Business master's degrees are a growing fixture of graduate management education (GME), catering to diverse learners in different places. This infographic shares the latest in candidate consideration of and applications to some of the most popular business master's programs.



## \overline Candidate Interest

According to the 2024 GMAC Prospective Students Survey, nearly two-thirds of global GME candidates consider applying to pursue a business master's degree, with popularity of specific degrees varying by region.

# Application Trends

According to the 2024 Application Trends Survey, programs with longer legacies at business schools—like the Master of Accounting—experienced a resurgence in popularity. Meanwhile, falling international applications revealed the reliance of some programs—such as the Master of Business Analytics—on talent from abroad.

Including 18% international growth and 21% domestic growth




#### Growth in total applications to finance programs


