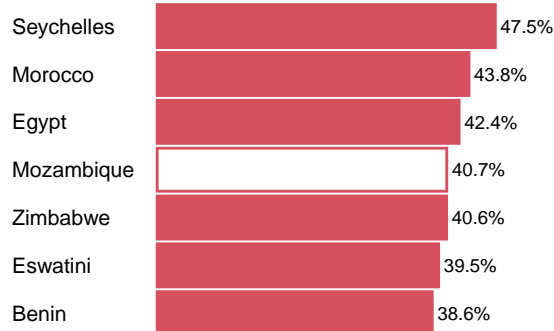

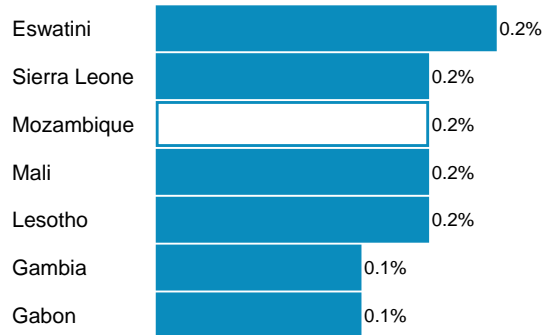

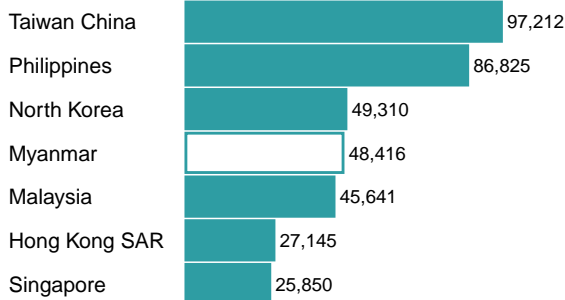

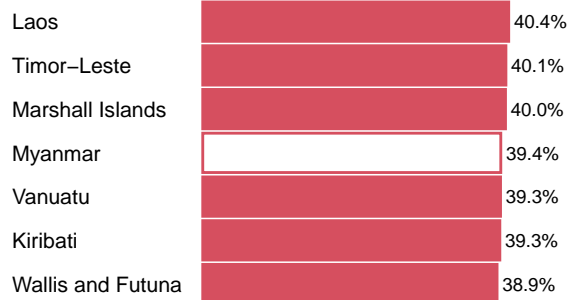

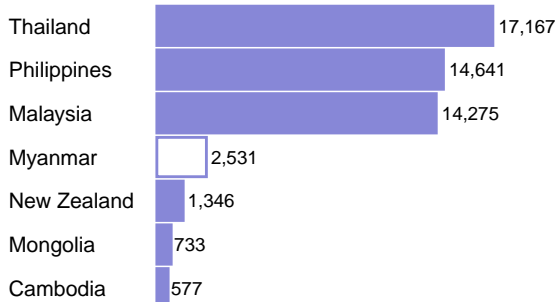

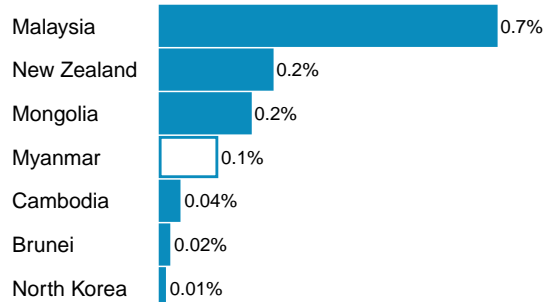
GME Degrees By Females

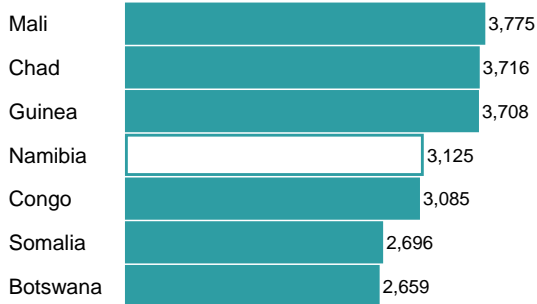

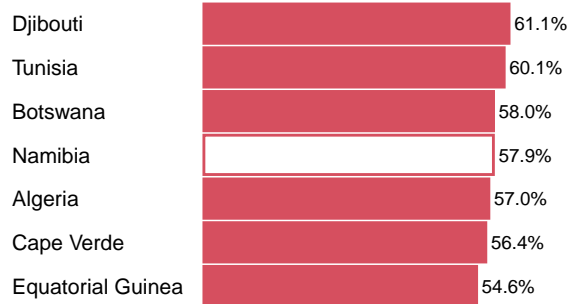

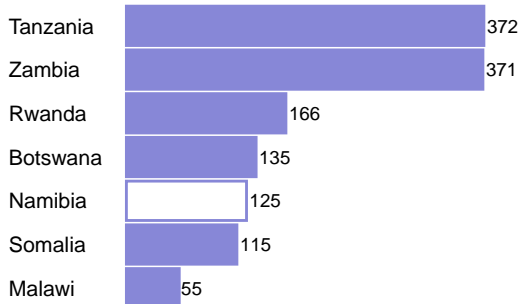

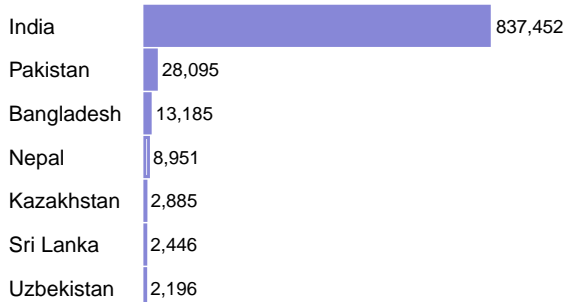

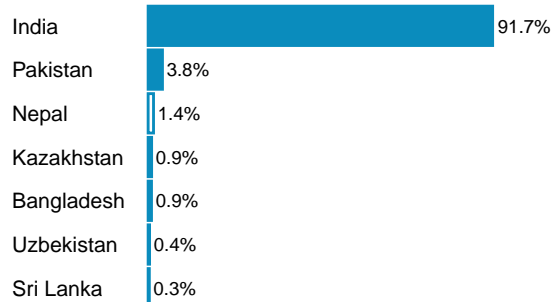

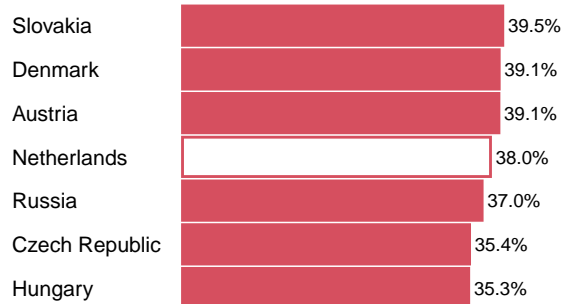

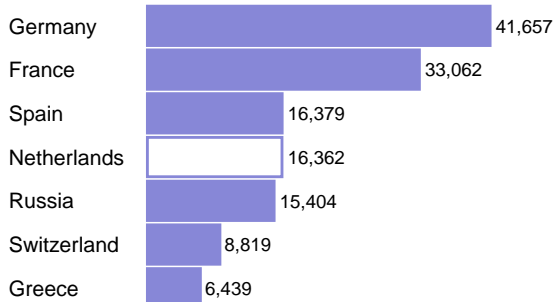

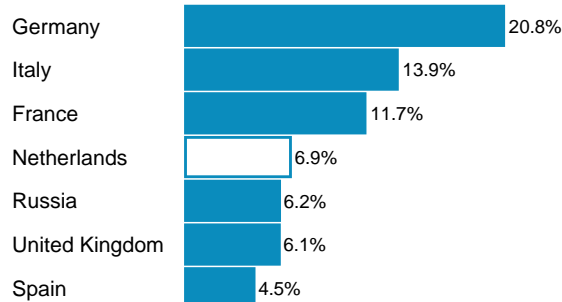

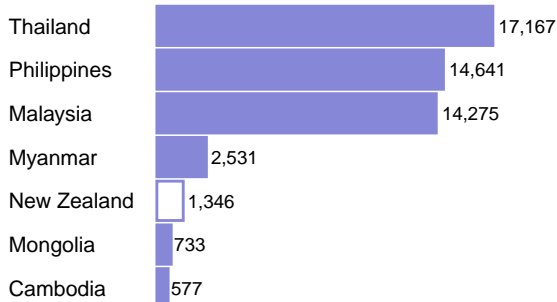

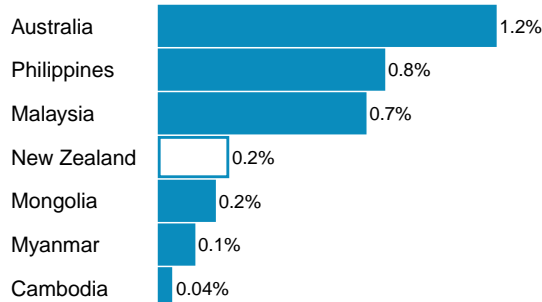

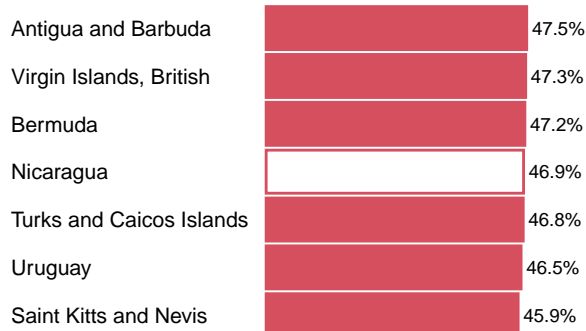

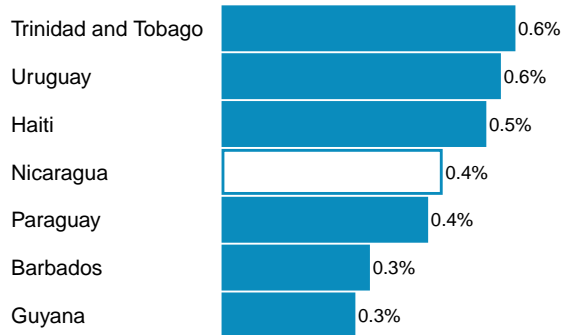

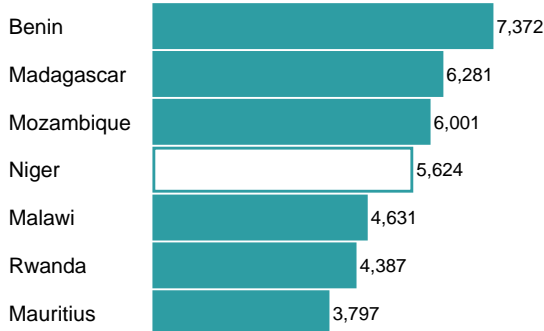

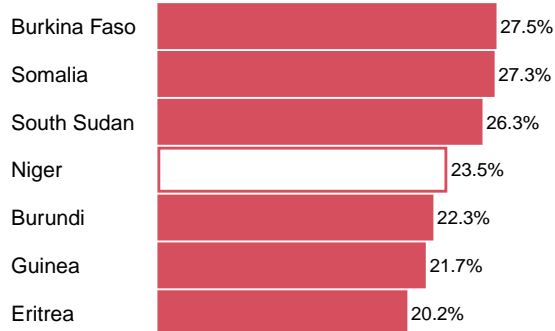

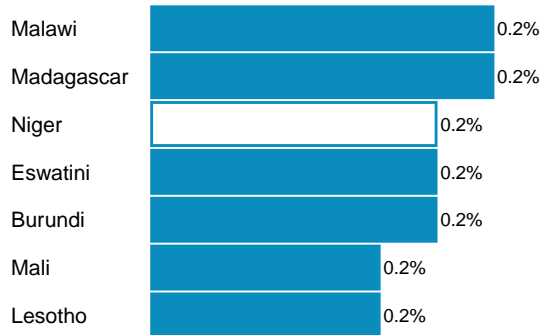

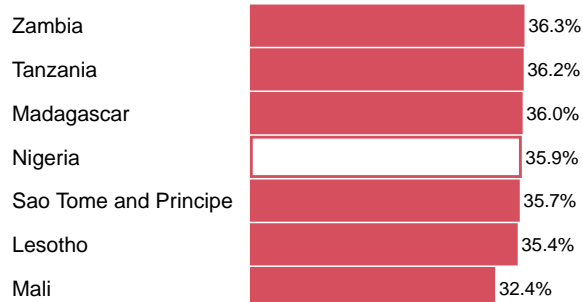

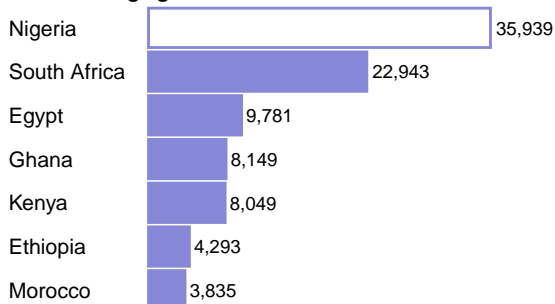

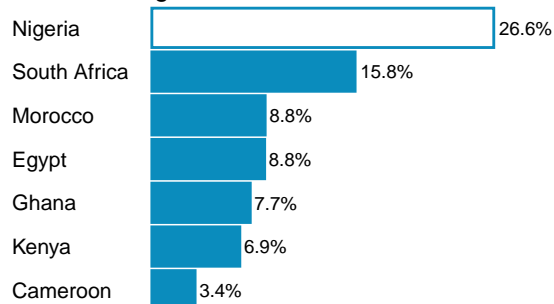
GME Degrees By Females

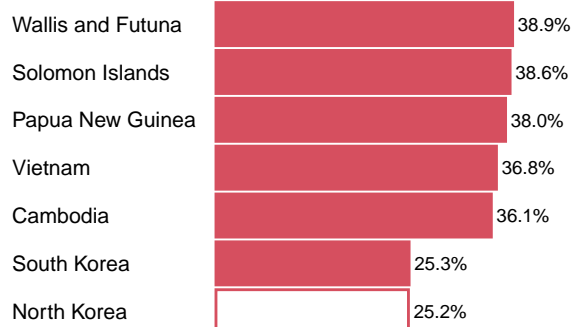

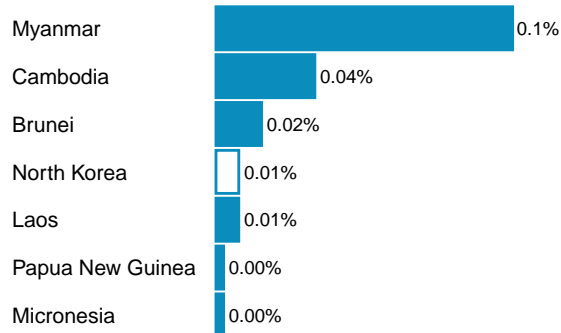

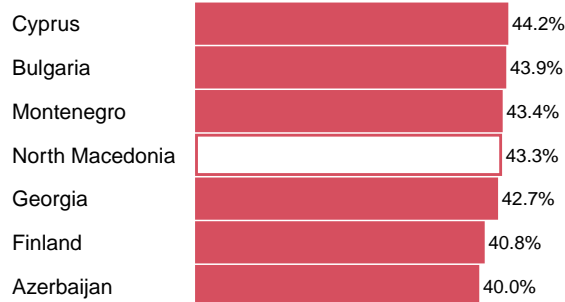

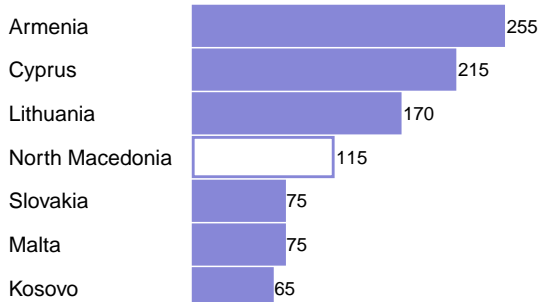

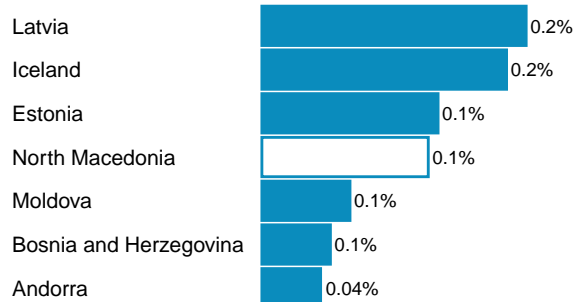

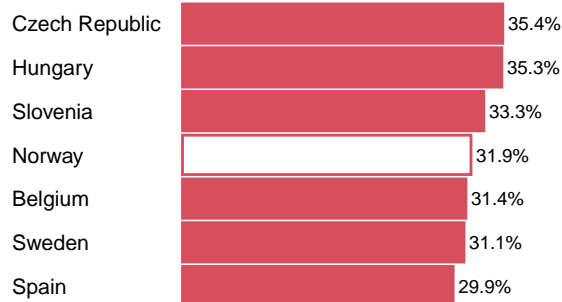

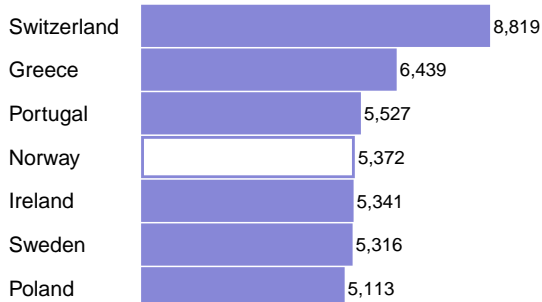

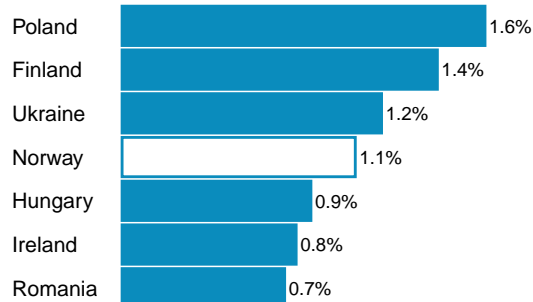

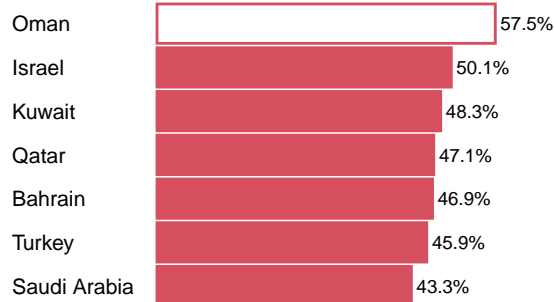

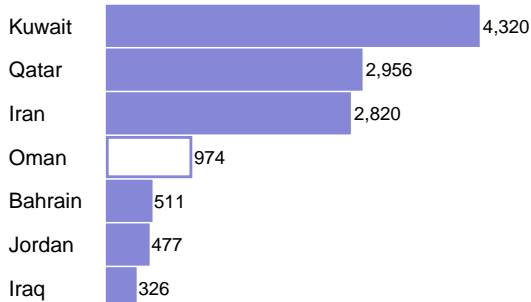

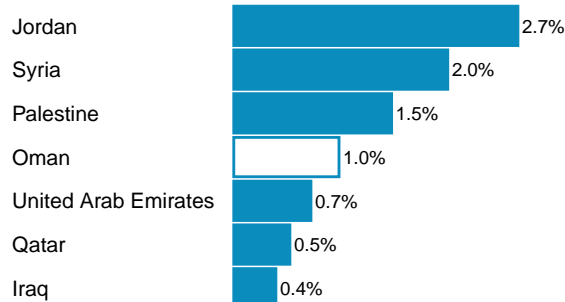

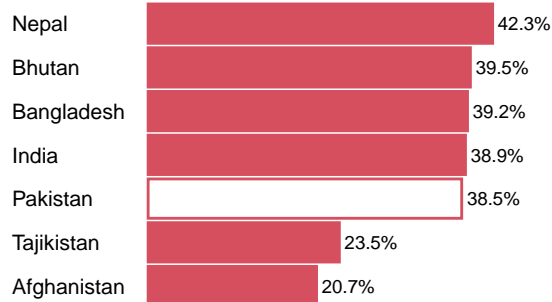

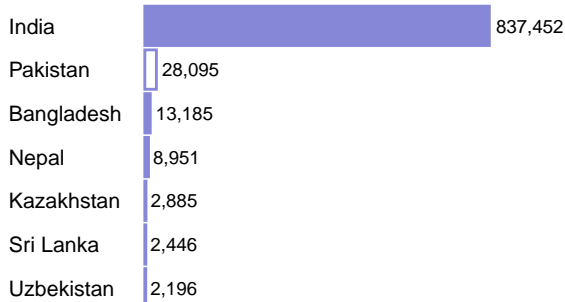

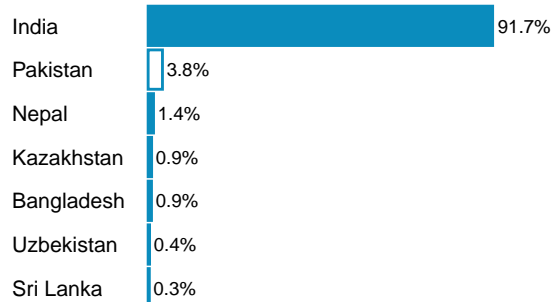
GME Degrees By Females

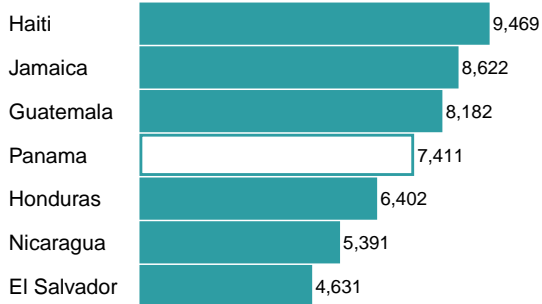

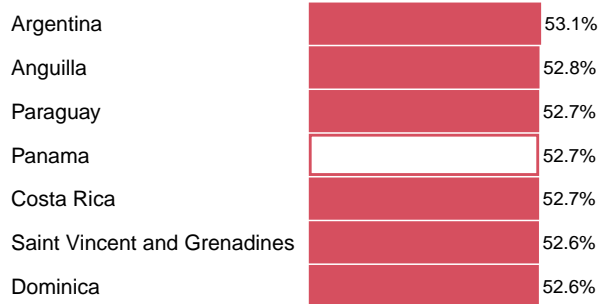

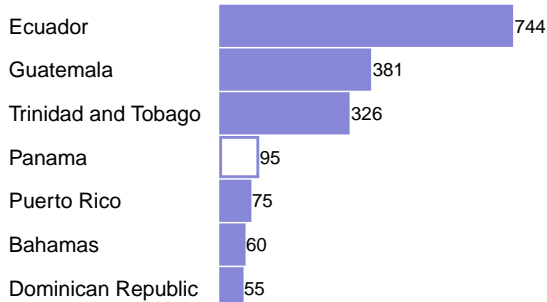

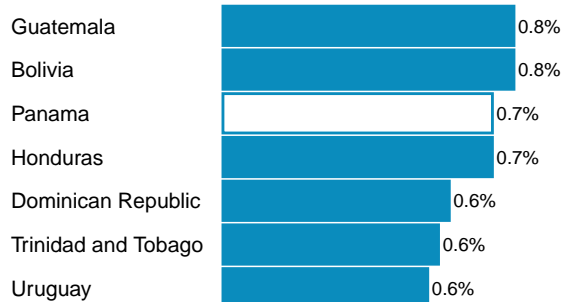
GME Degrees By Females

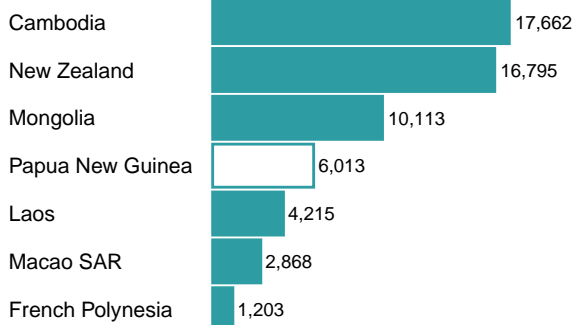

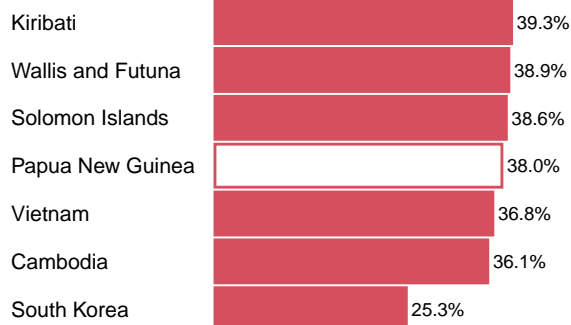

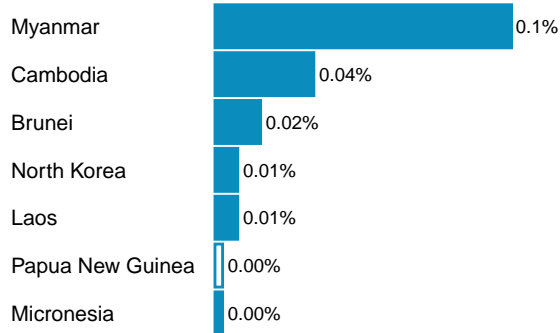

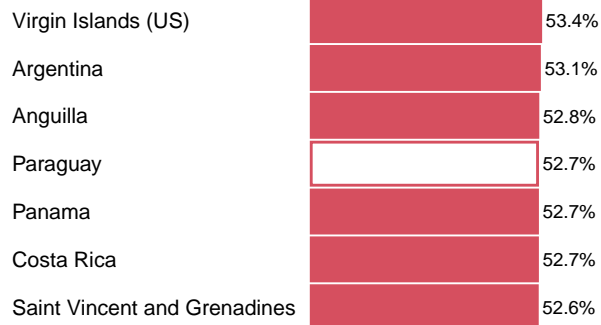

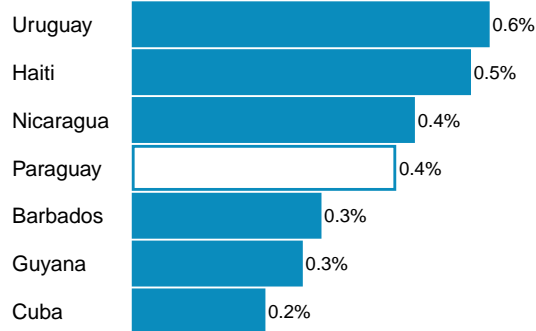

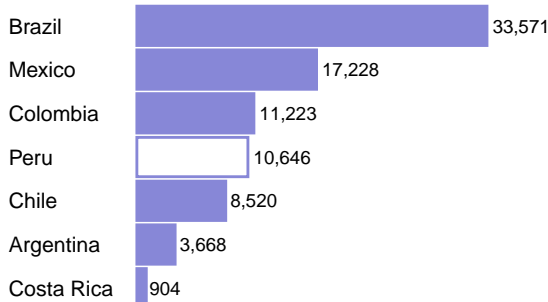

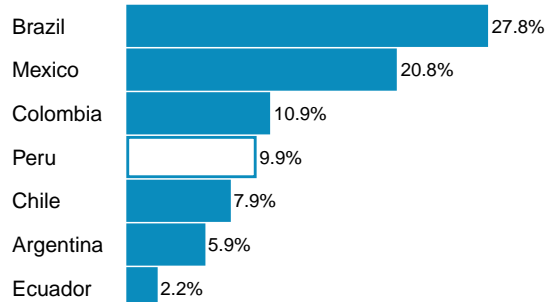

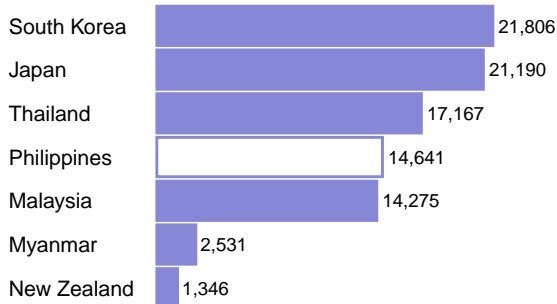

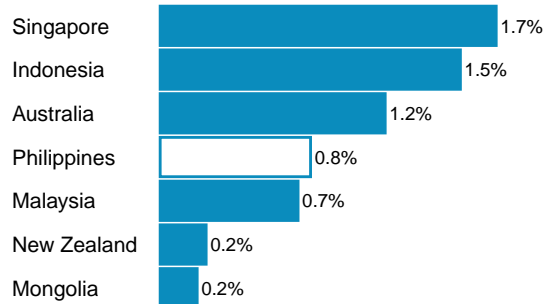

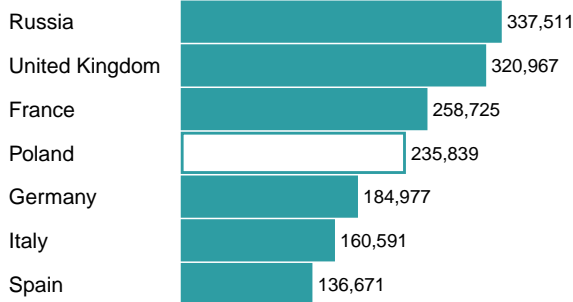

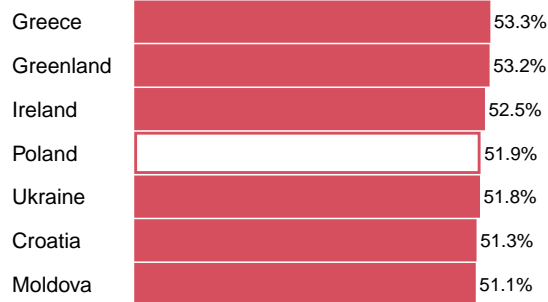

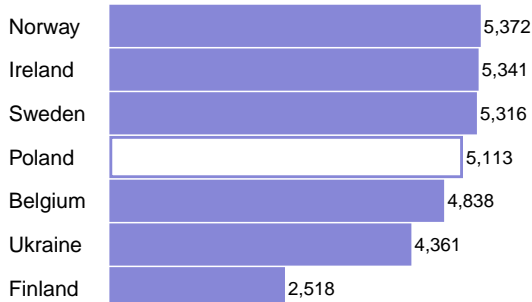

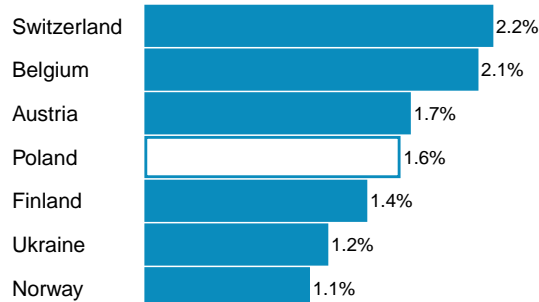
GME Degrees By Females

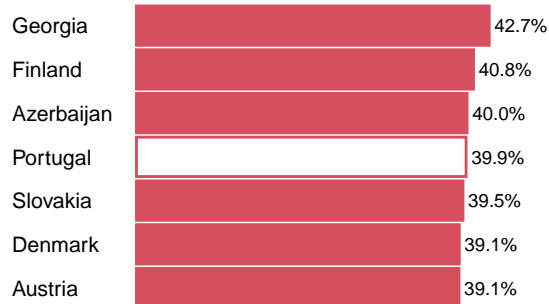

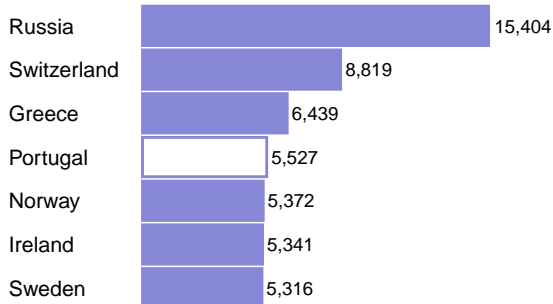

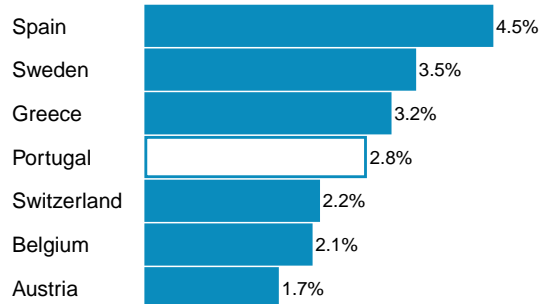
GME Degrees By Females

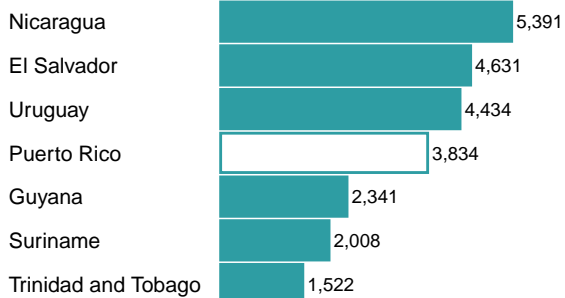

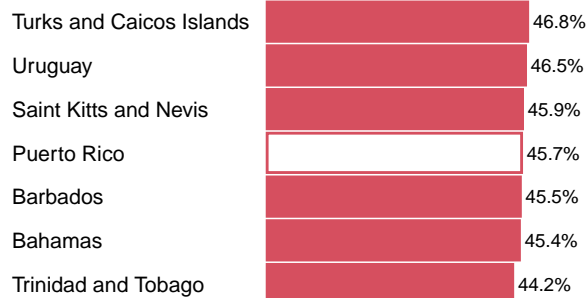

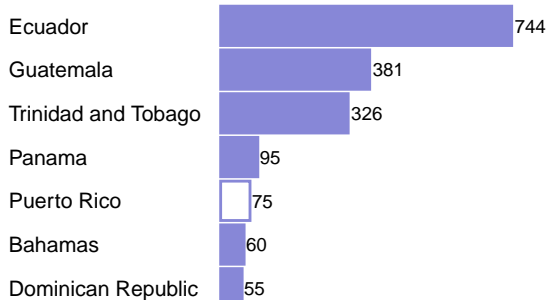

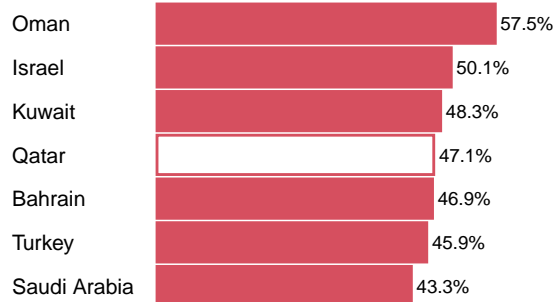

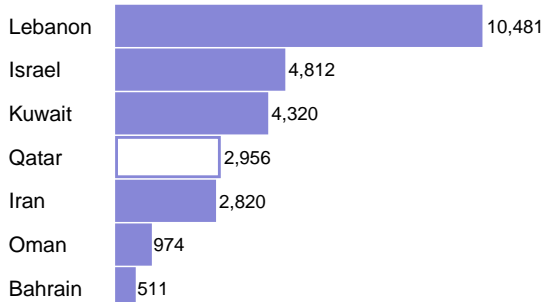

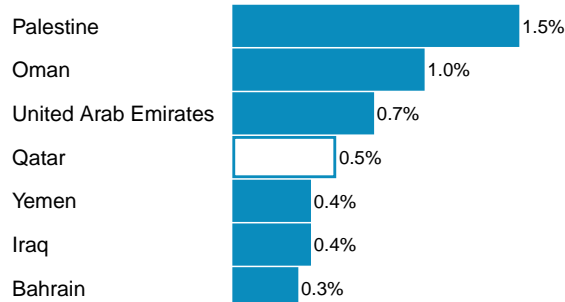

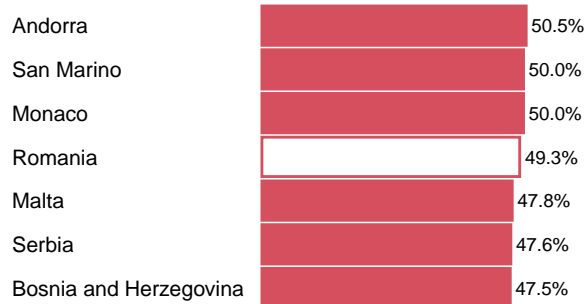

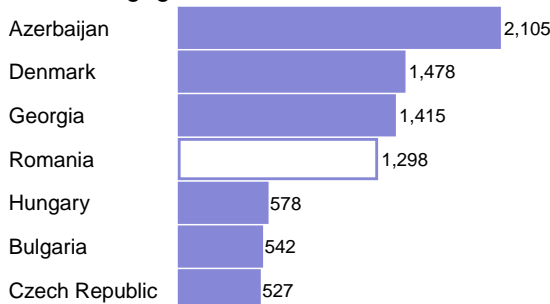

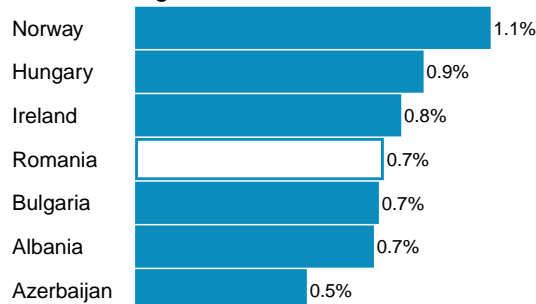

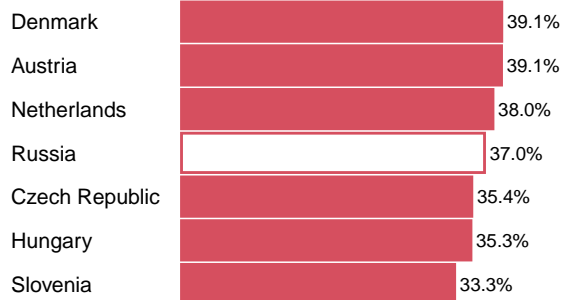

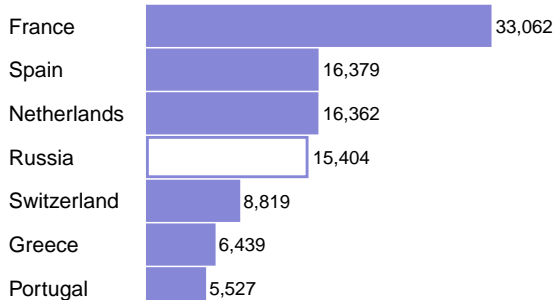

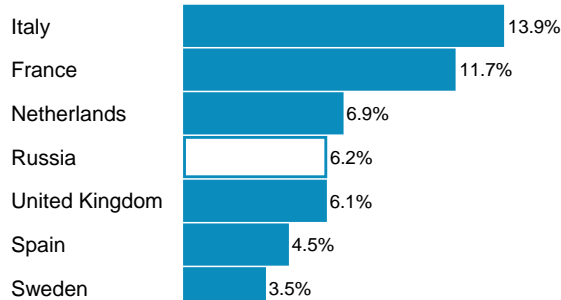

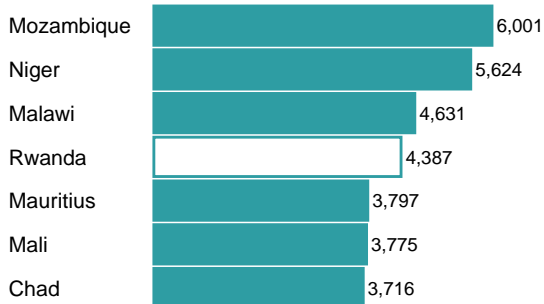

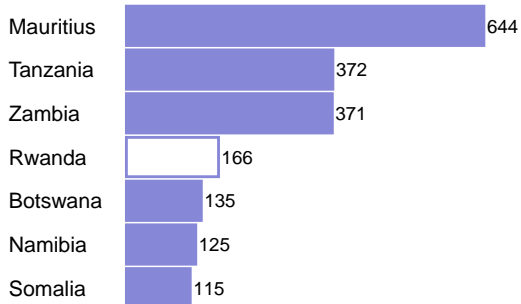

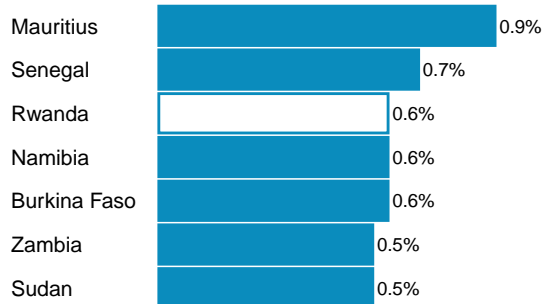
GME Degrees By Females

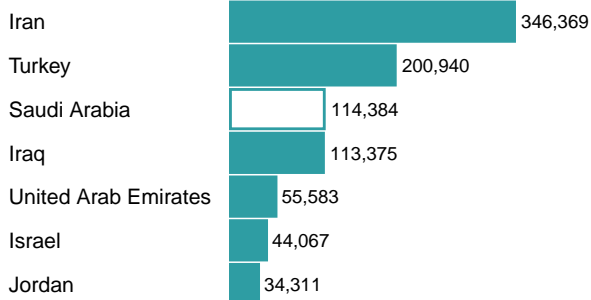

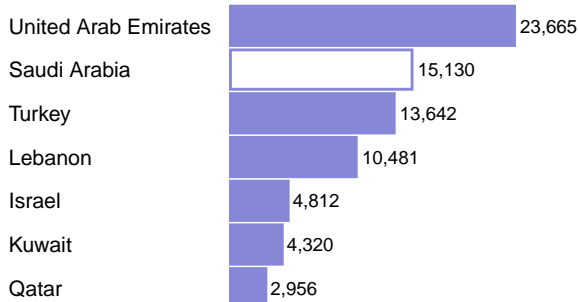

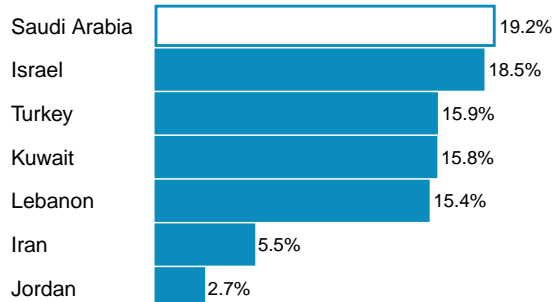
GME Degrees By Females

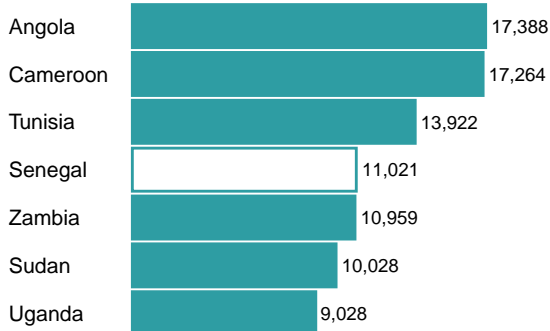

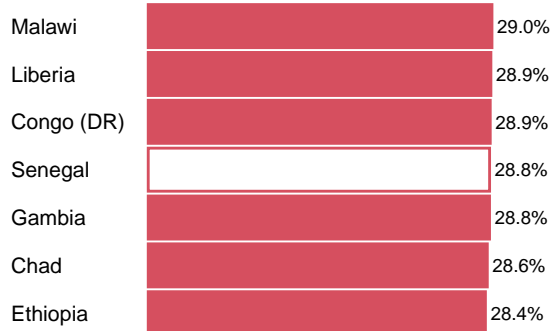

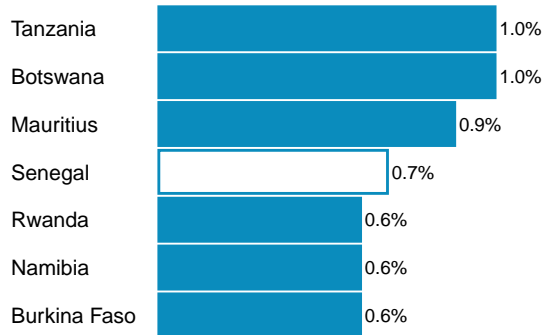

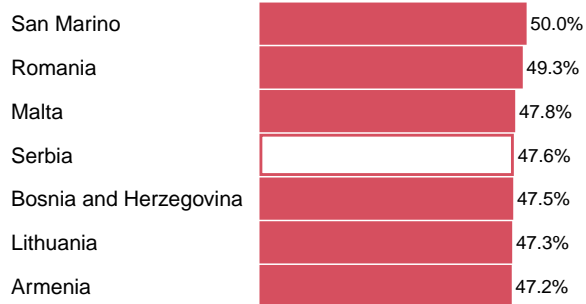

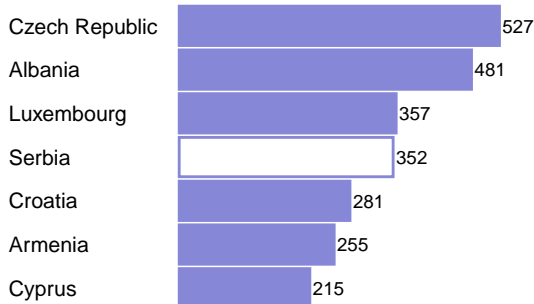

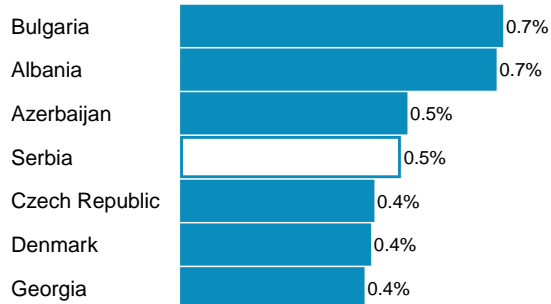

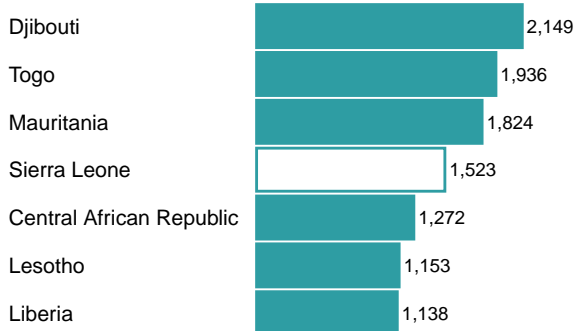

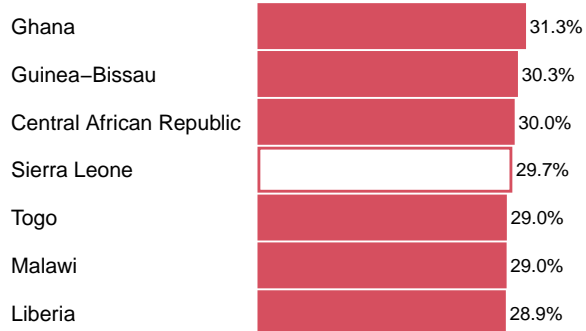

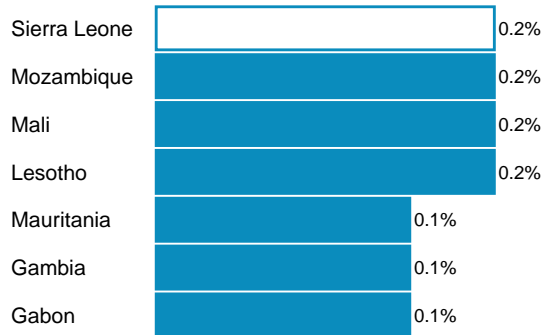

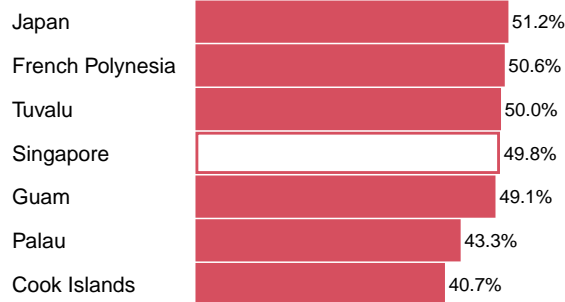

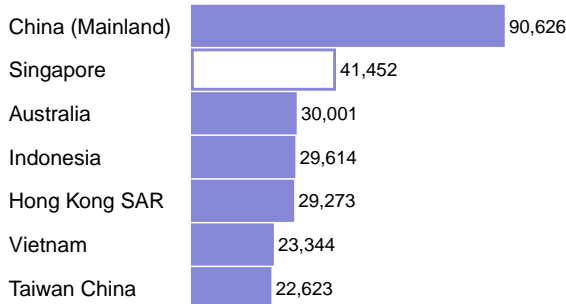

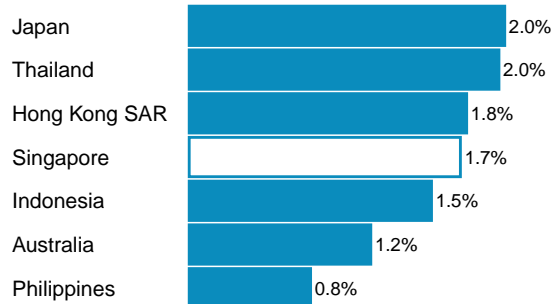

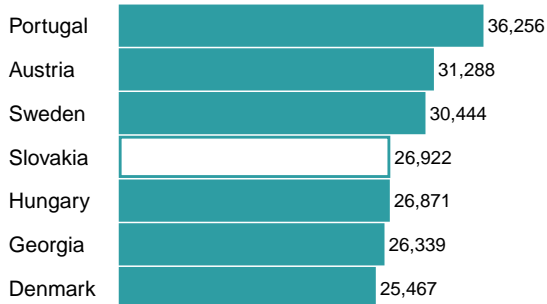

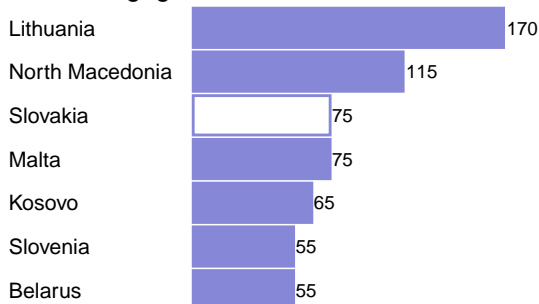

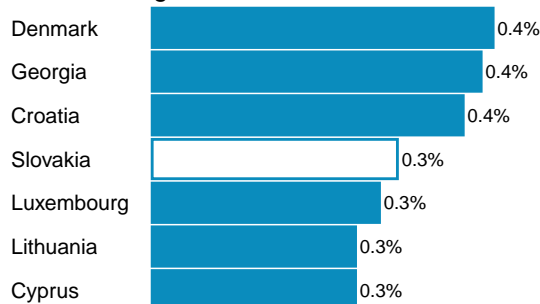
GME Degrees By Females

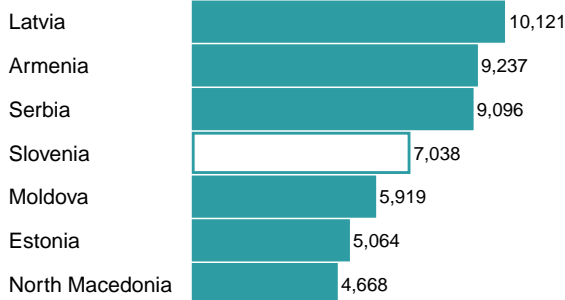

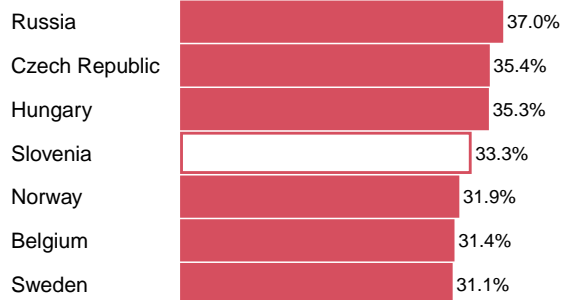

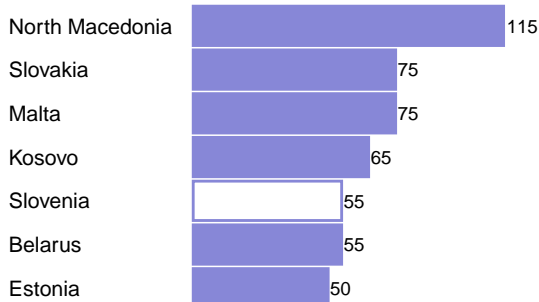

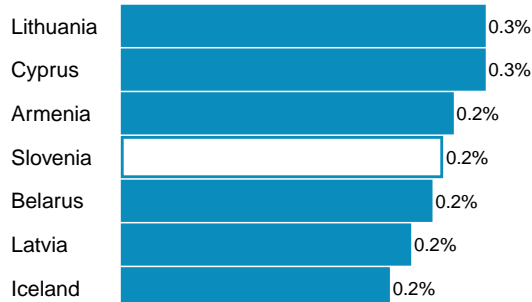
GME Degrees By Females

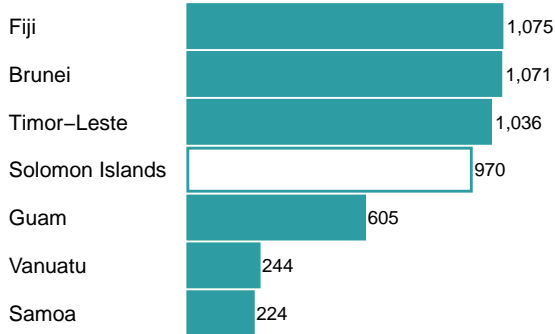

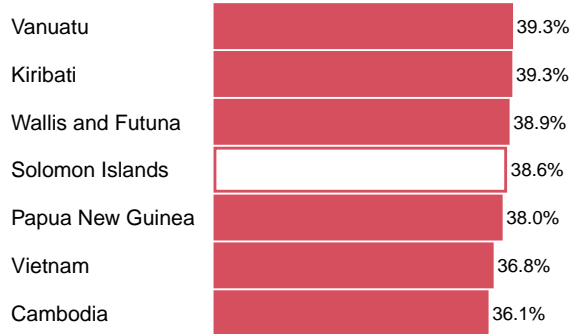

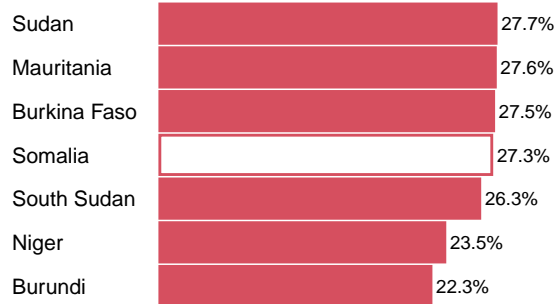

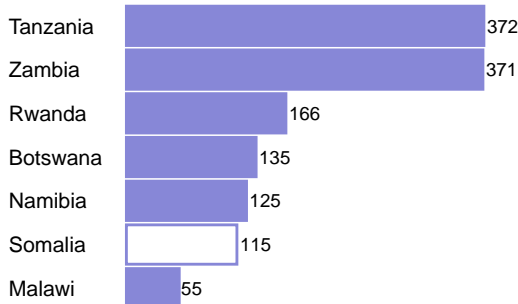

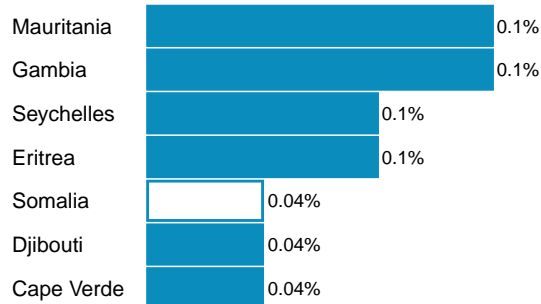

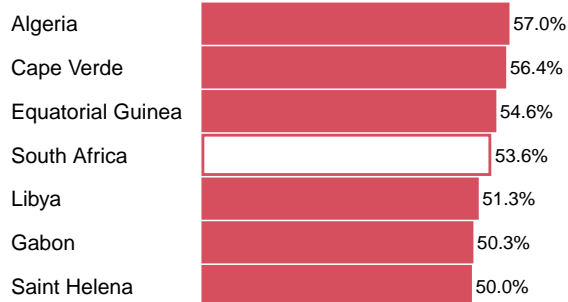

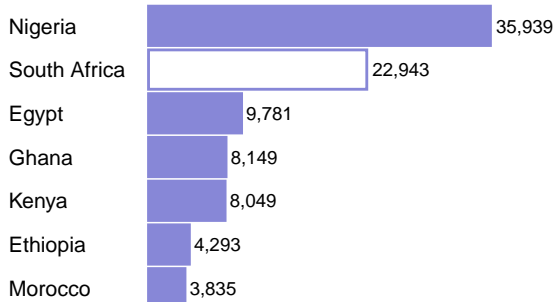

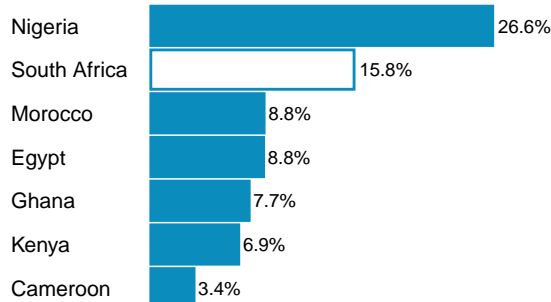

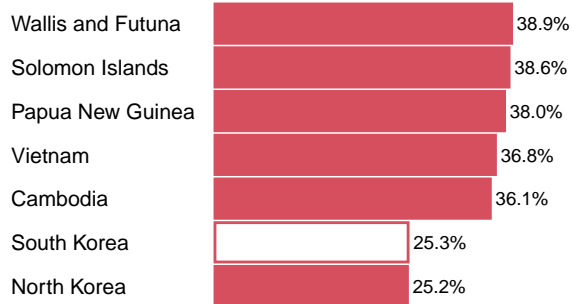

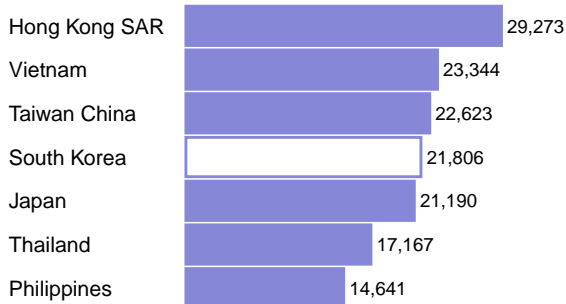

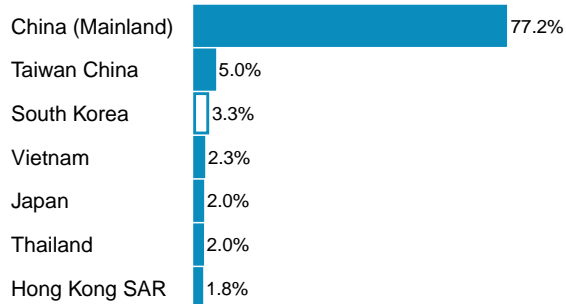

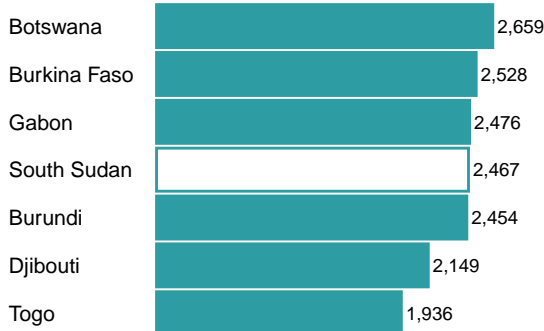

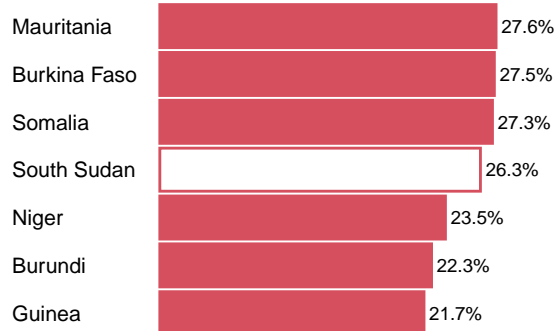

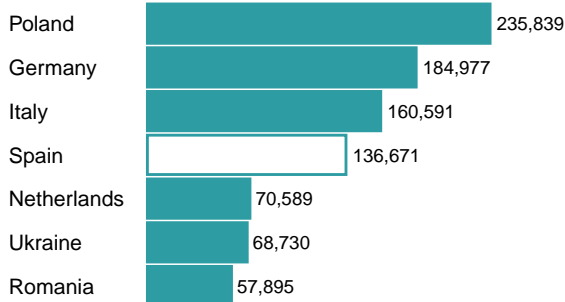

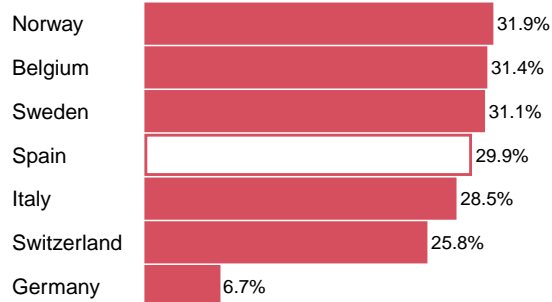

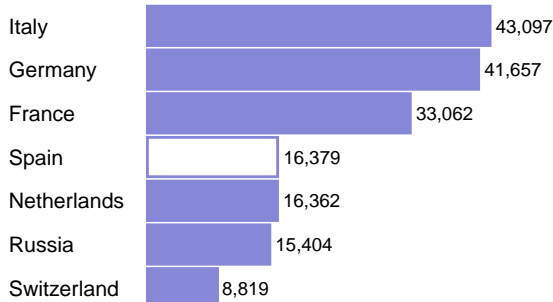

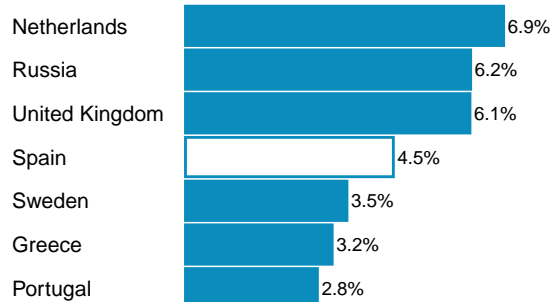
GME Degrees By Females

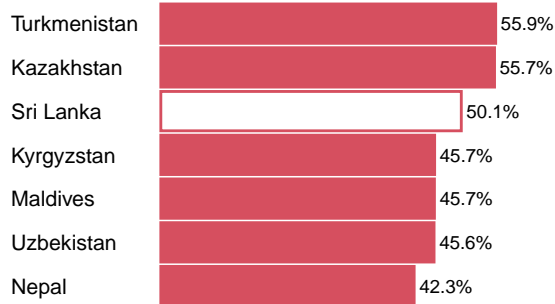

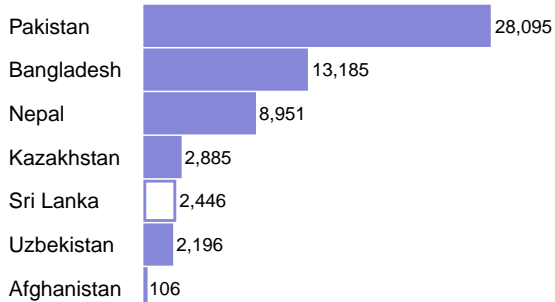

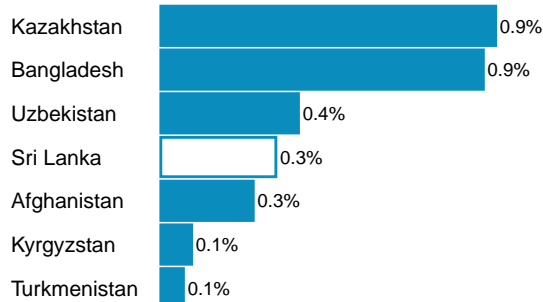
GME Degrees By Females

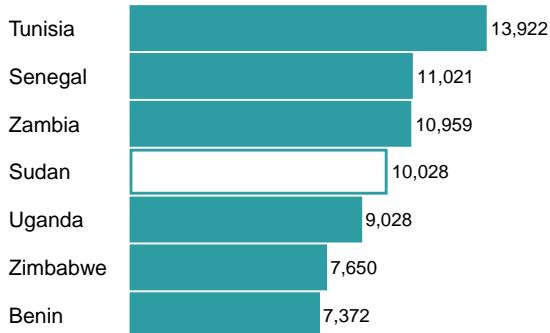

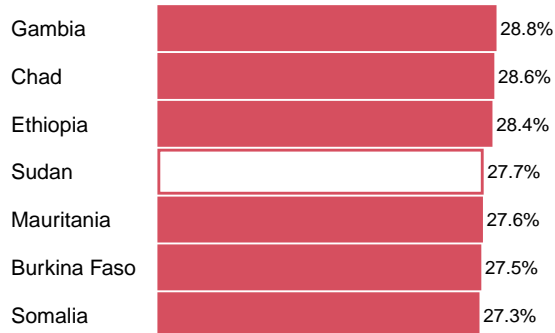

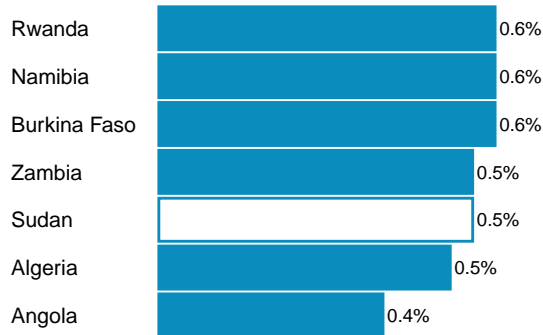

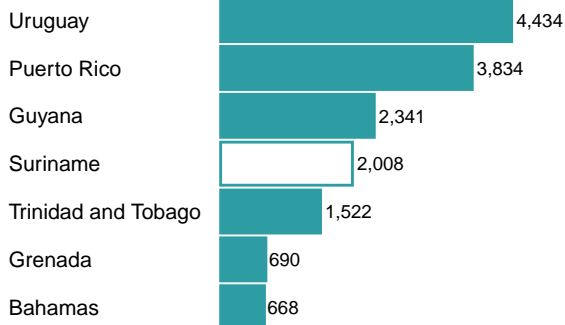

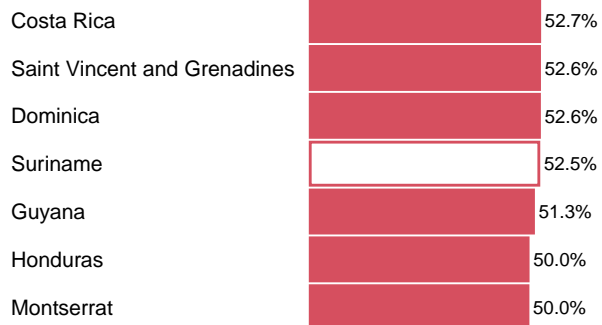

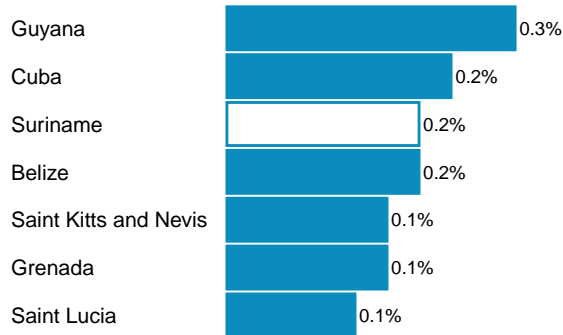
Total GME Degrees

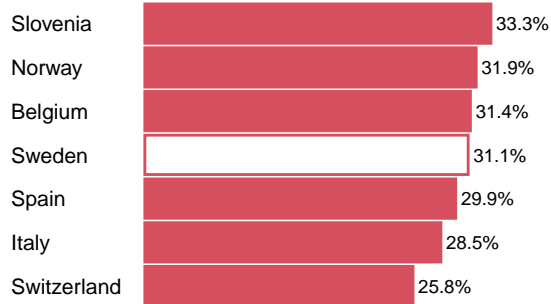

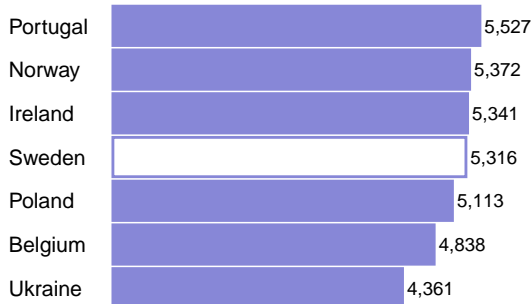

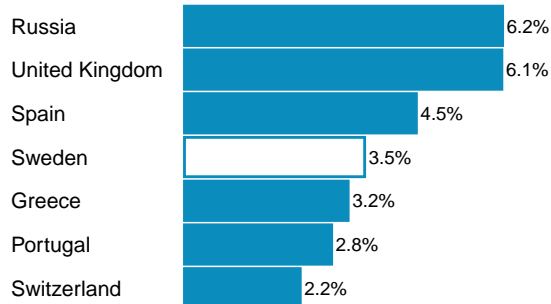

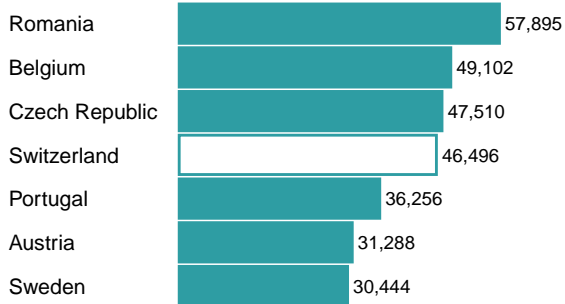

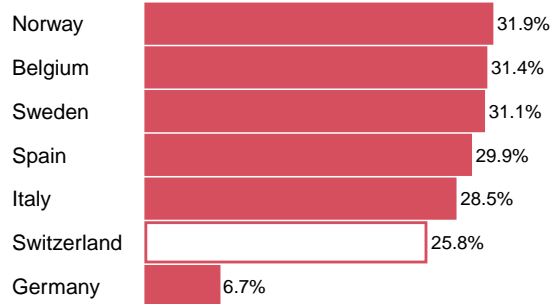

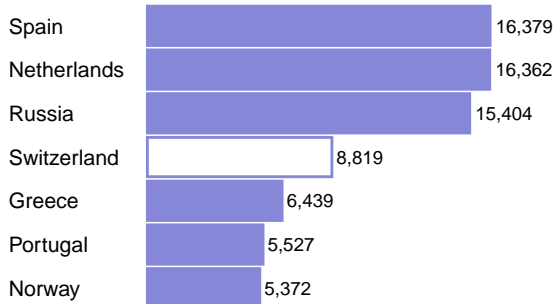

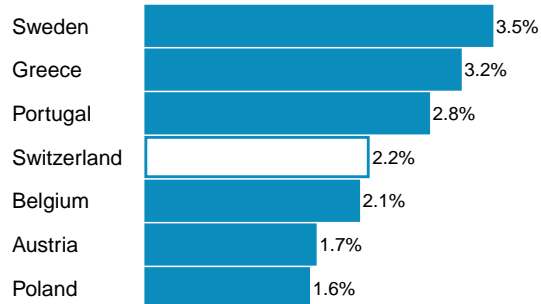
GME Degrees By Females

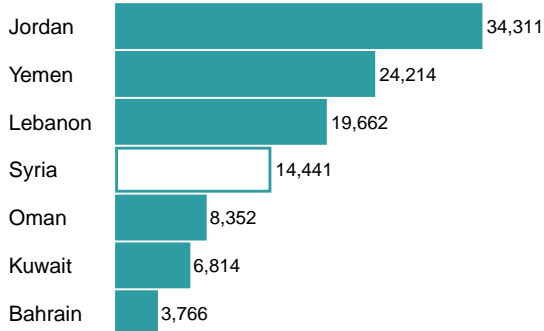

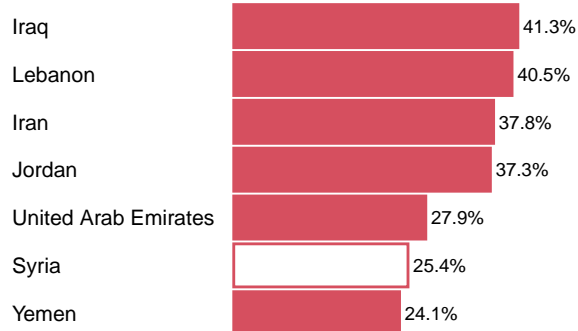

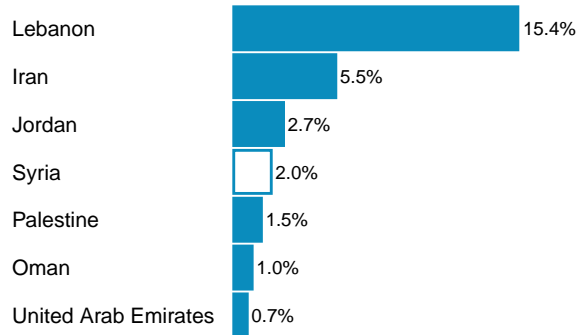

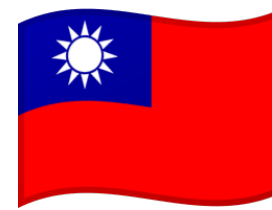

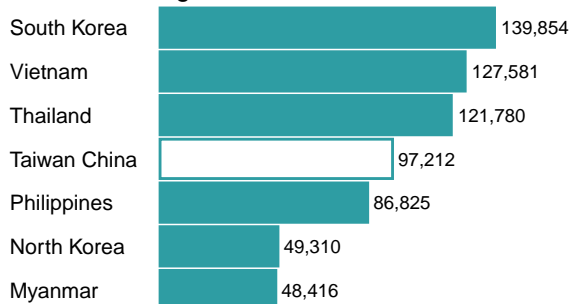

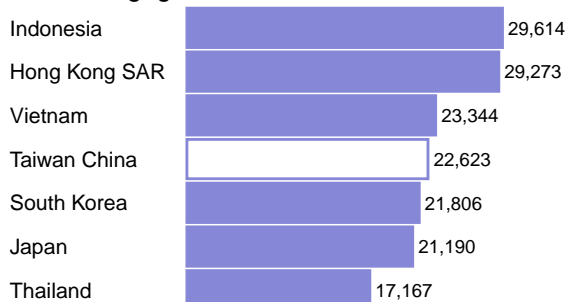

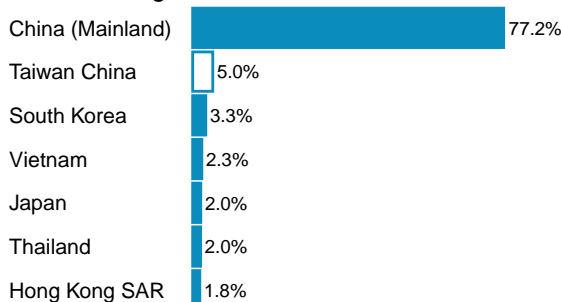

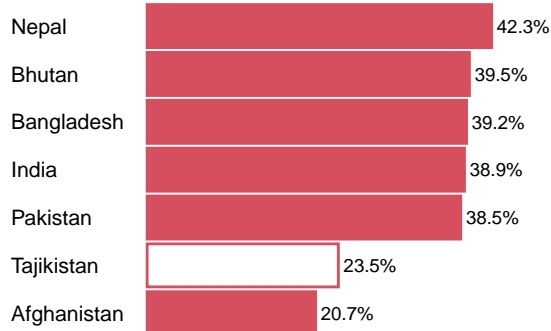

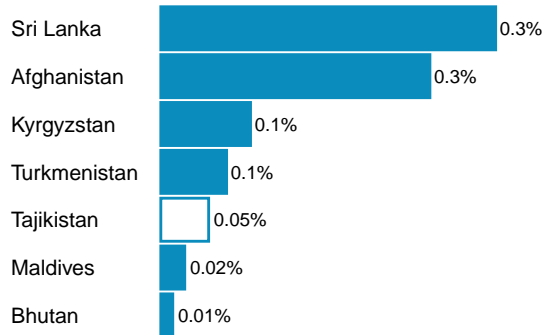

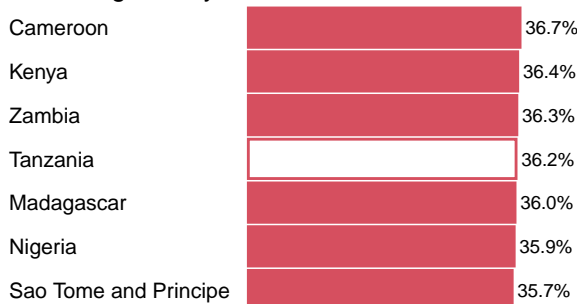

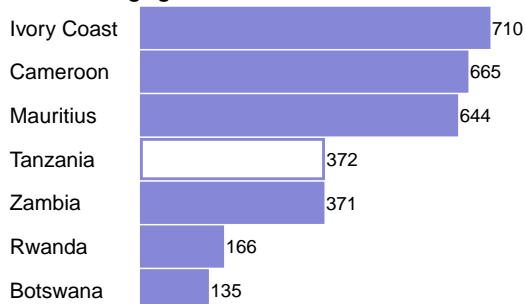

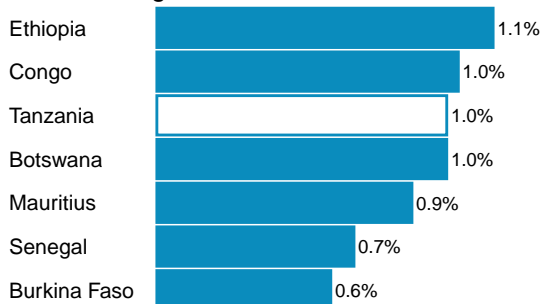

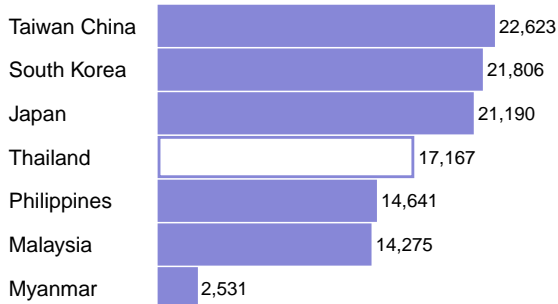

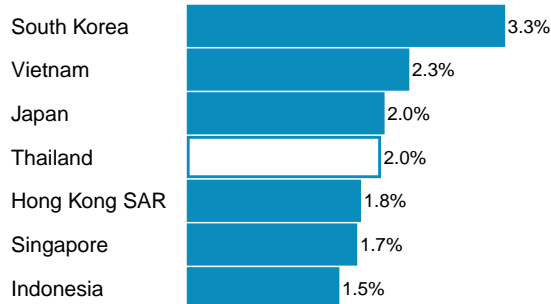

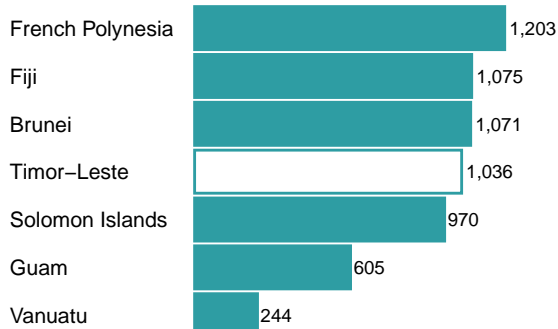

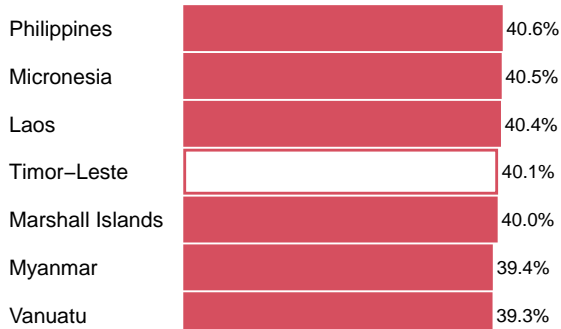

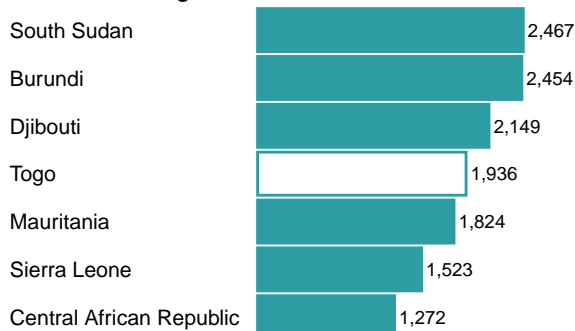

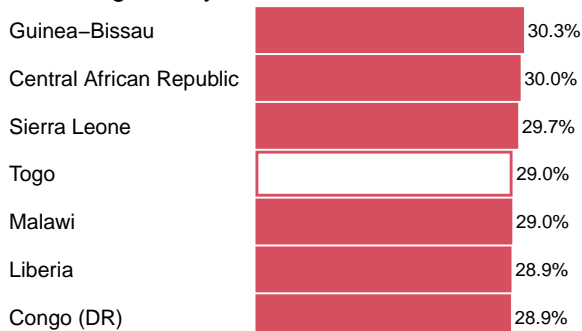

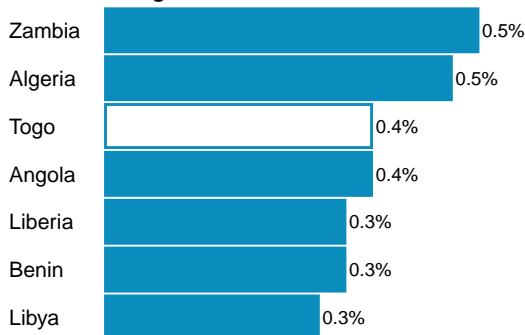

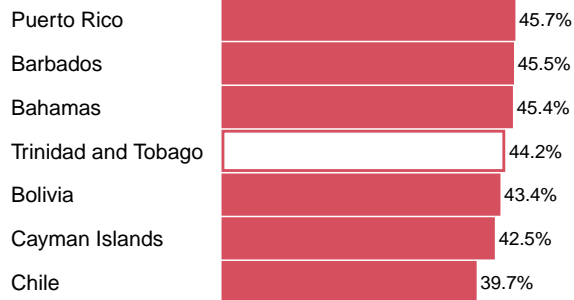

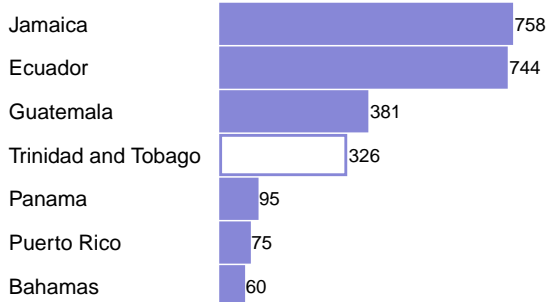

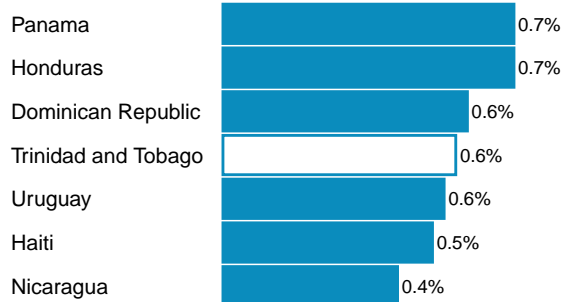
GME Degrees By Females

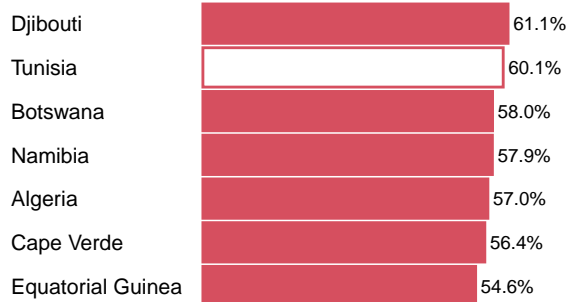

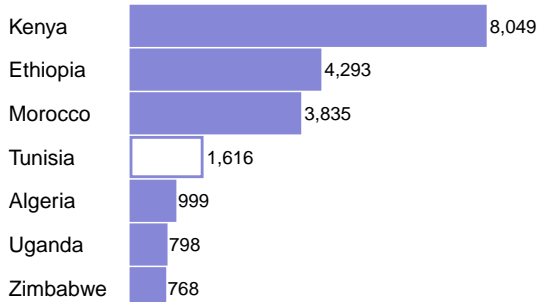

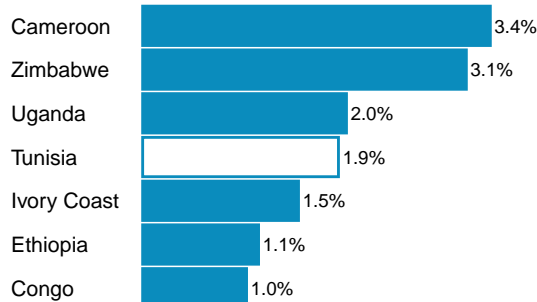

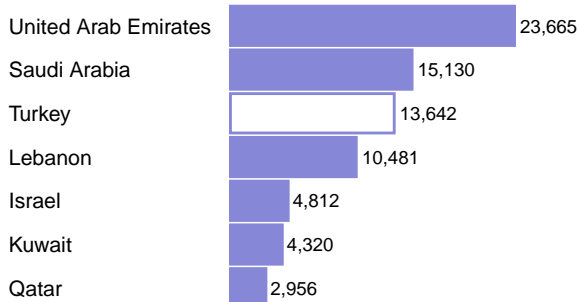

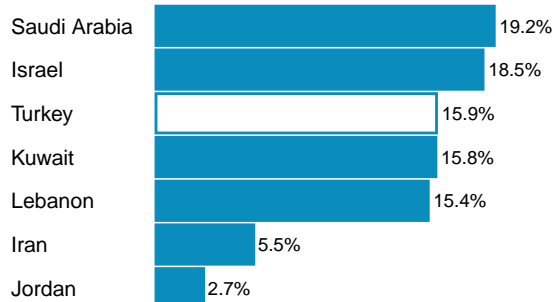

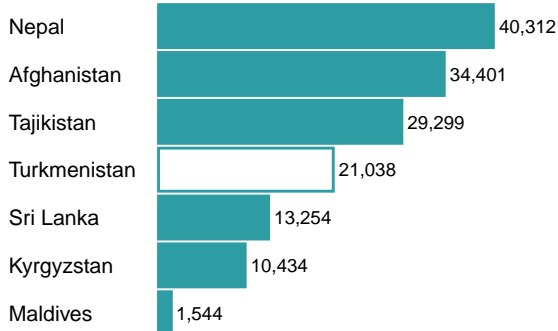

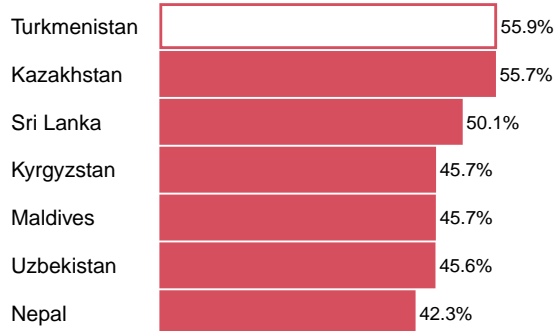

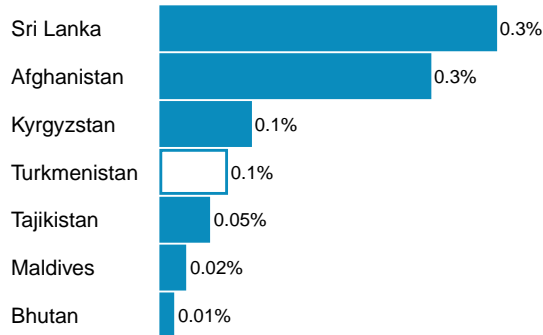

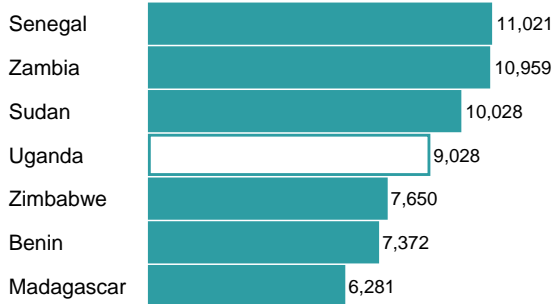

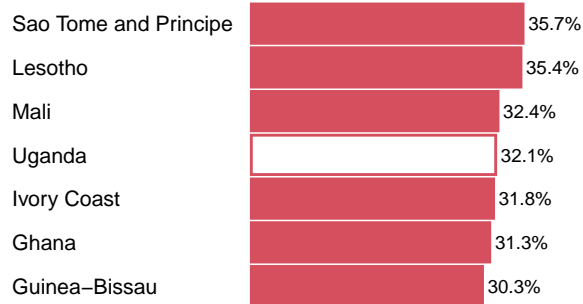

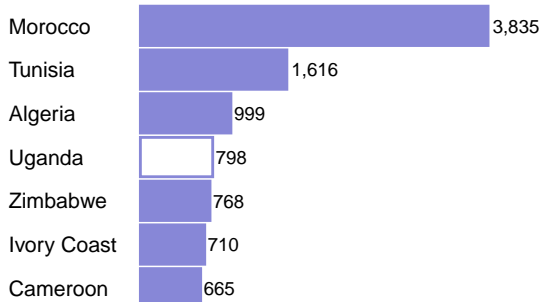

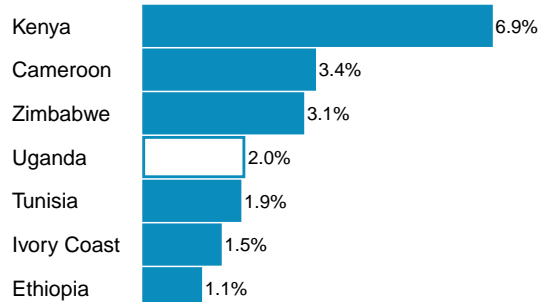
GME Degrees By Females

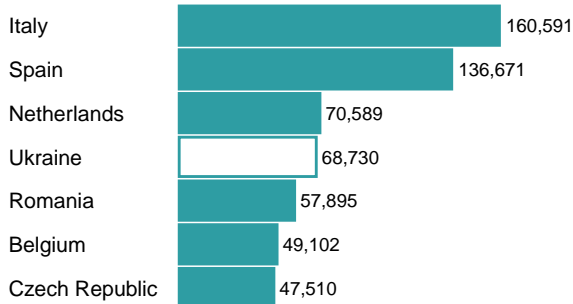

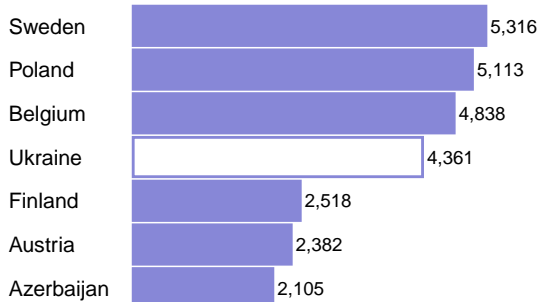

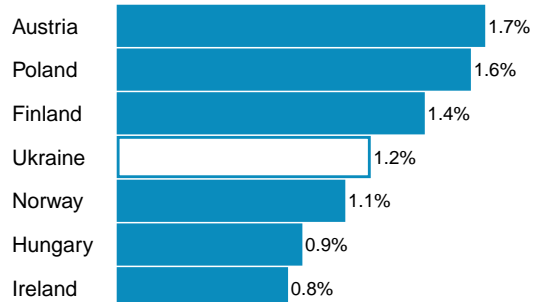

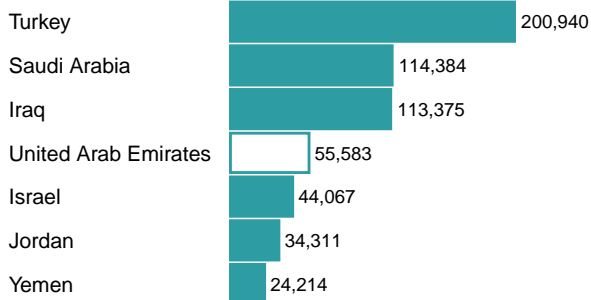

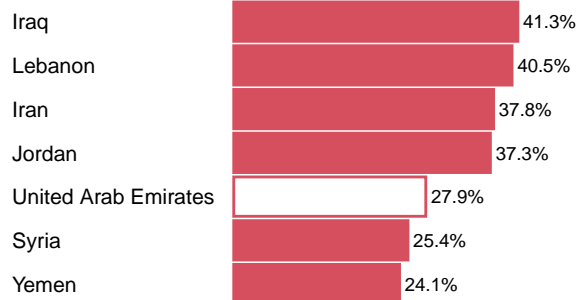

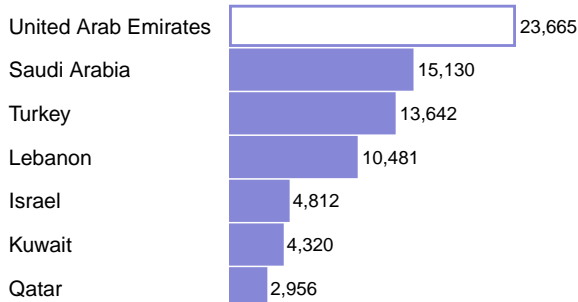

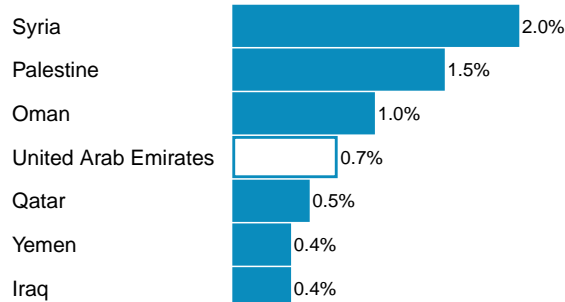

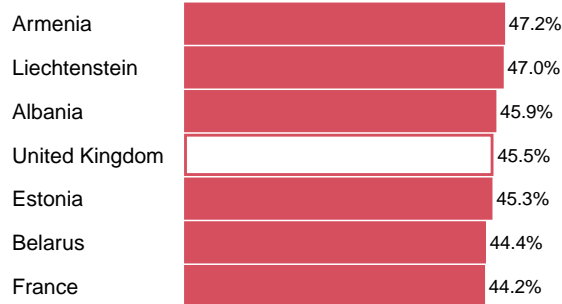

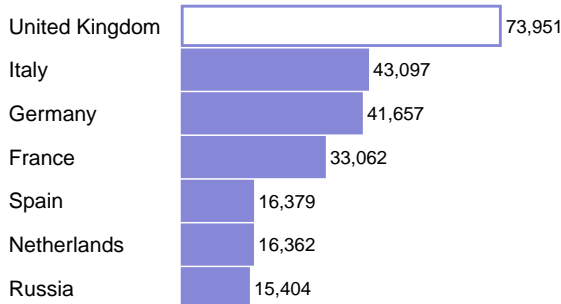

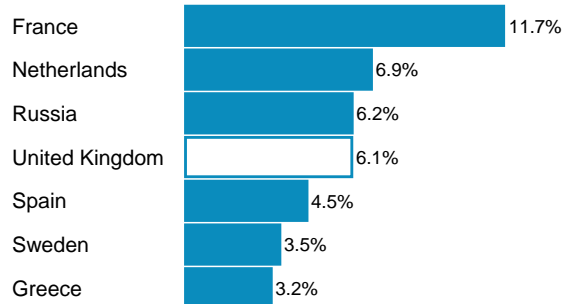

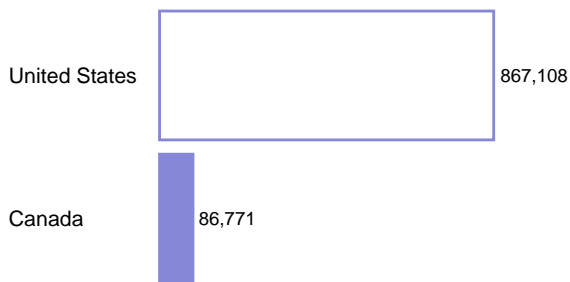

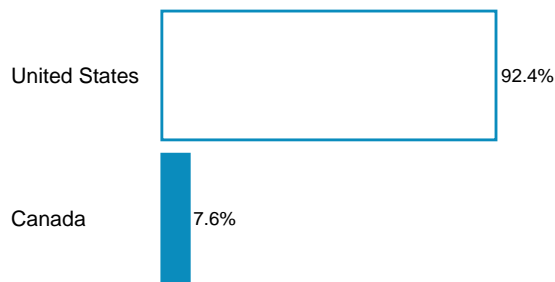

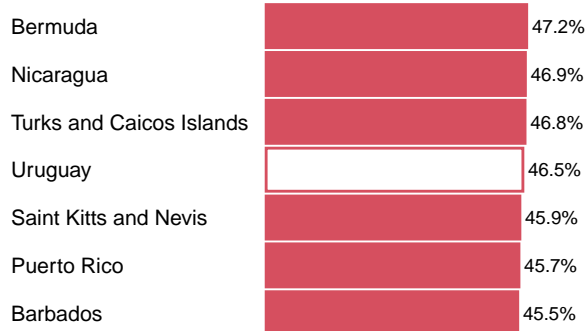

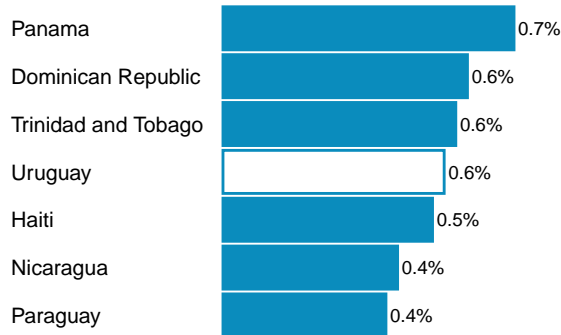

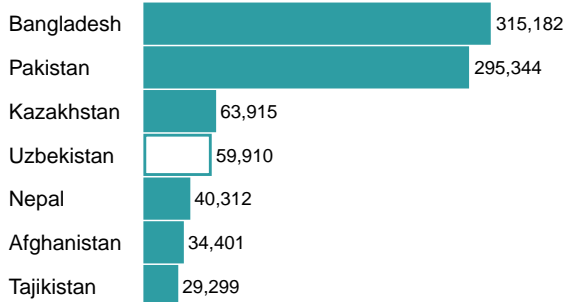

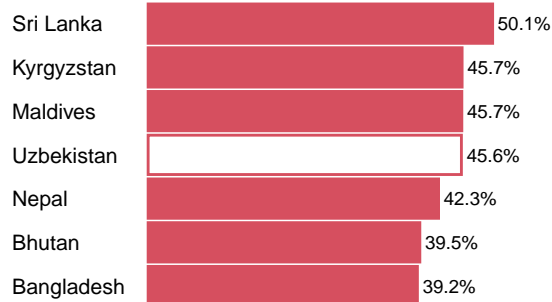

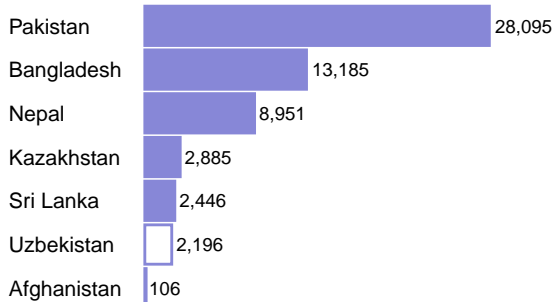

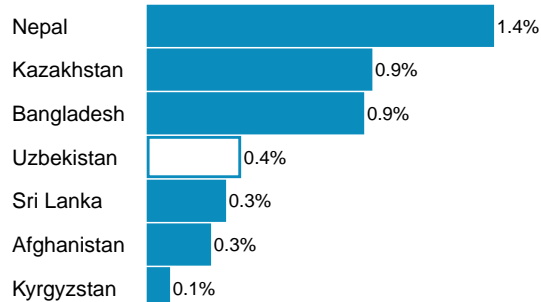
GME Degrees By Females

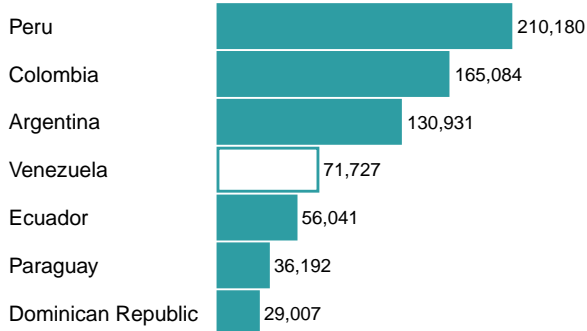

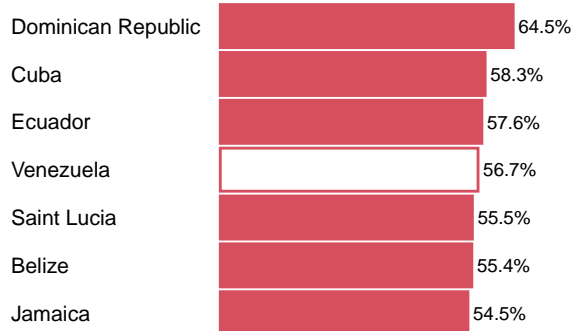

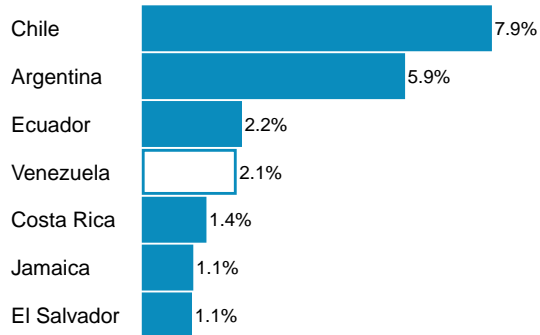

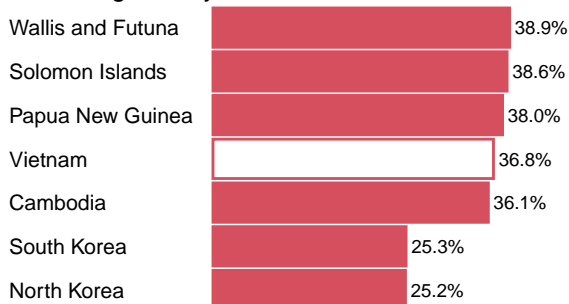

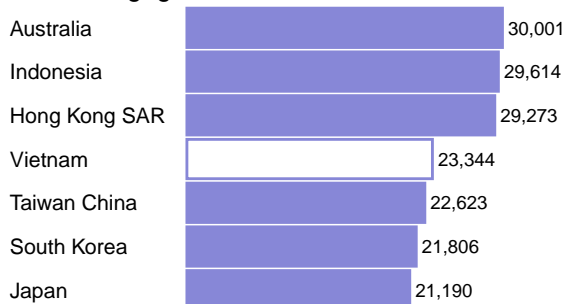

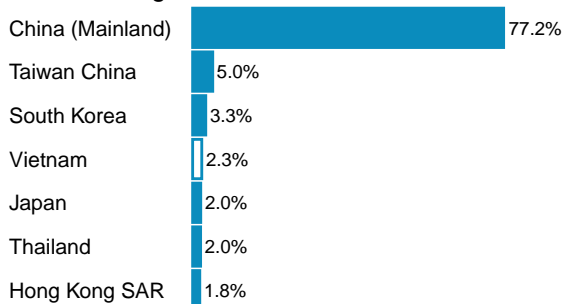
GME Degrees By Females

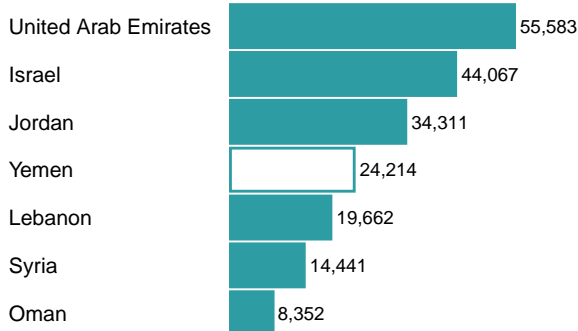

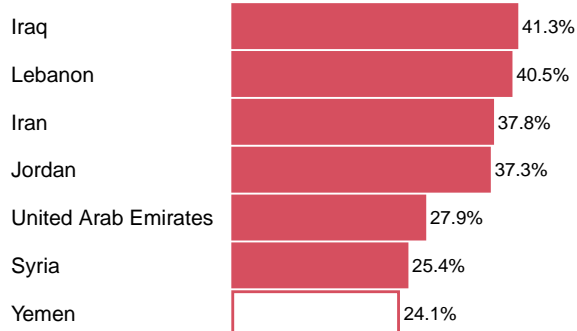

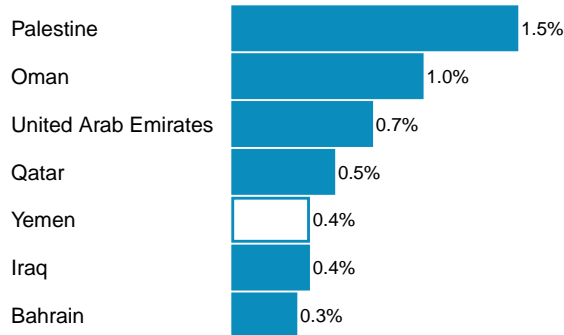

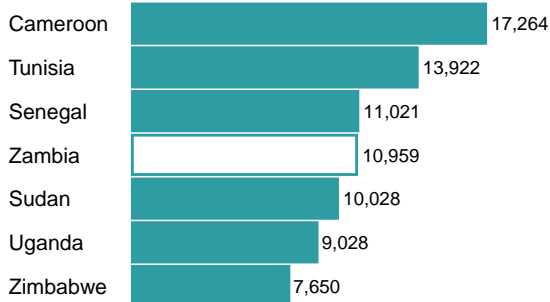

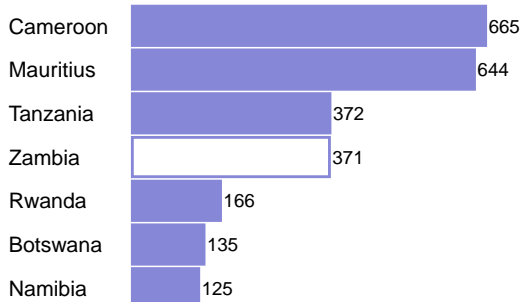

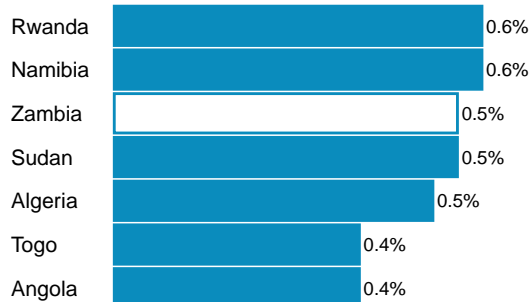

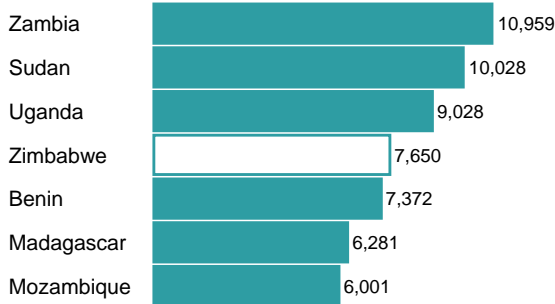

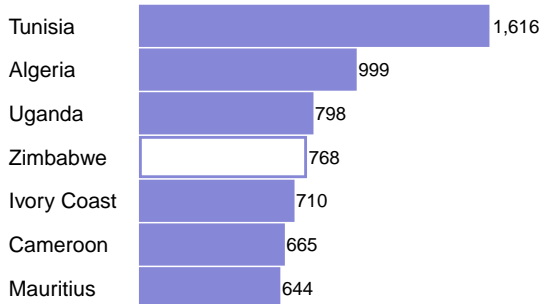

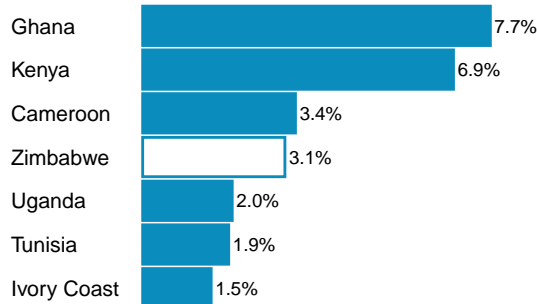
